JERUSALEM	 Closure: On the 2nd October, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and prevented civilians from West Bank districts from entering the city to pray in Al-Aqsa Mosque. The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. Provocation of Palestinian Forces: At 15:30, the Israeli army detained a Palestinian Civil Police vehicle in the town of Al-Ram north of Jerusalem and confiscated a baton. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharpiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayyem village; a

	 <u>Arrests</u>: At 01:40 on 05 November 2011, the Israeli army arrested at the flying checkpoint on the bridge of the town of Attara a civilian called Wahid Abdel Rahim Abu Shihab.
	 Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al- Gharbi and Rantis villages because of the Sabbath holiday.
JENIN	• <u>Closure of Main Road</u> : The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.
	 Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.

	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : At 11:25, the Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic.

	Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted

	• Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route ceased in the
	area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the
	new Wall route will be constructed west of the village because of the Sabbath holiday.
	• Closure of Roads:
	(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 16:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the village of the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint between the villages of Al-Funduq and Jinasaphot.
- Raids: At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the area located between the town of 'Azzun and the village of Kafr Laqef and combed land cultivated with olive trees.
- <u>Settler violence</u>: At 14:50, 3 settlers entered the boundaries of the village of Qar'ata and stoned the house if a civilian called Awwad Al-Tawil, but Palestinian civilians confronted then and forced the settles to retreat.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement because of the Sabbath holiday.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Oarvut.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
- (iii) At 09:40, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions on civilian movement on Huwara checkpoint impeding the free flow of traffic until 09:55.

• Flying checkpoints:

- (i) At 18:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Surra on the main road between Nablus and Qalqilya and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 19:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Beit Fourik and impeded flow of traffic until 19:30.

	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the northern entrance to Brugin town.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
	(iii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
SALFIT	At 09:20, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at the northern gate of Salfit and impeded the flow of traffic.
SALFII	 <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army increased restrictions on Zatara checkpoint, obstructing the free flow of traffic.
	• Flying Checkpoints:
	(i) At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Brouqin and searched civilians and vehicles.
	(ii) At 16:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the road connecting the town of Kafl Jares with the village of Hares.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel because of the Sabbath holiday.
JERICHO	• Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.
	 Checkpoints: (i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to 23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint while searching the surrounding
	area.
	(ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-'Auja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho
	District and others with access permits.
	• <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> At 09:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho and searched vehicles and civilians.
	• <u>Closure</u> :
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the
	exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of
	the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has provented civilians from
BETHLEHEM	(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al
	 Jab'a villages. <u>Checkpoints</u>: At 00:20, the Israeli army intensified restriction on the "container" checkpoint and impeded flow of traffic.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Za'tara and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) (i) At 21:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Tegoa and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 21:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Harmala and patrolled it until 23:40
- (ii) At 22:45, the Israeli army raided the town of Al-Khader and patrolled it until 23:30.
- (iii) At 00:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Za'tara.
- (iv) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Obaidiyya, raided several houses and arrested 2 civilians and delivered notifications to report to the Israeli intelligence to 2 civilians called Fawzi Amer Mohammad Abu Sarhan and Salah Ali Shanayta.
- (v) At 03:25, the Israeli army raided the town of Teqoa and delivered to 16-yearl-old Rabi's Mohammad Jibril a notification to report to the Israeli intelligence.
- <u>Arrsest</u>: The 2 civilians arrested in the town of Obaidiyya are Rakan Mohammad Atta Shanayta and Shafiq Ali Sleiman Radayda.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased northwest of Beit Jala town because of the Sabbatah holiday.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.
- (v) Since 15 November 2011, the Israeli army closed 2 entrances (Al-Maqbara and Qit'at Al-Arba'een) leading to the town of Beit 'Ummar with cement blocks.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Sammou' and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the bridge of the town

of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles

• Raids:

- (i) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Yatta, set up a checkpoint and raided it until 13:20.
- (ii) At 17:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron. The Israeli army raided and patrolled the city again at 19:50 and at 02:00 and searched a civilian house...
- (iii) At 19:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhul and set up a checkpoint.
- (iv) At 01:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Surif.
- **<u>Demonstrations</u>**: At 12:00, a demonstration set out in the town of Beit 'Ummar near Karmi Tzur settlement in protest of settler violence and land confiscation. The Israeli army prevented protestors from reaching Palestinian land near the settlement and declared it a closed military zone.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town because of the Sabbath holiday.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011.
- The Israeli army breaches ceasefire and fired 2 missiles on Gaza and opened machine gun fire in Khan Younis resulting in the death of one armed Palestinian, the injury of 4 civilians, including 1 seriously injured.
- Armed Palestinian breached cease fire and fire a projectile in the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA

- <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was closed.
- <u>Palestinian Attacks</u>: On 06 November 2011, armed Palestinians fired a projectile in the Green Line.

GAZA

- Closure of Crossing Points:
- (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
- (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
- Attacks: On 05 November 2011, the Israeli army opened fire at Palestinian famers near Al-Shuja'iya-Nahal 'Oz east of the city of Gaza and injured 1 civilian called Mohammad Ibrahim Hamad.

KHAN YOUNIS

- Air Attacks: On the evening of 05 November 2011, Israeli combat air crafts fired 2 missiles and opened machine gun fire at armed Palestinians east of the town of Qarara, killed 1 armed Palestinian and injured 3, including 1 seriously injured.
- <u>Killing</u>: The armed civilian killed east of the town of Qarara is called Abdallah Eid Muhanna.
- Closure of Crossing Points:
- Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed.
- Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was partially opened for entry of medical aid.
