<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandia checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.</li> </ul>
<b>RAMALLAH &amp; AL BIREH</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Nabi Saleh village, impeded the free flow of traffic and later allowed cars to pass through the checkpoint.</li> <li>(ii) At 13:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Attara village bridge</li> <li>(iii) At 14:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Mazra’a Al-Sharqiya.</li> <li>(iv) At 15:25, Israeli force set up a flying checkpoint at Surda junction.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Raid:</b></li> <li>(i) At 14:45 and again at 02:05, Israeli forces raided Bir Zeit and set up a flying checkpoint at Bir Zeit University junction, during which confrontations ensued between university students and Israeli troops.</li> <li>(ii) At 02:40, Israeli forces raided Al Jalazoan camp.</li> <li>(iii) At 03:25, Israeli forces raided El-Bireh City until 04:55.</li> <li>• <b>Attack:</b> At 15:30, Israeli forces fired teargas grenades towards civilians for alleged stoning at the entrance Al-Nabi Saleh village.</li> <li>• <b>Detentions:</b> In addition to those mentioned in the previous report, Israeli forces detained Walid Hanashiya during their raid into Ramallah at 01:50 on November 22<sup>nd</sup> 2011.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction continued in the area west of ‘Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement ‘Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.</li> </ul>
<b>JENIN</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Road:</b> The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of ‘Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 18:15, Israeli forces closed “Mofodan” checkpoint located on the main road in southern Yaabad and reopened it at 20:00.</li> <li>• <b>Flying checkpoint:</b> At 16:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Yaabad.</li> <li>• <b>Raid:</b></li> <li>(i) At 18:15 Israeli forces raided Yaabad, opened fire towards agricultural land while searching the southern outskirts of Yaabad for alleged attackers of a settler’s vehicle, who they say threw a Molotov cocktail; troops withdrew at 20:00.</li> <li>(ii) At 23:50, Israeli forces raided Bir Al-Basha.</li> <li>• <b>Detentions:</b> In addition to those mentioned in the previous report, Israeli forces detained Mohammad Nassar at 01:05 on 21.11.2011 during their raid into Jenin as mentioned in the previous report.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Gates:</b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>
<b>TUBAS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> the Israeli army continues to tighten restrictions on Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> At 02:50, Israeli forces raided Tubas fired sound grenades, detained 2 residents and withdrew at 03:55 .</li> <li>• <b>Detentions:</b> Israeli forces detained Zein Sawafta and Thaer Sawafta during their raid into Tubas.</li> </ul>
<b>TULKAREM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b></li> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.</li> <li>(ii) At 13:00, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 20:00 the Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at ‘Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b></li> </ul>

Israeli forces also served 2 residents, Saed and Samer Abu Khazna, summons to Israeli intelligence.</li> <li>(ii) At 23:40, Israeli forces raided Kafr Lubbad.</li> <li>(iii) At 01:05, Israeli forces raided Tulkarem and Tulkarem refugee camp, stormed a home, detained a resident and served Amjad Turk a summon to Israeli intelligence.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Detention:</u></b> Israeli forces detained Amer Turk during their raid into Tulkarem refugee camp.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.</li> </ul>
<b>QALQILIYA</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying checkpoints:</u></b> At 16:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Laqif.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 15:40, Israeli forces raided Azzoun.</li> <li>(ii) At 19:30, Israeli forces raided Izbet Al-Tabib.</li> <li>(iii) At 01:00, Israeli forces raided Hablah.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement and between Azzun Atmeh town and Ornet settlement.</li> </ul>
