WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the occupied city of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque, and prevent civilians from other districts from entering the city, except those possessing Israeli permits.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to Jerusalem city.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem.

Raids:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Isawiya, set up flying checkpoints at its eastern and western entrances. Confrontations took place with school pupils after impeding their access to their schools. The Israeli army arrested 4 civilians, including 3 children.
- (ii) At 07:50 on 10 November 2010, the Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis and arrested a civilian.

• Arrests:

- (i) The Israeli army arrested in the village of Al Isawiya: Ibrahim Riyadh Abu Al Hasa, 15-year-old; Amir Hasan Muhaisen, 15-year-old; Ahmad Samih 'Elayyan, 15-year-old; and Ashraf Jamal 'Ata'Elayyan.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested in the town of Abu Dis the civilian Habib Musallam Muhammad Za'atreh.
- <u>House Demolition</u>: On 09 November 2010, the Israeli army in the neighborhood of Silwan in occupied Jerusalem city served notices for demolishing 5 houses under the pretext of not having licenses and for the interest of establishing a settlement project in the area.

• Wall Gates:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.

JERUSALEM

	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village, Safa village and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. Flving Checkpoint: At 23:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of Kafr Malik and Khirbet Abu Falah. Raids: At 01:50, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Arura, searched 2 houses, served summons to 2 civilians, including police officer Muhannad 'Awwad 'Odeh, to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency and withdrew at 03:40. At 02:15, the Israeli army raided Al Jalazun refugee camp, searched a house and arrested a civilian. At 03:00, the Israeli army raided the city of El Bireh and arrested a member of the Palestinian Legislative Council. Again at 05:00, the Israeli army raided the city, besieged Al 'Ein Mosque and detained worshippers after performing the Fajr prayers. The Israeli army released them after inspecting their IDs and taking their names and mobile phone numbers. The Israeli army withdrew at 05:55. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested in Al Jalazun refugee camp the civilian Osamah Mustafa Khalil Nakhleh. The Israeli army arrested in the city of El Bireh the Palestinian Legislative Council member Mahmoud Ahmad Abdulrahman Ar Ramahi. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud, in the periphery of the settlement of Ofarim and north of the villages of Al Lubban Al Gharbi and Rantis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to 'Arraba town, east of the settlement of Dotan. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

TOUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint, allowing civilian access from 06:00 to 22:00.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbat Shofeh. Checkpoints: At 11:50, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road and impeded civilian access until 13:30. Flying Checkpoint: At 15:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Kafriyat Road, which connects the districts of Tulkarm and Qalqiliya, and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid: At 22:50, the Israeli army raided the village of Kur and searched a house. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Immatin, detained the Palestinian National Security officer Abdulqader Muhammad Abdulqader At-Tayeh and released him following DCO intervention. Again at 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles. At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles. At 12:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Kafr Laqif and searched civilians and vehicles until 12:40. At 15:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:00. At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northern and western entrances to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. At 17:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Izbat At-Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Jinsafut, on Qalqiliya – Nablus main road, and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:30. Raids: At 19:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al Funduq. At 22:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Hajja and patrolled the area.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and search civilians, including students, with a detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha and prevent the access of its inhabitants. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through gate # 109.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues on land belonging to the village of Kafr Laqif, north of the settlement of Karni Shomron, on land belonging to the village of Immatin, northeast of the settlement of 'Amano'el, and east of the town of Kafr Thulth near the settlement of Ma'aleh Shomron.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only from 07:00 until 02:00.
- (ii) Awarta commercial checkpoint is open for civilians from 05:00 until 20:00 and on Friday from 05:00 until 15:00.
- (iii) At 08:15, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Shavi Shomron checkpoint that is set up on Nablus Jenin main road, detained a bus carrying university students and impeded civilian access until 09:30.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 14:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the settlement of Yitzhar and searched civilians and vehicles until 15:20.
- (ii) At 15:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the town of Beita and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:30.
- (iii) At 00:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Sarra, on Nablus Qalqiliya main road, and searched civilians and vehicles until 01:00.
- (iv) At 00:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadel.

NABLUS

	• Raid: At 00:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Aqraba and patrolled the area.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrances of 2 side roads between the village of Marda and its agricultural land. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impede civilian access. Flving Checkpoint: At 18:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Kifl Hares and the village of Hares and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:00. Settlement Activity: On 09 November 2010, the Israeli occupation authorities decided to build a new settlement neighborhood consisting of 800 housing units in the settlement of Ari'el. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area north of the town of Deir Istiya (southeast of the settlement of 'Amanu'el).
JERICHO	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at al-Hamra checkpoint and allow civilian access from 06:00 until 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja and allow access only to civilians holding Jericho and Jordan Valley IDs and those with permits. Flying Checkpoints: At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho. At 20:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the Dead Sea and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to road # 90 in the middle of Al Auja village. At 05:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Az-Zubeidat and searched civilians and vehicles Arrest: On 09 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested at Al Karama (Allenby) checkpoint the civilian Fadi Nabil Subhi Khaled from the town of Jayyus in the district of Qalqiliya on his return from the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.
BETHLEHEM	• Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.

- (ii) As of 15 September 2007, the Israeli army continues to prevent civilian access, pursuant to military order # 07/02, to 22 *dunum* area confiscated according to military order # 07/31 to establish a crossing point in the area of Al Mazmuriya between the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, the sideway east of Beit Fajjar town and the agricultural road that is located between the town of Taqu'a and the village of Khirbet Al Baq'a.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khadr and Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # 09/06 closing the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuating those inside it and preventing civilians from accessing it. This is the land seized for military purposes for the construction of the Wall.

HEBRON

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.

• Flying Checkpoints:

(i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to the town of Halhul. Again at 18:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint.

- (ii) At 08:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 18:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance to Hebron bypass road # 35.
- (iv) At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of An-Nabi Yunis.

• Raids:

- (i) At 19:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Sa'ir, detained a civilian and released him at a later time.
- (ii) At 03:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Ash-Shuyukh, searched a house and arrested a civilian.

• Arrests:

- (i) In the evening of 08 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested near the entrance to the town of Beit 'Awwa the civilian Ibrahim Isma'il Amr from the village of Al Majd.
- (ii) At 04:50 on 09 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested during a raid on Al Arrub refugee camp, in addition to what has been mentioned in the previous report, the civilian Mazen Abed Ibrahim Abu Rajab.
- (iii) The Israeli army arrested in the town of Ash-Shuyukh the civilian Anas Muhammad Halayqah.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, in the periphery of Eshkolot settlement southwest of Adh Dhahiriya town and between southwest of Arab Ar Ramadin village and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the Israeli army declared a unilateral ceasefire. In the meantime, armed Palestinian groups declared a one-week-long ceasefire. Meanwhile, the ceasefire was extended until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire is holding despite the end of the specified period.
- The Israeli army violated the ceasefire by raiding Palestinian territory, opening fire in the districts of Khan Yunis and Rafah and opening fire from its locations on the Green Line and from helicopter gunships in the districts of Northern Gaza and Rafah injuring a civilian in Northern Gaza district.
- Armed Palestinian groups breached the ceasefire by firing 2 mortars towards the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA

• <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for the passage of critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, the staff of

	 international humanitarian organizations, traders, businessmen and civilians travelling through Al Karama Crossing who have prior coordination. Attack: In the morning of 10 November 2010, the Israeli army opened fire from its locations on the Green Line towards a number of civilians in the periphery of Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing, north of Beit Hanun town, injuring a civilian. Demonstration: In the morning of 09 November 2010, a mass demonstration, with the participation of international activists, took place in the periphery of Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing, north of Beit Hanun town, against the buffer zones near the border fence where the Israeli army ban farmers and land owners from reaching and cultivating the land.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Al-Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing for fuel transport is closed since 04 January 2010 by an Israeli unilateral decision. Air Patrols: At 11:30, Israeli F-16 warplanes patrolled the skies and conducted mock air raids above Gaza city. In the evening of 09 November 2010, Israeli helicopter gunships patrolled the skies above Gaza city.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YOUNIS	 Raids: At dawn on 09 November 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided 300 meters inside Palestinian territory, east of Khuza'a town, and opened fire intensively towards civilian agricultural land and houses while leveling an area of land. In the morning of 10 November 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided Palestinian territory east of Al Qarara town, and opened fire intensively towards civilian agricultural land and houses while leveling an area of land.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al Awdah) Crossing is open for the departure of the 7th batch of pilgrims. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for the entry of food, humanitarian assistance, a quantity of diesel for the electricity plant and 6 truckloads of cement and iron parts for UNRWA projects.

- Raid: In the morning of 09 November 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided Palestinian territory east of Ash Shoka town, east of Rafah city, and opened fire intensively towards civilian agricultural land and houses while leveling an area of land.
- <u>Attack</u>: In the morning of 10 November 2010, Israeli helicopter gunships opened machinegun fire towards the periphery of Yasser 'Arafat International Airport east of Rafah city.
- Palestinian Attack: At 10:30, 2 mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
