JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound. (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram. (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed with an iron gate the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa leading to the city of Jerusalem and reported to civilians that they should cross Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp. (iii) At 23:10, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions and impeded civilian access at Jaba' checkpoint set up on the road connecting the districts of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr 'Aqab. (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bir Nabala. (iii) At 22:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis and patrolled the area until 23:20. (iv) 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Biddu. (v) At 03:00, the Israeli army raided Qalandiya refugee camp and arrested a civilian.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Arrest:</u> The Israeli army arrested Abdullah Shihadeh in Qalandiya refugee camp. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. • <u>Raids/Detentions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:30, and again at 16:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Bireh. (ii) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beituniya, searched an internet cafe, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. (iii) At 03:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Ramallah and detained a number of civilians, after they had performed dawn prayers at the At Tira neighbourhood's mosque. Having examined their IDs and recorded their telephone numbers, the Israeli army released worshippers at a later time and withdrew at 05:00. • <u>Arrest:</u> The Israeli army arrested Omar Abdul Jawwad Saleh in the village of An Nabi Salih. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Road:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Sir and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of At Tayba and Rummana and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles in the area between the villages of Al ‘Araqa and Nazlat ash Sheikh Zeid. • <u>Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Jalqamus. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. (ii) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Az Zababida and raided a number of commercial premises. (iii) At 16:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Rummana. (iv) At 17:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Al ‘Araqa and served summonses on a number of to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. (v) At 02:20, the Israeli army raided the town of ‘Arraba, took position in front of a Palestinian National Security post, searched a house, and withdrew at 03:00. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Checkpoint:</u> Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Tayasir and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of ‘Aqqaba and the village of Al Kufeir and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of ‘Aqqaba. (ii) At 11:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Tammun and patrolled the area until 12:50. (iii) At 12:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tubas.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and ‘Izbat Shufa. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • <u>Raids/Detention:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 04:00 on 16 June 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of Seida, detained Hani Ahmed Saleem, and released him at a later time.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Zeita. At 01:15, the Israeli army raided the town again, searched and took photographs of a house, and withdrew at 03:30. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of ‘Izbat at Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 09:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the settlement of Karnei Shomron on the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 15:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 17:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Al Funduq and searched civilians and vehicles. (v) At 18:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Hajja and searched civilians and vehicles. (vi) At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of ‘Azzun, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested a civilian. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:00, the Israeli army raided the town ‘Azzun. At 18:50, the Israeli army raided the town again. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 00:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town for the third time. (ii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya and arrested 2 civilians. • Arrests: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up at the entrance to the town of ‘Azzun arrested Abdul Karim Fares Shubeitah. <p>The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the city of Qalqiliya:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) Omar Mohammed Nimer al Hindi; and (iii) ‘Ammar Mohammed Amin Abdul Rahim Dawoud. • Attack on Property: At 18:30, the Israeli army prevented residents of the village of Kafr Qaddum from constructing a road to connect the village to the settler bypass road in the vicinity of the village of Qusin. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. (ii) Beginning on 12 May 2010, the Israeli army has continued to install an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village

	<p>through Gate #109. The Israeli army removed the wall gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya and only allows students to cross to their school outside the village through the Habla gate.</p>
<p>NABLUS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of ‘Asira ash Shamaliya and the village of Ijnisinya and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of ‘Asira ash Shamaliya hand searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Qabalan and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 23:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Talluza. (ii) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided the town of ‘Asira ash Shamaliya and patrolled the area until 03:05. (iii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabalan and arrested a civilian. (iv) At 05:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus, searched a house, and arrested a civilian. • Arrests: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 18:00, Israeli troops positioned at ‘Awarta checkpoint arrested Naji Kayed ad Dubeik, allegedly for locating a knife in his position. (ii) The Israeli army arrested Fu’ad Zuheir Faraj Az’ar in the town of Qabalan.

	<p>(iii) At the Israeli army arrested Mazen Husni Hilmi ad Danbak in the city of Nablus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Detention: At 19:10, Israeli troops positioned at Huwwara checkpoint detained Taha Ziyad Dababseh, ostensibly because a knife had been located in his position, and released him at a later time.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. • Raids/Detentions: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Iskaka and served summonses on a number of civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. (ii) At 18:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Haris, detained and interrogated a number of civilians, and released them at a later time. At 19:50, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. • Flying Checkpoints: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Road #90 near the village of Al 'Auja and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the dead sea, detained 'Adnan 'Aydiyyeh, a Palestinian Preventive Security officer, and released him at a later time. (iii) At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Fasayil and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah and searched civilians and vehicles.

<p style="text-align: center;">BETHLEHEM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. • Flying Checkpoint: At 18:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint underneath the overpass to the area of Qabr Hilwa (the eastern entrance to the city of Beit Sahur) and searched civilians and vehicles. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.
<p style="text-align: center;">HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

GAZA STRIP

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. • <u>Violation of the Ceasefire:</u> The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire in the district of Rafah. The Israeli army opened fire and fired 3 artillery shells from its location on the Green Line towards civilian houses and property in the districts of Northern Gaza and Khan Yunis. Israeli attacks resulted in the injury of a child and armed Palestinian individual. • <u>Air Patrol:</u> In the evening of 16 June 2010, Israeli F16 combat aircraft patrolled the skies and carried diversionary air raids over several areas in the Gaza Strip.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. • <u>Attack/Injury:</u> In the morning of 16 June 2010, Israeli troops positioned on the Green Line opened fire towards a number of civilians east of the town of Beit Hanun, injuring 16-year-old Ibrahim al Kafarneh.
