JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound. (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bared from the town of Ar Ram. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp. • <u>Flying Checkpoint/Destruction of Property:</u> At 09:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Al 'Eizariya, denied civilian access in both directions, and used explosives to destroy a civilian vehicle parked along the main road, allegedly because of suspicion. The Israeli army withdrew from the area at a later time. • <u>Attack/Injury:</u> At 14:10, Israeli troops positioned in the area surrounding Qalandiya checkpoint fired rubber-coated steel bullets towards a number of civilians, claiming that they had thrown stones. As a result, Saleh Nasser Burqan sustained injuries. • <u>Raids:</u> At 12:00, the Israeli army raided village of Kafr 'Aqab and the area of Samir Amis north of the city of Jerusalem and searched a number of houses.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrests: At dawn on 20 May 2010, the Israeli army arrested 4 children, after searching their houses in As Suwwana neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Iyad Omar ash Shalabi; (ii) Majdi Mahmoud Abu Ghazaleh; (iii) Tamer Nasser Abu Gharbiyyeh; and (iv) Ali Abu Gharbiyyeh. (v) On 20 May 2010, the Israeli army arrested Karim Is'haq Abu Tayeh, after searching his house in the area of Bir Ayyub in Silwan neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem. • Expulsion: On 20 May 2010, the Israeli authorities issued a military order extending for the second time the expulsion of Mustafa Abu Zahrah, member on the Chamber of Commerce in the city of Jerusalem, from Al Aqsa Mosque compound for a period of 6 months. • Wall Gates: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Beit Qad. (ii) At 02:20, the Israeli army raided the town of ‘Arraba and patrolled the area until 05:15. (iii) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr Ra’i, searched 6 houses, and arrested 5 civilians, including a civilian and his 4 sons. The Israeli army also served summonses to the civilian’s 3 others sons and withdrew at 05:00. • Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 5 civilians in the town of ‘Arraba: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Majed Khalil Dalleh Milhem; (ii) Isma’il Majed Khalil Milhem, 17 years old; (iii) Saleh Majed Khalil Milhem; (iv) Mohammed Majed Khalil Milhem; and (v) Nael Majed Khalil Milhem. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. • Raids: At 16:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Farisiya and searched a number of houses.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and ‘Izbat Shufa. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Raid: At 23:55, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and Tulkarem refugee camp and patrolled these areas until 04:00. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the village of ‘Izbat at Tabib on the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road. At 17:15, the Israeli army set up another flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 17:40. (iii) At 13:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Immatin and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 14:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Al Funduq and searched civilians and vehicles.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raid: At 23:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of An Nabi Elyas. • Wall Gates: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. (ii) Beginning on 12 May 2010, the Israeli army has continued to install an iron gate at the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. The Israeli army removed the wall gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya and only allows students to cross to their school outside the village through the Habla gate.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. • Flying Checkpoint: At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of Jamma’in, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested 1 civilian. • Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Sabastiya. (ii) At 00:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Beit Dajan. • Arrest: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up on the junction to the town of Jamma’in arrested Ahmed Samir Ahmed Jadallah. • Settler Violence: At 06:30, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Migdalim prevented farmers at gunpoint from accessing and tending their land near the settlement in the village of Qusra. Consequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.

<p style="text-align: center;">SALFIT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Marda and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the town of Deir Istiya and denied civilian access, allegedly for investigating a suspicious object. The Israeli army removed the checkpoint at a later time. • <u>Raid:</u> At 23:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Bruqin, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. • <u>Arrests:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:30, Israeli troops positioned at the Za'tara junction checkpoint arrested Mohammed 'Ata Farid Sultan. (ii) At 21:15, Israeli troops positioned at the Za'tara junction checkpoint arrested Ahmed Suleiman Ka'abneh, a Palestinian National Security officer. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
<p style="text-align: center;">JERICHO</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 13:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho and searched civilians and vehicles.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrest: At 13:40, Israeli troops positioned at Al Hamra checkpoint arrested Mohammed Hashem Kamil, a university student.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. • Flying Checkpoints: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 07:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of An Nashash (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 09:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Beit Jala and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Fajjar and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Husan and searched civilians and vehicles. • Settler Violence: At 11:25, an Israeli settler vehicle ran over 7-year-old Mohammed Samer 'Amer Fafas along the main road near the village of Battir, leaving him with injuries and contusions. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.
HEBRON	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades an entrance to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of Huneina in the town of Dura and searched civilians and vehicles until 09:30. (ii) At 13:00, and again at 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura and patrolled the area until 11:00. (ii) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area until 16:30. • <u>Arrest/Physical Assault:</u> At 19:10, the Israeli army arrested Hani Mazen al Joulani, after having severely beaten him in the old city of Hebron. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Violations of the Ceasefire:</u> (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property in the district of Central Gaza. Israeli troops opened fire towards Palestinian territory in the district of Gaza. The Israeli navy opened fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the coast of the district of Northern Gaza. Israeli combat aircraft carried out 4 air attacks on the districts of Northern Gaza and Khan Yunis. (ii) Armed Palestinian territory opened fire and fired 2 mortars towards the Green Line.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Point:</u> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is closed on the occasion of Shavuot. • <u>Air Attack:</u> At dawn on 21 May 2010, Israeli F16 combat aircraft fired missiles towards a training site belonging to an armed Palestinian group in the area surrounding the town of Beit Hanun. • <u>Attack:</u> In the morning of 21 May 2010, the Israeli navy opened fire intensively towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the coast of the As Sudaniya beach west of the town of Beit Lahiya. • <u>Palestinian Attack:</u> At 22:30, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
<p style="text-align: center;">GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is partially open for transportation of wheat and animal feed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. • <u>Palestinian Attack/Israeli Attack:</u> At 19:30, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops near the Green Line east of Gaza city. Consequently, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards Palestinian territory.
<p style="text-align: center;">CENTRAL GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling:</u> In the morning of 20 May 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided 200 metres into Palestinian territory east of the city of Deir al Balah. The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property and levelled land.
<p style="text-align: center;">KHAN YUNIS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Air Attacks:</u> (i) At dawn on 21 May 2010, Israeli F16 combat aircraft fired 2 missiles during 2 air raids towards agricultural land in the area of Al Farahin east of the town of 'Abasan al Kabira.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) At dawn on 21 May 2010, an Israeli UAV fired 1 missile towards vacant land near the town of Khuza'a. • <u>Palestinian Attack:</u> In the evening of 19 May 2010, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
RAFAH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow hundreds of civilians, patients, humanitarian cases, students, and civilians holding visas and residence cards abroad to leave the Gaza Strip. In addition to 21 tonnes of medical aid offered by the Arab Medical Union, 81 tonnes of food supplies donated by World Food Organisation were allowed access into the Gaza Strip through the Crossing. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.
