<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the city of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque.</li> <li>(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram.</li> <li>(iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to Jerusalem city.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem.</li> <li>(ii) As of 11 April 2010, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and prevent daily civilian traffic access from 23:00 until 05:00. The closure of the checkpoint will continue for a week and half under the pretext of maintenance and setting up an infrastructure between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Qalandiya village and arrested a civilian after severely beating him.</li> <li>• <b><u>Arrests:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) On 21 June 2010, the Israeli army arrested in the area of Ras Al Amud in occupied East Jerusalem the civilian Waleed Eyhab Muhammad As-Salaymeh under the pretext of throwing stones.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army arrested near Qalandiya village the civilian Ra'uf Muhammad Said Hoshiyeh.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Expulsion:</u></b> On 20 June 2010, the Israeli High Court approved the expulsion of PLC member Sheikh Muhammad Abu Tair from occupied East Jerusalem until the time of reviewing the appeal lodged with the court in September 2010.</li> <li>• <b><u>House Demolition:</u></b> On 21 June 2010, the district committee of the Israeli occupation municipality decided to demolish 22 houses of 88 houses</li> </ul>

	<p>previously served with demolition notices in the neighborhood of Silwan in occupied East Jerusalem to establish a settlement project (public parks) on the debris of civilian houses.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Settlement Activity:</u></b> On 21 June 2010, the Israeli authorities started leveling work in the area located between the settlements of Neve Ya'koub and Pesgat Ze'ev, east of occupied East Jerusalem, in preparation for the construction of 600 new housing units.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.</li> </ul>

Again at 23:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and prevented civilian access in both directions until 00:25.</li> <li>(ii) At 15:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the area of Oyoun Al Haramiyeh (on Ramallah – Nablus main road) and searched civilians and vehicles until 17:00.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> At 04:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Ebwin.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues west of the towns and villages of 'Abud and Bil'in, and in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.</li> </ul>

TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbat Shofeh.</li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road.</li> <li>• <b><u>Arrest:</u></b> At 12:00, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilian brothers at the Wall gate near the village of Jubara. They are Iyhab Azmi Dmairi and his brother Iyad.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>

Again at 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> At 15:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Jinsafut</li> <li>• <b><u>Settlement Activities:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:40, the Israeli army erected barbed wire fence in the western side of Qadumim settlement.</li> <li>(ii) At 11:30, the Israeli army carried out excavations near the village of Jit to erect bases for electricity pylons.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 22:00, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Qadumim hurled stones towards civilian vehicles traveling on</li> </ul>

As a result, the windshield of a taxi vehicle driven by the civilian Ayyub Nazih Jabir was destroyed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) On 12 May 2010, the Israeli army erected an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha (after removing the iron gate erected at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya), and prevented civilians from the village from passing through it. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through the iron gate # 109.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

<b>SALFIT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrances of 2 side roads between the village of Marda and its agricultural land.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impede civilian access.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> At 00:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Iskaka and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>HEBRON</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada’ Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the area located near the Green Line, south of Yatta town, evacuating the area of those inside it and denying them access to it.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa’; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab’a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-‘Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.</li> <li>(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades one of the entrances to the town of Beit Ummar near the town’s cemetery.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

- (v) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the city of Hebron to the town of Adh Dhahiriya, the road leading to the town of As-Samoa', the entrance to the village of Abda and the road between the town of Dura and the village of Wadi Ash Shajina.
- **Flying Checkpoints:**
    - (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Road # 60 between the city of Hebron and the town of Bani Na'im and arrested a civilian under the pretext of finding a knife in his possession.
    - (ii) At 09:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.
    - (iii) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrances to Kureisa and Tawousah.
    - (iv) At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to Zif village and arrested a child.
  - **Raids:**
    - (i) At 10:35, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron and served summons to a number of civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. Again at 14:10, the Israeli army raided the city, took position near a Civil Police station and patrolled the area.
    - (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura where confrontations took place with civilians while patrolling the area. The Israeli army also took position near the headquarters of the Palestinian National Security and Custom Police. The Israeli army patrolled the area and withdrew at 13:00.
    - (iii) At 03:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Samit, closed all its entrances by checkpoints, opened fire and fired stun grenades while searching a number of houses after detaining their residents. The Israeli army arrested 20 civilians (including a civilian and 3 of his sons, in addition to other brothers)
  - **Arrests:**
    - (i) At 17:40, the Israeli army arrested the civilian Muhammad Al Bis from Al Arrub refugee camp upon reporting to Israel police on the basis of a prior summon.
    - (ii) The Israeli army arrested on Road # 60 between the city of Hebron and the town of Bani Na'im the civilian Nidal Mkhaimer Muhammad Yaghi.
    - (iii) The Israeli army arrested on the junction leading to Zif village Islam Muhammad Ibrahim Irzaiqat, 17-year-old.
    - (iv) The Israeli army arrested in the village of Deir Samit the civilians: Isma'il Hussein Muhammad Al Hroub and his sons Mahmoud, Muhammad and Abdallah; Iyad Mahmoud Muhammad Al Hroub and his brother Ali; Khalil Muhammad Abduljawad Al Hroub; Raed Issa Muhammad Al Hroub and his brothers Jihad, Bilal and Hani; Amjad Jabir Odeh Al Hroub and his brother Muhammad; Tawfiq Abdulfattah Mahmoud Al Hroub; Ahmad Muhammad

In the meantime, armed Palestinian groups declared a one-week-long ceasefire. Meanwhile, the ceasefire was extended until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire is holding despite the end of the specified period.</li> <li>• The Israeli army violated the ceasefire by raiding Palestinian territory and opening fire intensively in Khan Yunis district.</li> </ul>

<p><b>NORTHERN GAZA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Point:</b> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.</li> </ul>
