ALL DISTRICTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.</li> </ul>

JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Closure:</b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to the Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.</li> <li><b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.</li> </ul> </li> <li><b>Checkpoint:</b> The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.</li> <li><b>Wall Gates:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li><b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continues in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.</li> <li><b>Raid:</b> At 02:50, the Israeli army, including 4 jeeps, raided Qalandiya refugee camp and arrested 1 Palestinian National Security officer.</li> <li><b>Arrest:</b> The Israeli army arrested Tamir Mansour Breiqe', a Palestinian National Security officer, in Qalandiya refugee camp.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>RAMALLAH &amp; EL BIREH</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil as well as the road to the village of Ras Karkar.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Deir Ibzi', searched civilians and vehicles, and impeded civilian access.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance o the village of Beitillu and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids/Palestinian Attack:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 10:10, and again at 03:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Bireh. At 04:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>(ii) At 12:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beituniya and the villages of 'Ein 'Arik and 'Ein Qiniya.</li> <li>(iii) At 22:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Sinjil, after armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards an Israeli settler vehicle near the village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Palestinian Attack/Raids/Attack/Curfew:</u></b> At 12:40, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards and injured an Israeli guard of a gas station near the village of Ni'lin. Consequently, the Israeli army raided the villages of Deir Qaddis and Ras Karkar. While patrolling the village of Ras Karkar, the Israeli army opened indiscriminate fire. The Israeli army also imposed curfew over the village of Deir Qaddis.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>JENIN</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour roads leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan.</li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>(ii) Beginning on 29 March 2007, the Israeli army has continued to regulate times to open Al Jalama and Salim Wall gates between 06:30 until 10:00 and 17:00 until 21:00 respectively.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints/Detentions:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints, one on the junction to the town of ‘Arraba and the other in the area between the town of Qabatiya and the village of Misliya, and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Al Kufeir, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested 1 civilian.</li> <li>(iii) At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Al Far’a and searched civilians and vehicles. Until 21:25, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint detained a number of buses, transporting students who were on a school trip.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrest:</u></b> Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al Kufeir arrested Samer Nader Abu ar Rub.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids/House Occupation/Attack/Injuries/Medical Obstruction:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Beginning at 00:45 on 06 May 2007, the Israeli army remained positioned in Jenin refugee camp, occupied 1 house, and converted it into a military post. At 12:50, Israeli troops were supported by 10 jeeps and 1 bulldozer. Confrontations also took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured 6 civilians, including 3 children. The Israeli army also prevented ambulances from accessing the refugee camp to evacuate the injured civilians. At 14:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>(ii) At 22:00, Israeli Special Forces, supported by 8 Israeli army jeeps, raided the town of Qabatiya, searched a number of houses, and confiscated 1 rifle from a house. At 05:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>(iii) At 02:00, the Israeli army, including 7 jeeps, raided the town of Al Yamun, raided a bakery, and examined workers’ IDs. At 04:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>House Demolitions:</u></b> The Israeli army distributed notices for the demolition of 3 houses in the village of Khirbet ‘Atuf east of the town of Tammun. The houses belong to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Abdullah Yaseen Bani ‘Odeh;</li> <li>(ii) Khaled Abdullah Bani ‘Odeh; and</li> <li>(iii) Hassan Abdullah Bani ‘Odeh.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>TULKAREM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district.</li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal’a road, the entrance to the village of Saffarin, the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to ‘Attil plain, the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa, and the road to the town of Deir al Ghusun’s plain.</li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at ‘Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city).</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> At 22:35, the Israeli army, including 9 jeeps, raided the city of Tulkarem and Tulkarem refugee camp and patrolled the area until 03:40.</li> <li>• <b>Arrests:</b> At 10:00, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians, while they were reporting to the Israeli Intelligence agency at the DCO offices west of the city of Tulkarem: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Ahmed Abdul Ra'ouf Nassayrah; and</li> <li>(ii) Ala' Subhi 'Ubeid.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Settler Violence:</b> A group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of 'Einav set fire to civilian agricultural land in the village of Ramin, burning dozens of olive and almond trees.</li> </ul>
QALQILIYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Land levelling for Wall construction continues in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints/Detention:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint also detained a civilian vehicle and forced civilian passengers to step down, allegedly because they suspected the vehicle.</li> <li>(ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Palestinian Security Measure:</b> At 12:30, Palestinian security forces handed over an old mortar, seized in the city of Qalqiliya, to the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).</li> </ul>
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. The Israeli army only allows civilian vehicles possessing access permits to</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<p>cross these checkpoints. The Israeli army also searches civilians using metal detectors at Beit Iba checkpoint, impeding their access.</p> <p>(ii) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only.</p> <p>(iii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30.</p> <p>(iv) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases.</p>
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <p>(i) The Israeli army has continued to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising).</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik.</p> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr ad Dik.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and to impede civilian access.</p> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ari'el.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids/Curfews/School Disruption/Attack:</u></b> <p>(i) At 12:45, the Israeli army, including 1 armoured vehicle, 10 jeeps, and 1 bulldozer, raided the villages of Iskaka and Yasuf, imposed curfew, and searched a number of houses. Confrontations also took place between the Israeli army and civilians. In the village of Iskaka, the Israeli army surrounded the secondary school, fired tear gas grenades inside it, and prevented the evacuation of students and teachers. In addition, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Iskaka, searched civilians and vehicles, and denied civilian access in both directions. At 14:35, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</p> <p>(ii) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Haris, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army also patrolled the area and withdrew at 04:30.</p> </li> </ul>
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah.</li> <li>• <b><u>Palestinian Security Measure:</u></b> At 11:00, Palestinian security forces handed over Shlomo David Mizrahi, an Israeli citizen located in the city of Jericho, to the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).</li> </ul>
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the detour roads leading to the town of Tuqu'.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr, northwest of the city of Beit Jala, and in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Efrat.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint/Physical Assault:</u></b> At 16:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area of An Nashash, searched civilians and vehicles, and beat Iyad Omar al 'Anani, leaving him with contusions. Al 'Anani was admitted to hospital for medical treatment.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At dawn on 06 May 2007, the Israeli army raided the village of 'Arab ar Rashayida and arrested 1 civilian.</li> <li>(ii) At 16:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Tuqu'.</li> <li>(iii) At 19:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Fajjar and arrested 1 civilian.</li> <li>(iv) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Khadr, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrests:</u></b> At 03:30 on 06 May 2007, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians during its raid into Ad Duheisha refugee camp in the city of Bethlehem: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Na'im Ahmed al Warasneh; and</li> <li>(ii) Rashad Abdul Ghaffar al Khmour.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army arrested Mousa Mohammed Rashaydeh in the village of 'Arab ar Rashayida.</li> <li>(iv) The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Abdul Rahman Taqatqah in the town of Beit Fajjar.</li> <li>(v) The Israeli army arrested Ali As'ad Salah in the town of Al Khadr.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
HEBRON	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access to and from the area.

- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

- **Closure of Main Roads:**

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp.

- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

- **Wall Construction:** Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of Ar Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.

- **Injury:** At 22:00, the Israeli army opened fire in the Johar Mount neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron, injuring Wuroud al 'Ajlouni, a 16-year-old female child.

- **Raids/Attack/Detentions:**

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. At 23:50, the Israeli army raided the city again, searched 1 house, and patrolled the area.

- (ii) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura and opened fire, while searching a house.

- (iii) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Adh Dhahiriya.

- (iv) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ula and searched a number of houses, after detaining residents. The Israeli army also served summons to a number of civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.

At 06:00, the Israeli army evacuated the settlers from the area.</li> <li>(ii) A group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Beit Ya'ir beat 17-year-old Ibrahim 'Ayed Salman from the village of Janba, leaving him with contusions.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Palestinian Security Measure:</u></b> At 19:30, Palestinian security forces handed over 1 illegal bus, seized in the city of Hebron, to the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).</li> <li>• <b><u>Demonstration:</u></b> At 10:00, a mass demonstration took place in front of the offices of Adh Dhahiriya Municipality in protest against the Israeli army's continued closure of the road connecting the town of Adh Dhahiriya to the city of Hebron.</li> </ul>
