| <b>JERUSALEM</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound.</li> <li>(i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.</li> <li>(iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed with an iron gate the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa leading to the city of Jerusalem and reported to civilians that they should cross Qalandiya checkpoint to access the city.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.</li> <li>(ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrest:</u></b> At 01:30, the Israeli army arrested Hamzeh Ibrahim Mousa Zahran during its raid into the town of Biddu, as was reported yesterday.</li> <li>• <b><u>House Demolitions:</u></b> The Israeli army distributed notices for the demolition of 4 houses in the village of Beit Safafa, claiming that they had been build without the required construction licences. |   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.</li> </ul>  |

The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. The Israeli army removed the wall gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya and only allows students to cross to their school outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> |

- of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.
- **Closure of Main Roads:**

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.

(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades an entrance to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery.

(v) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the city of Hebron to the town of Adh Dhahiriya; the road to the town of As Samoa'; the entrance to the village of 'Abda; and the road between the town of Dura and the village of Wadi ash Shajina.
  - **Flying Checkpoints:**

(i) At 07:25 on 17 June 2010, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.

(ii) At 12:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.

(iii) At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles.

(iv) At 13:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the Al 'Arrub Agriculture College and examined students' ID cards.
  - **Raids/School Disruption/Provocation of Palestinian Forces:**

(i) At dawn on 17 June 2010, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ummar and arrested a child.

(ii) At 04:00 on 17 June 2010, the Israeli army raided the town of Idhna and arrested 3 civilians.

(iii) At 09:10, the Israeli army raided the village of Kharsa and took position near the village's school, while students were sitting for high school ('Tawjihi') examinations. At 19:30, the Israeli army raided the village again and patrolled the area until 19:50.

(iv) At 10:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. At 15:30, the Israeli army raided the city again, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
