ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Flying Checkpoints <ol style="list-style-type: none"> At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the town of al-Izariyyeh, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 02:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the junction of the village of Beit Iksa, and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> At 13:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Shu'fat neighborhood in the city of Jerusalem. At 14:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of al-Sawahreh al-Sharqiyyeh. The raid recurred at 00:20. At 19:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Abu Dis, and set up a checkpoint. At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Izariyyeh. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the villages of Qatannah and Beit Ijza, and arrested 2 civilians. At 03:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Jaba'. The other civilians has not been identified.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (b) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to ‘Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba’ road, the area of al-‘Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Safa. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Ras Karkar. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting the villages of Ras Karkar and Kharbatha Bani Hareth, the western entrance to the village of Ain Yabroud, and the junction of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiah with dirt barricades and cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of ‘Atara and impede civilian access. • <u>Raids:</u> At 23:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Deir Dibwan and opened fire intensively during patrol. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 15:30, a bunch of settlers physically attacked a number of civilians near the village of al-Tireh and injured a female civilian called I’tidal al-Khalidi, and stole from her a purse containing her ID and 800 shekels, equivalent to 240 US dollars. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 14:00, a public march set out, with the participation of international peace activists and supporters, in the village of Bil’in in protest of the apartheid wall construction. The Israeli army clashed with civilian protestors and injured a number of civilians. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the area west of the town of ‘Abud as well as in the areas of al-Midya to Ni’lin and Ni’lin to Deir Qaddis.

(ii) At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the villages of Beit Qad and Jalaboun, and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Misliyyeh, clashed with civilians, arrested 1 child, detained 2 civilians but released them later, and withdrew at 18:00. (ii) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Zeboubah and arrested 2 children. (iii) At 18:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Rumanna. (iv) At 00:45, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and its refugee camp, opened fired intensively and fired sound bombs in the camp, and then withdrew at 04:00. • <u>Arrests:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The civilian arrested in the village of Misliyyeh is called Sadeq Qasrawi, 16. (ii) The 2 civilians arrested in the village of Zebouba are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Ali Abdel Karim Jaradat, 17; and (b) Ibrahim Jamal Amarneh, 16. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. • <u>Raids:</u> At 22:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Tayaser.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil's plain; the road to the town of Deir al-Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamis. (b) At 20:00, the Israeli army closed the road connecting the villages of Ramin and Bazaria with dirt barricades. (c) At 17:00, the Israeli army closed the northern entrance to the town of 'Azzun with barbed wires. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarem-Nablus road and at Jubaa checkpoint. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the

(ii) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem. • <u>Detention:</u> At 17:30, the Israseli army detained 4 civilians, including 3 military officers, ate Jbara checkpoint and released them at 19:30 after the intervention of the military liaison. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Asla. (iii) At 11:30, the Israeli army closed with dirt barriers the road connecting Azzun town to Izbat Tabib village. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint that is set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqilya and impede civilian access. At 14:10, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint because 2 veiled female civilians refused to take of the veil. The checkpoint was reopened at a later time. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> At 24:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the villages of Ras Atiyeh, and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Arrests:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqilya. The raid recurred at 00:10 during which the Israeli troops patrolled the city until 00:45. (ii) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun and imposed curfew. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Land leveling for Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
NABLUS	<p><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler

	<p>bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.</p> <p>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of al Lubban al-Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only. (ii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan. (iii) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira al-Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Beit 'Imrin and arrested 1 civilian. (ii) At 00:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and patrolled it until 05:00. • Arrests: The civilian arrested in the village of Beit 'Imrin is called Hakam Mohammad Faqih.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising). (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and Hares. In addition, the Israeli army continues to close the eastern entrance to the village of Yassouf and the southern entrance to the village of Deir Istiyya with dirt barricades, as well as the southern entrance to the town of Kafl hares and the 2 northern entrances to the town of Bruqin and the village of Qarawa Bani Hassan. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut and Za'tara checkpoints and prevent civilian vehicles from traveling towards the town of Kafr al-Dik. At 17:00, the Israeli army closed Za'tara checkpoint and impeded traffic upon the arrest of a civilian under the pretext of finding a suspicious object with him. The checkpoint was reopened at 17:40. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Deir Istiyya. (ii) At 00:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Brouqin. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.

The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-‘Auja along al-Mu’arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah.

(ii) Since September 15, 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to the 22-dunum land that has been confiscated in accordance with confiscation order number 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) at 11:00, the Israeli army set up 2 checkpoints on the entrances to the town of al-Khader and the village of Housan. (ii) At 11:25, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on al-Nashash junction (southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem), and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army raided and the town of Teqoa and patrolled it until 09:00. (ii) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Beit Jala. (iii) At 12:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of al-Shawawreh. (iv) At 20:20, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Salah and set up a checkpoint. (v) At 20:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Fajjar and clashed with civilians during patrol. (vi) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the refugee camp of Aida in the city of Bethlehem. (vii) At 24:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem. • Demonstrations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, a public march set out in the village of al-Ma’sara, with the participation of international peace activists and

The Israeli army attacked civilian protestors with clubs and gun butts and injured 2 civilians.</p> <p>(ii) At 13:00, a public march set up in the town of al-Khader and held Friday noon prayer on land that is threatened with confiscation for the purpose of the apartheid wall construction.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja.
<p style="text-align: center;">HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arroub refugee camp. (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the town of Dura, and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the

	<p>junction of al-Fawwar, and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iii) At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the town of Halhoul overpass, and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iv) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the village of al-Tabaqa, and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron and set up 2 checkpoints in the areas of Qizon and Nimra. The raid recurred at 16:30. (ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the town of al-Sammou' and searched 1 civilian house. (iii) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit 'Ummar. (iv) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Thahiriyyeh. (v) At 02:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Yatta. (vi) The Israeli army raided the refugee camp of al-'Aroub, arrested 2 children, and handed a child called Salah Ahmad al-Titi, 16, a notification to report to the Israeli military intelligence. (vii) The Israeli army raided the town of Sa'ir and clashed with civilians, resulting in the injury of 1 civilian. • <u>Attacks:</u> At 24:00, the Israeli army stationed near the settlement of Shim'a south of the town of al-Thahiriyyeh opened fire towards 1 civilian called Khalil Ahmad al-Za'arir under the pretext of attempting to stab an Israeli soldier. He was seriously injured and taken to an Israeli hospital for treatment. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 09:00, a bunch of settlers from Hafat Ma'on outpost attacked civilian houses in the village of Khirbet al-Tawani southeast of the town of Yatta, resulting in a fist fight between civilians and settlers, and the injury of 2 civilians. At once the Israeli army interfered and arrested 4 civilians. • <u>Arrests:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The 2 civilians arrested in the refugee camp of al-'Aroub are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Ziyad Zuhdi Mahfouz, 17; and (b) Hassan Kkhaled Janazreh, 16. (ii) The 4 civilians arrested in the village of al-Tawani are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Mohammad Mousa Jibril al-Rabi'; (b) Jamal Mousa Jibril al-Rabi'; (c) Jumaah Jibril al-Rabi'; and (d) Qusay Jibril al-Rabi'. • <u>Palestinian Security Measures:</u> At 09:00, the Palestinian security forces handed over to the Israeli side through the D.C.O. a settler called Hermann
