DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

Closure:

- The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at (i) checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Agsa Mosque compound.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian (ii) access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

Closure of Main Roads:

- The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt (i) barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, (ii) separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.

Checkpoints:

- The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint (i) a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.

Wall Gates:

- The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu (i) Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shavyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Oatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.

		• <u>Checkpoint/Detention</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Having detained them at 16:50, an Israeli Intelligence officer interrogated a number of civilians and released them at a later time.
		 Raids: At 11:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and Tulkarem refugee camp. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarem, searched a number of houses, and arrested 1 civilian. At 04:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested 'Assem Munther Ikbariyyeh in Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarem. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILY		Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. The important army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.
		 Flying Checkpoints: At 11:00, and again at 07:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and closed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Kafr Laqif, denied civilian access, and reopened the gate at 13:30. At 13:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the city of
		Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the tunnel (the southern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya) and searched civilians and vehicles.
	QALQILYA	 (v) At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at entrance to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid: At 01:15, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun, searched a
		 number of houses, and withdrew at 04:50. <u>Arrest</u>: At 14:10, Israeli troops positioned at the Wall gate near the town of Habla arrested Mohammed Omar 'Aref 'Odeh, 17 years old, while he was attempting to gain access into the Green Line. Wall Gates:
		(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. (ii) On 12 May 2010, the Israeli army installed an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and denied civilian access. Now, the Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. On the other hand, the Israeli army removed the wall gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya. It only allows students to cross to their school outside the village through the Habla gate.

Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit (i) Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to An Nagura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern (iii) entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of 'Agraba to the village of Osarin. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed (i) on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross (ii) between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. **NABLUS** All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. Flying Checkpoint: At 15:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the villages of Odala and 'Awarta and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: (i) At 23:15, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Agraba, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian. (ii) At 02:50, the Israeli army raided the village of Talluza, searched a number of houses, and arrested 1 civilian. At dawn on 18 May 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of An (iii) Nassariya and arrested 1 civilian. Arrests: (i) The Israeli army arrested Lu'ay Suleiman Bani Fadhil in the town of 'Agraba. (ii) The Israeli army arrested Yihya Kamel 'Awayis in the village of (iii) The Israeli army arrested Ma'moun Mohammed Taye' Salahat in the village of An Nassariya. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern (i) entrance to the city of Salfit. **SALFIT** The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates (ii) the northern entrance to the town of Brugin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.

	 Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. Flving Checkpoint: At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Fasayil and searched civilians and vehicles. Detention: At 00:30, Israeli troops positioned at Al Hamra checkpoint detained Jihad Abu Ali, a Palestinian National Security officer, and released him after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. Raid: At 02:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Husan, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Adam Tareq Hilmi Hamamreh in the village of Husan. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades an entrance to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of An Nabi Yunis near the town of Halhul on the Hebron-Bethlehem main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids:

- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhul.
- (ii) At 12:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
- (iii) At 00:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Idhna.
- (iv) At 01:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura, searched a house, and dag the ground inside.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

HEBRON

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 ALL February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the **DISTRICTS** ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. Violation of the Ceasefire: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilians and property in the districts of Northern Gaza and Khan Yunis. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. Raid/Air Patrol: At 00:30, the Israeli army, including several armoured **NORTHERN** vehicles covered by combat helicopters and reconnaissance aircraft, raided **GAZA** Palestinian territory northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya. An armed confrontation took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is partially open for transportation of (i) **GAZA** wheat and animal feed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January (ii) 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. **CENTRAL** Activities not reported. **GAZA** Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling: In the morning of 17 May 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by **KHAN YUNIS** reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory east of the town of Al Qarara. The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property and levelled land. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (i) (ii) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow 848 patients, humanitarian cases, students, and civilians holding visas and residence cards abroad to leave the Gaza Strip. Also, 184 civilians **RAFAH** and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals, were allowed access into the Gaza Strip through the Crossing. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for (iv) transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for

the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.
