<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikxa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikxa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> At 08:00, Israeli forces detained and interrogated, Ahmad Al-Roueidhi, an advisor to the President, and Kamel AL-Husseini, governor of Jerusalem at Al-Maskubia detention centre regarding a festival which was to take place in Jerusalem to celebrate the release of Palestinian detainees.</li> <li>• <b><u>Home Demolition:</u></b> On November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2011, Israeli forces demolished a small sandwich shop near “Bab Al-Amoud” in the Old City, beat the shop owner, Mahmoud Masoodat and detained his 2 children.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Al-Taibeh junction (on the Ramallah–Jericho road), searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 18:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Beit Ur Al-Tahta and Beir Ur Al-Foqa villages, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b>Attack:</b> At 09:20, Israeli troops positioned near the Beitunia checkpoint fired teargas grenades towards several children for alleged stoning.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continued in the area west of ‘Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement ‘Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.</li> </ul>

<b>TUBAS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.</li> <li>• <b>Raid:</b> At 01:05, Israeli forces raided Al-Faraa village until 05:50.</li> </ul>
<b>TULKAREM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> On November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2011 the Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at ‘Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus, impeding the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> At 19:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Jarushiya village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 13:10, Israeli forces raided Tulkarem, stormed a home and withdrew at 15:15.</li> <li>(ii) At 22:30, Israeli forces raided Al-Ras village.</li> <li>(iii) At 02:20, Israeli forces raided Anabta and searched 2 homes.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route continued in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>QALQILYA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Hija and Al-Fundoq villages, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 13:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzun, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 19:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jit village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iv) At 20:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Qalqilya searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(v) At 21:00, Israeli forces set up a flying check point at the northern entrance to Jayyous.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement .</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NABLUS</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00</li> <li>(ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</li> <li>(iii) At 10:45, the Israeli army increased restrictions on “Shavi Shamron” checkpoint, impeding the free flow of traffic</li> <li>(iv) At 16:55, the Israeli army increased restrictions at Huwara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> The Israeli army continues its restrictions on access at Za'tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:15 and again at 19:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Kafil Harres and Harres villages, searching civilians and vehicles until 20:20.</li> <li>(ii) At 18:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Deir Ballout and Rafat villages.</li> <li>(iii) At 19:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Deir Istiya, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 12:00, Israeli forces raided Bidhya, until 13:30.</li> <li>(ii) At 01:35, Israeli forces raided Harres village</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Settlement Activity:</u></b> At 11:00, Israeli forces began levelling and expanding roads at the northern entrance of Salfit in order to place an electronic gate.</li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 11:30, 3 armed Israeli settlers raided Deir Ballout under the protection of Israeli forces and withdrew at 13:15.</li> </ul>

<b>BETHLEHEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 22:50, Israeli forces intensified its restrictions at container checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> At 08:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Nashash junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 03:00 on November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2011, Israeli forces raided Beit Fajjar, and detained a resident.</li> <li>(ii) At 04:00 on November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2011, Israeli forces raided Al-Doha and detained a resident.</li> <li>(iii) At dawn on November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2011, Israeli forces raided Husan village and detained 2 residents including a child.</li> <li>(iv) At 20:30, Israeli forces raided Harmalah village, fired flash grenades then withdrew at 20:55.</li> <li>(v) At 03:05, Israeli forces raided Bethlehem.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Detention:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces detained Nasria Takatka during their raid into Beit Fajjar.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces detained Nader Al-Khatib during their raid into Al Dohat.</li> <li>(iii) Israeli forces detained Yoesef Al_Shaer (17 years) and Ratib Sabatin during their raid into Husan village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continued in northwest of Beit Jala town.</li> </ul>

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00.</li> <li>• Israeli forces violated the ceasefire agreement by firing artillery shells towards North Gaza Gaza and Khan Yunis and opening fire from naval vessels fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Rafah.</li> </ul>
