<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>(ii) At 23:00, the Israeli Army intensified its restrictions on Jab checkpoint on the main road connecting Jerusalem, Ramallah and Jericho and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> On October 31<sup>st</sup> 2011, Israeli forces detained Khaled Al-Zir in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem.</li> <li>• <b><u>Destruction of Property:</u></b> At 09:30, Israeli forces demolished 3 buildings used to livestock shelters in Al-Khan Al-Ahmar area near Maale Adumim settlement; the shelters are owned by Sulaiman Jahalin and Salman Jahalin.</li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 10:15, a group of Israeli settlers stoned Palestinian farmers as they were collecting the olive harvest in Mikhmas village and injured Aisha Abu Ali; she was admitted to hospital for treatment.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of</li> </ul>

According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.</li> </ul>
<p><b>QALQILYA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Flying checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:10 and again at 15:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jit village junction, searching civilians and vehicles .</li> <li>(ii) At 10:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Amin village, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 21:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jinsafout village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iv) At 05:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Qalqilya searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 03:30 on October 31<sup>st</sup> 2011, Israeli forces raided Kafr Laqif, served summons to Motaz Abdul Qader and Tamer Assaf to report to Israeli Intelligence.</li> <li>(ii) At 00:50, Israeli forces raided Jit village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b></li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement .</li> </ul>
<b>NABLUS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b></li> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b></li> <li>(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues its restrictions on access at Za’tara</li> </ul>

<b>BETHLEHEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> At 14:10, Israeli forces increased restrictions at the Container checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> At 10:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Beit Jala, searching civilians and vehicles until 11:10.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 19:20, Israeli forces raided Janata until 20:10.</li> <li>(ii) At 23:50, Israeli forces raided Um Al-Rakaba area in Al Khader, searched several a home and.</li> <li>(iii) At 01:20, Israeli forces raided Al Ubeidia.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in northwest of Beit Jala town.</li> </ul>

In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.</li> <li>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. <b>Hebron</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.</li> <li>(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.</li> <li>(v) Since October 15<sup>th</sup> 2011, the Israeli army closed two secondary roads leading to Beit Ummar with cement blocks.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Wadi Qabbun in North Hebron, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 16:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance to Hebron, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 19:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al Zif village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> At 08:00, Israeli forces raided Al-Arroub refugee camp, stormed a home and detained a resident.</li> <li>• <b><u>Attack:</u></b> At 17:00, Israeli forces positioned at a checkpoint near Wadi Qaboun in northern Hebron and fired sound and teargas grenades towards several children for alleged stoning.</li> <li>• <b><u>Detentions:</u></b> Israeli forces detained Mohammad Hleiqawi during their raid into Al-Arroub camp.</li> <li>• <b><u>Physical Assault:</u></b> At 05:50, Israeli forces assaulted Mohammad Al Hatsab, leaving him with contusions.</li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 10:30, a group of Israeli settlers raided a farmer's land attempting to steal several goats and withdrew after village residents intervened.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.</li> </ul>

**Detainees Report**

- An Israeli Military courts in Jerusalem sentenced Ali Kanaan, a resident of Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem to 13 years with an additional 3 years prison sentence and fined him 7500 NIS (approximately \$2050 USD ) and also sentenced Ammar Al-Absi , a resident of Silwan to 10 months imprisonment.
- An Israeli military court in Salim detention camp sentenced Jamal Al-Tirawi, a Member of the Palestinian Legislative Council and resident of Balata refugee camp to 30 days.
