JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On November 25th 2011, the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) Israeli forces continue to close the entrance to the Shofat refugee camp with cement blocks, which will impede the free flow of traffic in Ras Khamis, Ras Shihadeh and Salam neighbourhood in Anata and Shofat refugee camp in Jerusalem. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 12:00, Palestinians conducted Friday prayers at the home of the Samrin Family and afterwards marched in protest against the Israeli government’s decision to confiscate the home in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem and giving them until November 28 2011 to evacuate the home. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages. • <u>Flying Checkpoints</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Beit Ur Al-Fouqa

<p>RAMALLAH & AL BIREH</p>	<p>and Beit Ur Al-Tahta.</p> <p>(ii) At 18:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Atara bridge.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raid: At 02:05, Israeli forces raided Beit Rima and Deir Ghassaneh. • Demonstrations: <p>(i) At 12:30, Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Ni'lin, protesting against the construction of the wall, during which confrontations ensued between protesters and Israeli forces, suffocating others as a result of teargas inhalation.</p> <p>(ii) At 12:50, Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Al-Nabi Saleh village to protest land confiscation, during which confrontations ensued between demonstrators and others suffocated as a result of teargas inhalation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
<p>JENIN</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Flying checkpoint: <p>(i) At 11:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kafriyat village, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(ii) At 12:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Bir Al-Basha village junction.</p> <p>(iii) At 16:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Zabuba village, searching civilians and vehicles until 16:50</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raid: At 19:00, Israeli forces raided Zabuba village. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
<p>TUBAS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.
<p>TULKAREM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.</p> <p>(ii) At 13:00, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: the Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Raids: <p>(i) At 11:20, Israeli forces raided Fuqin .</p> <p>(ii) At 11:45, Israeli forces raided Shweikeh neighbourhood in Tulkarem and stormed a home.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.

<p style="text-align: center;">QALQILYA</p>	<p>the town of Azzoun.</p> <p>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al Nabi Elyas village, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 14:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jit village junction. (iii) At 17:40, set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Hija village. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 21:30, a group of Israeli settlers stoned Palestinian vehicles along the main road near Jinssafut village, injuring Sulaiman Kan'an. (ii) At 22:30, a group of Israeli settlers stoned Palestinian vehicles passing along the Qalqilya-Nablus main road. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 12:20 Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Kafir Laqif village to protest closures of the entrance gate leading to the village, during which Israeli forces fired teargas and stun grenades towards demonstrators as they neared towards the village entrance leaving several others suffocated from teargas inhalation. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.
<p style="text-align: center;">NABLUS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00 (ii) At Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00 and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (iii) At 01:45, Israeli forced increased restrictions at Huwwara checkpoint, impeding the free flow of traffic. • <u>Flying checkpoints:</u>

	<p>At 17:30 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Beit Fourik village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</p>
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Checkpoints: the Israeli army continues to increase restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Flying Checkpoint: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Kafil Harres and Harres villages. (ii) At 18:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Hares village junction. • Raid: At 17:15, Israeli forces raided Harres village until 17:30 • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Oja village with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. (ii) At 13:30 Israeli forces continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits. • Flying Checkpoints: At 00:45 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho, searching civilians and vehicles until 17:30. • Raid: At 20:45, Israeli forces raided western Jericho.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. • Checkpoints: At 20:45, Israeli forces increased restrictions at the Container checkpoint, impeded the free flow of traffic and assaulted an unidentified civilian after stopping his vehicle at the checkpoint; he was released at a later time • Flying Checkpoint: At 19:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Taqou village, searching civilians and vehicles. • Demonstrations: At 12:15, Palestinian and international peace activists marched near Al-Masara village to protest the construction of the wall; Israeli forces fired stun and teargas grenades towards protesters, injuring 5 while several others

<p>Hebron</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village. (v) Since 15. 10. 2011, Israeli forces closed two entrances lead to Beit Ummar town. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Huwara. (ii) At 08:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Dura searching civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 13:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance of Abu Al-Asja village, searching civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 16:30 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Beit Awwa junction, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:40, Israeli forces raided Al-Samou. (ii) At 12:30 Israeli forces raided Suba village, west of Dura. (iii) At 13:00, Israeli forces raided Susia, east of Yatta. (iv) At 14:15, Israeli forces raided Raqa'a area in Yatta. (v) At 16:00, Israeli forces raided Hebron. (vi) At 16:05, Israeli forces raided Zif village and searched a home. • Attack: At 14:00, Israeli forces positioned at the entrance to Beit Ummar fired rubber-coated steel bullets, stun and teargas grenades towards residents who were attending a funeral, causing several cases of suffocation from teargas inhalation; also assaulted Mohammad Sabarna was hospitalized for treatment of wounds he sustained when assaulted by the forces. • Demonstrations: At 11:30, protesters conducted Friday prayers on top of the ruins of the mosque in Al-Mafraqa area east of Yatta to protest its demolition and the demolition of 3 residential barracks mentioned in the previous reports. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. • Palestinian gunmen broke the ceasefire agreement by launching projectiles towards the Green Line.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for humanitarian assistance, journalists and international access.
<p style="text-align: center;">GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.

<p style="text-align: center;">RAFAH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: • Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. • Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing is closed • Sufa Crossing is closed. • Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed. • Al Awda crossing – Rafah is closed.
