(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikxa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikxa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city and impeded the free flow of traffic. (ii) On September 19th 2012, Israeli forces closed Ras Khamis checkpoint near Shu’fat camp and impeded the free flow of traffic in order to construct the wall. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:30, Israeli forces raided Abu Dis, clashed with several residents then withdrew at 11:00. (ii) At 01:55, Israeli forces raided Al-Eizariya and detained a National Security Force officer. • <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained Yacoub Al-Roujub in Al-Eizariya. • <u>Temporary Detention:</u> On May 7th 2014, Israeli forces positioned in Silwan neighbourhood temporarily detained Mohammad Al-Zir (13 years old) {A special |

| | <p>Needs patient } then released him at a later time.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Assault on Places of Worship:</u> On the morning of May 7th 2014, Israeli settlers under the protection of Israeli forces stormed Al-Aqsa mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and provoked worshipers during which an Israeli settler attempted to enter the mosque but was prevented by a mosque guard who handed him over to Israeli Police. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Slewahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma 'ale Adumim. |
| RAMALLAH & AL BIREH | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. (ii) Since September 3rd 2013, Israeli forces closed the north east entrance of Al-Mughier village with dirt mounds. (iii) Since 00:20 on March 4th 2014, Israeli forces closed the main road connecting Al-Jalazun camp and Bet El settlement with cement blocks. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 18:25, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Nabi Saleh village, impeded the free flow of traffic after closing the main entrance gate then reopened it at 20:00. • <u>Raid:</u> On the evening of May 7th 2014, Israeli forces raided Al-Bireh city (after alleged shooting incident towards a settlement) during which they searched the "Sateh Marhaba" area and declared it as a closed military zone. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages. |

(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second Intifada, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 21:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Azzun until 21:30. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and impeded the free flow of traffic. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al- Rasha and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> At 20:50, Israeli forces intensified their restrictions at Huwara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic until 21:00. • <u>Raid:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:00, Israeli forces raided Osirin village until 08:55. (iii) Since 11:00 on July 30th 2012, Israeli forces have closed two roads leading to Abu Nasar and Qatan Al-Jama' located in western area of Deir Istiya with cement blocks. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> Israeli forces continue to intensify their restrictions at Za'tara Al-checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:00, Israeli forces raided Al-Zawiya until 16:25. (ii) On May 1st 2103, an Israeli court ordered the halt of wall construction near Betar village. (iii) On July 21st 2013, Israeli courts ordered the halt of construction of the wall in Al-Carmisan area in the west area of Beit Jalla. |

In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an |

electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.

- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area. .

- **Closure of Main Roads:**

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Thahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to e to Al-Simiya village, the southern entrance of Al-Samou' and the entrance of Beit Annun with cement blocks.
- (v) Since July 25th 2012, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Safa and Al-Dirat and also closed the entrance of south Yatta with cement blocks.
- (vi) Since December 27th 2012, Israeli forces closed the west entrance of Swiesiya village which connects Yatta and Al-Samou' village with cement blocks.
- (vii) Since 09:45 on September 23rd 2013, Israeli forces closed the main road leading to "Haji" settlement and impeded the free flow of traffic.
- (viii) Since March 9th 2014, Israeli forces opened a steel gate in Beit Anun.
- (ix) Since March 9th 2014, Israeli forces closed a road leading to Al-Rihana area in east Yatta.

- **Flying Checkpoint:**

- (i) At 10:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Beit Einun village junction until 11:20.
- (ii) At 10:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the north entrance of Hebron (located along bypass road #35 near Halhul bridge) until 11:30.
- (iii) At 10:50, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Fuwar camp.

- **Raid:**

- (i) At 09:00, Israeli forces raided Al-Majd village and detained a resident after storming his home.
- (ii) At 14:10, Israeli forces raided Bani Na'im, detained a resident and summoned 3 residents: Foad Manasra, Mohammad Manasra and Amin Abu Jarour.
- (iii) At 05:00, Israeli forces raided Halhul, stormed several homes, and detained 3 residents including a Civil Defence officer then withdrew at 06:45.
- (iv) At dawn on May 8th 2014, Israeli forces raided Dura, detained a resident after storming his home.
- (v) At dawn on May 8th 2014, Israeli forces raided Yatta, stormed several homes and summoned 4 residents: Issa Salah, Ayman Al-Najjar, Mut'ab Al-Najjar and Al-Amour Al-Najjar to report to Israeli Intelligence for questioning.

- (i) At 04:45 on May 5th 2014, Israeli forces detained 2 residents: Khalil

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. • On November 14th 2011 Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against passing beyond the mark and on November 24th 2012, Israeli forces imposed floating marks of 6 miles and on March 21st 2013 re imposed fishing restrictions of 3 miles. • Israeli forces broke the cease fire agreement by opening fire from their positions behind the Green Line towards Central Gaza and as a result injured a resident. |

| GAZA | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. |
| CENTRAL GAZA | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attack: At 15:40, Israeli forces opened fire from their positions behind the Green Line towards several residents in east Deir Al-Balah and as a result injured an unidentified resident. |

(ii) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was closed on May 6th 2014 but allowed the entry of 86 truckloads of construction material for internationally funded projects and imported 6 busses and a Bulldozer. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed.
