JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, only allowing access to civilians holding special permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city and restrict access to the area to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

Raids/Physical Assault:
(i) At 09:25, the Israeli army raided Hebron city, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. The Israeli army also severely beat and arrested a civilian. At 01:20, the Israeli army raided the city again and searched a commercial premise of vehicle spare parts.
 (ii) At 01:15, the Israeli army raided Dura town and searched a house. (iii) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Bani Na'im town. <u>Arrests</u>: At 01:30 on 28 June 2011, the Israeli army arrested three civilians during its raid into Hebron city, in addition to those reported yesterday: (i) Qasem Farid Abdul 'Aziz Abu 'Odeh; (ii) Khaled Mohammed Hussein Shawar at Tamimi; and (iii) Ilyas Mohammed Salem ash Shuweiki. (iv) The Israeli army arrested Qasem Farid Jaber in Hebron city. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area surrounding Eshkolot settlement west of Adh Dhahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011. <u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army opened fire from its location on the Green Line on Northern Gaza district.

NORTHERN GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially open to previously-coordinated critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through <i>Al Karama</i> (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank. <u>Attack</u>: On 28 June 2011, the Israeli army opened indiscriminate fire from its location on the Green Line north of Beit Hanun town on 60 children who were taking part in a demonstration in protest against the Seam Zone. While flying kites, children demanded that the blockade on the Gaza Strip be lifted.
GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.

	 (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	Activities not reported.
RAFAH	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing was open to civilians departing the Gaza Strip and others arriving from Egypt. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open for the transportation of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid, cooking gas, and construction cargo designated to internationally-funded projects.
