<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and to prevent civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem pursuant to military order No. 09/02S, and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> On 14 November 2011, the Israeli army raided the village of Isawiya, stormed into a commercial store and assaulted 3 civilians: Omar Mohammad Abu Rayale; Yasser Mohammad Abdel Wahid; Youssef Ahmad Abu Rayale.</li> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> On 14 November 2011, the Israeli army detained 1 civilian called Samer Tareq Al-Sawi (a released prisoner) and released him after investigation.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction has resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.</li> </ul>
<b>RAMALLAH &amp; AL BIREH</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Ramallah.</li> <li>(ii) At dawn of 15 November 2011, the Israeli army raided the town of Safa and arrested 1 civilian.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrests:</u></b> The civilian arrested in the village of Safa is called Rashad Karaja.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continues in the area west of ‘Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement ‘Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.</li> </ul>
<b>JENIN</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Zebouba until 17:00.</li> <li>(ii) At 23:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Mithlon and the village of Al-Jadeeda.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<p>(iii) At 23:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Jalqamous, stormed into several houses, arrested 2 civilians and retreated at 02:00</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Arrests:</b> The 2 civilians arrested in the village of Jalqamous are: Abdel Rahim Sami Salman Al-Haj and Khalil Al-Haj.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> At 14:10, the Israeli army raided the village of Khirbet 'Atouf, demolished a cistern and confiscated water pipes and a generator owned by a civilian called Mohammad Fakhri Abdel Razik.</li> </ul>
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> <li>(iii) Since 13:00 on 03 November 2011, the Israeli army continues to close the detour road with dirt mounds connecting the villages of Shifa and Safarin.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem and its refugee camp, set up a checkpoint and retreated at 11:25.</li> <li>(ii) At 16:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem. The raid took place again at 23:35.</li> <li>(iii) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the towns of Anabta and Balaa and the refugee camp of Ein Shams, stormed several civilian homes, including the home of a released prisoner, and retreated at 01:30.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route has resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.</li> </ul>
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Jeet and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the village of Beit Amin and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Hijjah and Kafr</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

	<p>Qaddoum.</p> <p>(ii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jayyous.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Detention:</b> At 13:30, the Israeli army detained 4 children in the town of 'Azzun: Youssef Mahmoud Adwan 14; Younis Mahmoud Adwan, 15; Youssef Mahran Sweidan, 13; Youssef Mohammad Sweidan 15; and released them at 18:50.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.</li> <li>(ii) On 13 November 2011, the Israeli army levelled Palestinian land in the village of 'Azzun Itmeh in order to construct the wall and expand the settlement of Uranit.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.</li> <li>(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</li> <li>(iii) At 12:00, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions on civilian movement on Huwara checkpoint.</li> <li>(iv) At 10:45, the Israeli army intensified restrictions on Shavi Shomron checkpoint and impeded civilian access. In addition, the Israeli army detained civilians and released them at a later time. Restrictions were intensified again at 22:55.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Flying checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the town of Beit Fourik and searched civilians and vehicles until 13:00.</li> <li>(ii) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction of the village of Deir Sharaf (on Nablus-Tulkarem Road), and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:30.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<p>(iii) At 17:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the junction of al-Maslakh area (the entrance of the eastern part of Nablus) and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Raids:</b></li> <li>(i) At 00:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Tel and fired flash grenades and sound bombs.</li> <li>(ii) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Nablus.</li> <li>• <b>Arrests:</b> At 00:30 on 14 November 2011, the Israeli army arrested in the refugee camp of Balata 1 civilian called Ismail Abu Alfa.</li> </ul>
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b></li> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the northern entrance to Bruqin town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.</li> <li>(iii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 12:15, the Israeli army closed Zatarra checkpoint and obstructed the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> At 13:25, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance of the village of Iskaka and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.</li> </ul>
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Road:</b> The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b></li> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to 23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint while searching the surrounding area.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-'Auja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> At 18:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho and searched civilians and vehicles. The checkpoint was set up again at 21:45.</li> <li>• <b>Arrests:</b> At 10:00, the Israeli army arrested at Al-Karama (Allenby) Crossing a civilian called Qassem Mohammad Youssef Sha'er from Qalqilya on his way back home from Pilgrimage.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Hebron</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.</li> <li>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.</li> <li>(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.</li> <li>(v) Since 15 October 2011, the Israeli army closes 2 entrances of the town of 'Ummar (Al-Mqabara and Qit'at Al-'Arba'een) with cement blocks.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the area of Nabi Younis on Bethlehem-Hebron Road and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011.</li> <li>• The Israeli breached the ceasefire and fired 10 missiles on Rafah. In addition, the air strike on Al-Soudaniyye area west of the town of Beit Lahia resulted in the injury of 5 civilians and the abortion of one female.</li> <li>• <b>Injury:</b> At dawn on 14 November 2011, 5 civilians were injured and 1 female aborted during an air strike on the area of Al-Soudaniyye west of the town of Beit Lahia.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NORTHERN GAZA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Point:</b> Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially opened for humanitarian cases.</li> </ul>

Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Attacks:</b> On 15 November 2011, the Israeli army fired 10 missiles on agricultural land east of the city of Gaza.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>RAFAH</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Crossing Points:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed.</li> <li>• Sufa Crossing is closed.</li> <li>• Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially opened for humanitarian cases..</li> <li>• Al-Awda – Rafah Crossing was open for pilgrims and students and visa holders.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
