<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>(ii) At 23:00, the Israeli Army intensified its restrictions on Jab checkpoint on the main road connecting Jerusalem, Ramallah and Jericho and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandia village; south of Al-Za’ayyem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>JENIN</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Road:</b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> On the evening of November 1<sup>st</sup> 2011, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Silat Al-Thaher and confiscated a truck carrying coal.</li> <li>• <b>Raid:</b> At 02:45 Israeli forces raided Jenin and Jenin refugee camp, fired flash grenades as they searched several homes, and detained a resident of Jenin refugee camp then withdrew at 03:10.</li> <li>• <b>Detentions:</b> Israeli forces detained Adnan Al-Saadi during their raid into Jenin refugee camp.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>TULKAREM</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> Since 15:00 on October 23<sup>rd</sup> 2011 the Israeli army has closed Palestinian access at ‘Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus, allegedly for road maintenance; the checkpoint is said to be closed until 19:30 on November 1<sup>st</sup> 2011.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Fuqin village junction, searching civilians and vehicles until 13:50.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 17:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Izbat Salman and Beit Amin, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 17:45 and again at 07:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzoun, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 18:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Qalqilya searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement .</li> </ul>
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic.</p> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> The Israeli army continues its restrictions on access at Za’tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> <p>(i) At 17:25 and again at 07:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Salfit and Bruqin, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(ii) At 18:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Al-Dik.</p> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> At 13:00, Israeli forces raided Marda village, temporarily detained and interrogated several residents, then withdrew at 14:15.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>BETHLEHEM</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 14:10, Israeli forces intensified its restrictions at container checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:55 and again at 18:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Nashash junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 13:20 and at 14:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Husan village, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 14:05 and again at 22:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jinata village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iv) At 15:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint beneath Al-Khader bridge, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 21:20, Israeli forces raided Zaatara, searched 2 homes and withdrew at 22:35.</li> <li>(ii) At 22:35, Israeli forces raided Jinata.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction resumed in northwest of Beit Jala town.</li> </ul>

In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.</li> <li>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

<b>Hebron</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.</li> <li>(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.</li> <li>(v) Since October 15<sup>th</sup> 2011, the Israeli army closed two secondary roads leading to Beit Ummar with cement blocks.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> At 07:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Fawwar camp, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> At 14:30 and again at 02:35, Israeli forces raided Hebron and set up a flying checkpoint.</li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 00:20, a group of Israeli settlers, under the protection of Israeli forces, stormed several homes and properties in eastern Hebron, fired stun grenades and stoned homes and vehicles, damaging 3 vehicles belonging to Qassem Jaber, Khalil Jaber and Farid Jaber. Israeli forces temporarily detained Abdel Fatah Jaber after he attempted to stop the settler attack then withdrew at 01:30.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.</li> </ul>

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00.</li> <li>• Israeli forces violated the ceasefire agreement by firing artillery shells towards Central Gaza and Khan Yunis and opening fire from naval vessels fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of North Gaza and Khan Yunis</li> <li>• Palestinian gunmen broke the ceasefire agreement after firing projectiles towards the Green Line.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NORTHERN GAZA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Point:</b> Beit Hanun (Erez) is open to previously- coordinated patients, foreign journalists, staff of international organizations, merchants, business people and civilians travelling to Jordan through Al-Karama (Allenby) bridge in the West Bank.</li> <li>• <b>Attack:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) On the morning of November 1<sup>st</sup> 2011, Israeli forces opened fire towards a group of international peace activists taking part in demonstrations in Beit Hanoun to protest Israeli attacks on Palestinian farmers that ban them from accessing their land.</li> <li>(ii) On the evening of November 1<sup>st</sup> 2011, Israeli forces fired several grenades towards agricultural land Beit Hanoun.</li> <li>(iii) On the evening of November 1<sup>st</sup> 2011, Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Al-Sudaniya beach in Beit Lahia.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.</li> <li>(ii) Al-Shija'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Central Gaza</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Raid:</b> At dawn on November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2011, Israeli bulldozers, under the protection of Israeli forces, carried out an incursion east of Wadi Salqa and levelled agricultural land.</li> <li>• <b>Aerial Surveillance:</b> On the evening of November 1<sup>st</sup> 2011, Israeli helicopters surveyed the skies north of Al-Qarara village</li> </ul>
