ALL DISTRICTS	 The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank. Since the morning of April 30, the Israeli army has been imposing a closure on West Bank territories on the occasion of the Holocaust commemoration, and denying Palestinian civilians and laborers access to the city of Jerusalem and the Green Line except for previously coordinated humanitarian cases. Only Christians from the city of Bethlehem were allowed entry into the city of Jerusalem to celebrate Easter. The closure was lifted in the morning of May 2.
JERUSALEM	Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

- <u>Air Attacks</u>: At 09:00, an Israeli drone fired 1 missile targeting a vehicle carrying 1 armed individual (assassination attempt) in the area of al-Shaboura in the city of Rafah and killed him and seriously injured a little girl called Khuloud al-Ingili.
- <u>Assassination</u>: The armed individual assassinated in the city of Rafah is called Nafez Kamel Mansour.

PRISONERS CONDITIONS

• The Israeli military court at Salem detention camp sentenced prisoner Mohammad Rasem Tawfiq Khatimiyyeh, from the town of Qabatia in Jenin district, to 24 months imprisonment and a fine of 2000 shekels equivalent to 560 US dollars. In addition, the courts extended the administrative detention of prisoner Majd Samir Hourani from the city of Qalqilya until May 6; prisoner Nabil Khader Mohammad Rabi' 'Atili from the town of 'Atil in Tulkarem district until May 20; prisoner Samir Jamil Hussein 'Ammour from the village of Rumanna in Jenin district until July 15.
