WEST BANK

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to occupied Jerusalem city and Al Aqsa Mosque, and prevent civilians from other districts from entering the city, with the exception of those carrying Israeli permits.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order #S/02/09 closing the seam line area, which forms an extension of the Wall.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to Jerusalem city.

• <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem.

- Raid: At 13:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Ar-Ram, searched a commercial shop, detained the civilian Abdulmuhsen Al-'Attari and released him at a later time, arrested a civilian and withdrew at 14:20.
- <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested in the town of Ar-Ram the civilian Ahmad Al Qawasmi.
- <u>Destruction of Property</u>: On 02 November 2010, the Israeli army demolished in the town of Beit Hanina on the main road leading to Hizma village a carwash shop under the pretext of not being licensed. The carwash shop belongs to the civilian Ma'mun Yaser Salhab and his brother Majdi.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

	Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of al-'Eizariya
	to al-Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village, Safa village and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. FIving Checkpoints: At 13:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Kafr Ni'ma and searched civilians and vehicles. At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Turmus'ayya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 01:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of Um Safa and Deir As-Sudan and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 10:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Abu Qash. At 22:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Ein Yabrud. At 23:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Rima and patrolled the area until 00:25. At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Atara and opened fire indiscriminately while patrolling the area. At 00:40, the Israeli army raided Kharbatha Al Misbah village and opened fire indiscriminately while patrolling the area. At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Ein Arik and opened fire indiscriminately while patrolling the area. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided Al 'Am'ari refugee camp in El Bireh city, searched 3 houses and withdrew at 03:30. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud, in the periphery of the settlement of Ofarim and north of the villages of Al Lubban Al Gharbi and Rantis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to 'Arraba town, east of the settlement of Dotan. Raid: At 09:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Ya'bad and the village of Tura Al Gharbiya until 10:30. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint, allowing civilian access from 06:00 to 22:00.

	• Raid: At 02:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Tammun until 04:00.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbat Shofeh. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road. Raid: At 09:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarm, detained a number of university students and released them after inspecting their IDs and taking their mobile numbers and withdrew at 10:30. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Fiving Checkpoints: At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles. At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Izbat At-Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Jayyus and the village of Kafr Jamal and searched civilians and vehicles until 21:20. Raid: At 05:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Hajja. Detentions: At 09:30, the Israeli army detained 2 civilians from the town of Kafr Thulth while grazing sheep in the area of Al 'Oyoun in Wadi Qana. The Israeli army released them after DCO intervention. They are Ahmad Mufid Muqbel and 'Amer Mahmoud Ali Khouli. Land Leveling: At 15:00, the Israeli army in the area located between the village of Jit and the settlement outpost of Jil'ad conducted leveling work in a plot of land estimated at about 35 dunums belonging to the civilian Jamil Hasan Khader. Settler Violence: At 22:00, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Kadumim hurled stones towards civilian vehicles travelling on Qalqiliya – Nablus main road near the settlement. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and search civilians, including students, with a detector. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha and prevent the access of its inhabitants. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools

outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through gate # 109.

• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues on land belonging to the village of Kafr Laqif, north of the settlement of Karni Shomron, on land belonging to the village of Immatin, northeast of the settlement of 'Amano'el, and east of the town of Kafr Thulth near the settlement of Ma'aleh Shomron.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only from 07:00 until 02:00.
- (ii) Awarta commercial checkpoint is open for civilians from 05:00 until 20:00 and on Friday from 05:00 until 15:00.
- (iii) At 08:30, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Huwwara checkpoint and impeded civilian access.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction leading to the village of Deir Sharaf (on Nablus Tulkarm main road) and searched civilians and vehicles until 10:00.
- (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Sarra (on Nablus Qalqiliya main road) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 20:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of Asira Ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles until 21:15.
- (iv) At 23:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Qusin and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 14:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jamma'in.
- (ii) At 17:20, the Israeli army raided the village of Burqa, searched a house and set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 21:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Till until 22:45.

NABLUS

	(iv) At 22:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Furush Beit Dajan and arrested a civilian.
	Arrests: (i) In the evening of 01 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested at Huwwara checkpoint the civilian Hisham Saleem Dweikat.
	(ii) At 02:00 on 02 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians during a raid on the town of Qabalan as mentioned in the previous report. They are Abdallah Yousef Abdulhameed Aqra' and Fuad Issa Hafez Aqra'.
	(iii) The Israeli army arrested in the village of Furush Beit Dajan the civilian Marwan Ibrahim Abu Jeish.
SALFIT	Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the
	 entrances of 2 side roads between the village of Marda and its agricultural land. Checkpoint: The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint, impeded civilian access and harassed officers belonging to the Palestinian security apparatuses. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area north of the town of Deir Istiya (southeast of the settlement of 'Amanu'el).
JERICHO	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at al-Hamra
	checkpoint and allow civilian access from 06:00 until 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja and allow access only to civilians holding Jericho and Jordan Valley IDs and those with permits.
	Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho. (ii) At 20:20 the Living Checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho.
	(ii) At 23:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Ein Ad Duyuk (the northern entrance to the city of Jericho) and searched civilians and vehicles.
	• <u>Settler Violence</u> : At 08:45, a group of Israeli settlers with 2 bulldozers conducted leveling work in the area of Ash-Shallalat that is located west of Al Auja village.
ветніенем	Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.

- (ii) As of 15 September 2007, the Israeli army continues to prevent civilian access, pursuant to military order # 07/02, to 22 *dunum* area confiscated according to military order # 07/31 to establish a crossing point in the area of Al Mazmuriya between the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, the sideway east of Beit Fajjar town and the agricultural road that is located between the town of Taqu'a and the village of Khirbet Al Baq'a.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An-Nashash junction (the southern entrance to Bethlehem city). Again at 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Za'tara and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Husan and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 07:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Beit Sahur.

• Raids:

- (i) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Fajjar, searched 3 houses and a bakery shop, served summons to civilians Wael Ali 'Ebayyat, Muhammad Ahmad Mousa Thawabteh and Adel Issa Ali Taqatqa to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency and withdrew at 12:10.
- (ii) At 15:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Al Khadr.
- (iii) At 05:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Za'tara, set up a flying checkpoint, patrolled the area and withdrew at 05:00.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khadr and Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.

• Closure:

(i)

HEBRON

The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruit and vegetable market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.

(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # 09/06 closing the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuating those inside it and preventing civilians from accessing it. This is the land seized for military purposes for the construction of the Wall.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Halhul town. Again at 17:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of As-Samoa' and searched civilians and vehicles until 09:00.
- (iv) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance to the city of Hebron (off bypass road # 35) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (vi) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of Al Fahs south of Hebron city and searched civilians and vehicles until 09:20.

• Raids:

- (i) At 08:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Deir Samit.
- (ii) At 12:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Bani Na'im, took photographs for the civil police building in the city, patrolled the area and withdrew at 07:30.
- (iii) At 14:20, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, searched 2 houses, arrested a civilian and withdrew at 07:30.

Arrests:

(i) At 08:30, the Israeli army arrested 7 civilians who are members of one family, including 4 brothers, after searching a number of houses and a furniture factory. The Israeli army severely beat the civilian Sharif

Taher Al Joulani causing him injuries and a fracture in the arm. This incident took place in the area of Jabal Johar, classified as H2 area, of the city of Hebron which falls under Israeli control. The Israeli army arrested the civilians: Ibrahim Kamal Abdulsalam Al-'Ajlouni and his brother Talab; Hisham Mahmoud Al Jamal; Nizam Fahd 'Ashour Al 'Ajlouni and his brothers Nazmi, Nazem and Bilal.

- (ii) The Israeli army arrested in the city of Hebron the civilian Muhammad Ahmad Sultan An-Natsheh.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, in the periphery of Eshkolot settlement southwest of Adh Dhahiriya town and between southwest of Arab Ar Ramadin village and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the Israeli army declared a unilateral ceasefire. In the meantime, armed Palestinian groups declared a one-week-long ceasefire. Meanwhile, the ceasefire was extended until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire is holding despite the end of the specified period. ALL DISTRICTS The Israeli army violated the ceasefire by raiding Palestinian territory and opening fire from its locations on the Green Line in the districts of Gaza, Central Gaza, Khan Yunis and Rafah. As a result, 2 civilians were injured, including a mentally challenged civilian.

• Armed Palestinian groups violated the ceasefire by opening fire and firing a number of mortars towards an Israeli army patrol near the Green Line.

Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for the passage of critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, the staff of **NORTHERN** international humanitarian organizations, traders, businessmen and civilians GAZA travelling through Al Karama Crossing who have prior coordination. **Closure of Crossing Points:** (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing was opened on 01 November 2010 for the entry of wheat and fodder. Al-Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing for fuel transport is closed since (ii) 04 January 2010 by an Israeli unilateral decision. GAZA Palestinian Attack: At 13:45, armed Palestinian individuals fired a number of mortars towards an Israeli army patrol near the Green Line, in the area between Al-Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing and Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing. Consequently, the Israeli army opened fire intensively towards Palestinian territory east of Gaza city.

CENTRAL GAZA	• Attack: At 11:30, the Israeli army opened fire from its locations on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory east of Al Bureij refugee camp injuring a civilian who was working in a landfill.
KHAN YOUNIS	<u>Attack</u> : At 15:00, the Israeli army opened fire from its locations on the Green Line towards civilian agricultural land and houses east of Al Farahin area injuring the mentally challenged civilian Mahmoud Sharir.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al Awdah) Crossing is open for the departure of patients and visa holders, and for the entry of civilians and patients who received treatment at Egyptian hospitals. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for the entry of food, a quantity of diesel for the electricity plant and cooking gas. Raid: At dawn on 02 November 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and a bulldozer covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided Palestinian territory east of Ash-Shoka town and opened fire intensively while leveling an area of agricultural land. Attack: In the morning of 02 November 2010, the Israeli army opened fire from its locations on the Green Line towards agricultural land in the periphery of Sufa Crossing northeast of Rafah city.
