DISTRICT	EVENT		
ALL DISTRICTS	 Since 22 March 2004, the Israeli army has imposed a total closure on the West Bank and Gaza Strip, prevented civilians from crossing the Green Line and entering Jerusalem, and restricted movement between cities in the West Bank. The Israeli army has renewed the closure between the districts of the West Bank and the Green Line due to the Jewish holidays. 		

WEST BANK

JERUSALEM	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues along the main road between Qalandiya checkpoint and Ar Ram, the area of Al Aqbat, north of the village of 'Anata, in the area between the villages of Jaba' and Hizma, the area of Ash Shayyah, and in the town of As Sawahira Ash Sharqiya. Wall construction in the villages of Qatanna and Biddu remains suspended following an Israeli Supreme Court order. Raid: An Israeli army patrol raided the village of Al Isawiya and arrested 2 civilians. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 unidentified civilians in the village of Al Isawiya. The Israeli army arrested 7 unidentified civilians in the neighbourhoods of Silwan, Ath Thuri, and Um Tuba.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure: The Israeli army set up dozens of flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of Al Mughayyir with dirt barricades. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Budrus, Midya, Ni'lin, Deir Qaddis, Beit Liqya, and Beituniya. Raids: At 13:00, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Ramallah and patrolled several neighbourhoods at various times. At 21:10, the Israeli army raided the village of Abu Qash and searched a number of houses.

	 (iii) At 22:15, an Israeli army patrol raided the village of Kafr 'Ein and set up a checkpoint on the road to the village of Qarawat Bani Zeid. (iv) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the city of El Bireh, raided 1 restaurant, and arrested 1 civilian. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Lu'ay Hani 'Irar in the city of El Bireh.
JENIN	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to the city with dirt barricades and declared the city of Jenin a closed military zone. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and impedes access to health facilities. The Israeli army closed Al Jalama commercial Wall crossing north of the city of Jenin. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction continues in Jalbun towards Al Mutilla, Raba, Al Mughayyir, Bardala and 'Ein al Beida, and towards the Jordan River. Raids/Curfew: Beginning at 21:45 on 27 October 2004, the Israeli army remains positioned in the city of Jenin and Jenin refugee camp and continues to impose curfew on Jenin refugee camp. The Israeli army repeatedly opened intensive fire towards civilian houses, injuring 2 children, searched a number of houses, occupied several other houses and civilian buildings in the city and camp after detaining their residents, and converted them into military posts. The Israeli army remains positioned in the area as of 08:00 this morning. At 23:00, the Israeli army raided Al Far'a refugee camp. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army vinjured 2 civilians, including 1 child. At 00:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. Detentions: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint, prevented civilians movement, and set specific times for the daily crossing of civilians.
TULKAREM	 <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact

	 education, economic and livelihood activities and impedes access to health facilities. Raid: At 04:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian. Air Patrol: At 01:00, an Israeli army reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over the city of Tulkarem. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Mu'min An Nabrissi in the city of Tulkarem. Detentions: Israeli troops positioned near 'Innab iron Wall gate at the eastern entrance to the city of Tulkarem detained hundreds of civilians for an extended period of time due to thorough searches.
QALQILYA	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and impedes access to health facilities. Flying Checkpoints: The Israeli army set up several flying checkpoints along the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road, searched civilians and vehicles, and detained dozens of civilians, delaying them from reaching their workplaces.
NABLUS	 Closure: The Israeli army set up dozens of flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Raid: At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and 'Ein Beit El Ma' refugee camp and searched a number of houses in the refugee camp. At 04:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
SALFIT	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. The checkpoint set up at the entrance to the village of Deir Ballut continues to prevent civilians from entering or exiting the village. Access is only permitted at specific times. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction west of the village of Iskaka, north of the city of Salfit (around the settlement of Ariel) and in the villages of Al Zawiya and Deir Ballut, remains suspended due to changes in the Wall route following an Israeli Supreme Court order. Raids: At 14:30, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Salfit and patrolled

Raid: At 07:30, the Israeli army raided the area of Al Ja'farawi south of the settlement of Kfar Darom, opened intensive fire, and searched the area. Palestinian Attack: At 07:30, an armed battle took place between Palestinian fighters and the Israeli army in the area surrounding the settlement of Kfar Darom, during which the Israeli army killed 1 Palestinian fighter. Killing: The Israeli army killed Mohammed Khalil Al Qayidh near the settlement of Kfar Darom. 		
KHAN YUNIS	 Closure: Abu Al 'Ajin road (Khan Yunis Al Sharqiya) is closed. Western road (Khan Yunis) remains closed. Al Mawasi/Khan Yunis road (Al Tuffah checkpoint) is partially open. Abu Holi road is partially open. At 17:30, the Israeli army repeatedly closed Salah Ad Din road between Abu Holi and Al Matahin checkpoints and searched civilians and vehicles. 		
RAFAH	 Closure: Gaza International Airport remains closed. Rafah Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Palestinian Attack: At 19:00, 2 Qassam mortars were fired towards the settlement of Morag.

POLITICAL PRISONERS	• Israeli Measures Against Political Prisoners: 22 political prisoners in Kedumim Military Prison Camp suffer from harsh conditions of imprisonment due to the lack and poor quality of food. The Military Prison Camp administration intentionally supplies prisoners with <i>Sahur</i> (the last meal before daybreak during the month of Ramadan) at 22:00 and prevents them from going out to the prison yard. Many prisoners are in poor health conditions.

West Bank: (i) Israeli authorities renewed 9,934 work permits to cross the Green Line. The total number of those allowed to cross is unknown. (ii) Israeli authorities restricted the issuing of work permits only to civilians who are married with children and over the age of 30. Gaza Strip: **WORK** (i) Israeli authorities renewed 1,267 work permits for workers in the **PERMITS** Industrial Zones. However, beginning on 31 August 2004, workers have not been allowed access to the Industrial Zones. (ii) Israeli authorities renewed 5,083 work permits for workers to cross the Green Line. However, beginning on 1 September 2004, workers have not been allowed access into the Green Line. Israeli authorities permitted 2,687 construction workers to remain (iii) overnight inside the Green Line.
