DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.

• <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

• Raid: At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Ar Ram and patrolled the area near the Faysal al Husseini Stadium, where a match between the Palestine and Greece teams was taking place. It should be noted that the Palestinian Police were assigned to preserve security and order according to a prior coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.

JERUSALEM

RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. Flying Checkpoints: At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Rafat and searched civilians and vehicles. At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint underneath the overpass to the village of Yabrud and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of 'Abud town and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Land Levelling: On 26 November 2009, the Israeli army levelled dozens of dunums of land behind the Wall in the village of Nazlat Zeid. The affected land belong to: 'Aref Dawoud Hamarsheh; Mohammed Dawoud Hamarsheh; and Ibrahim Saleh Hamarsheh. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Attack: At 13:00, Israeli troops positioned near 'Einav checkpoint opened fire towards Tareq Ziyad Ribhi Shufan while he was travelling to see his father, who had a traffic accident. Flying Checkpoint: At 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the village of Far'un and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Jinsafut and searched civilians and vehicles.

	 (ii) At 01:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Jayyus and searched civilians and vehicles. Arrest: At 01:00 on 26 November 2009, the Israeli army arrested 'Uthman Mohammed 'Amer during its raid into the city of Qalqiliya, in addition to those reported yesterday. Wall Gate: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira,
	Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqi; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; the western entrances to the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. The Israeli army has continued to close with an iron gate the western entrance to the village of An Naqura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. At 18:00, the Israeli army closed Huwwara checkpoint and denied civilian access, ostensibly because Israeli settlers were holding a demonstration near the checkpoint. The Israeli army reopened the checkpoint at a later time. Raid: At 01:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and patrolled the area until 06:10. Settler Violence: At 20:00, a group of Israeli settlers threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling along the main road near the junction to the settlement of Yitzhar.
SALFIT	Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.

	 Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. At 14:40, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint, denied civilian access, and reopened it at a later time. Flying Checkpoint: At 23:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Iskaka and searched civilians and vehicles. Settler Violence: At 23:30, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to the entrance to the town of Kifl Haris. Consequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad as well as a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar. Flying Checkpoints: At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the town of Jannata and searched civilians and vehicles until 12:00. At 19:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Husan and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 13:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur.
- (ii) At 16:20, the Israeli army raided the city of Beit Sahur and patrolled the area until 17:25.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- Attack/Injury: At 16:00, Israeli troops opened fire towards and critically injured a civilian near the settlement of Kiryat Arba' in the old city of Hebron, claiming that he had stabbed 2 Israeli settlers. Israeli troops also arrested the injured civilian.
- <u>Physical Assault</u>: At 13:05, Israeli troops severely beat Mansour Nayef an Najjar in the old city of Hebron, leaving him with contusions. As a result, An Najjar was transported to hospital for medical treatment.

• Flying Checkpoints:

(i) At 14:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the towns of Tarqumiya and Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.

HEBRON

- (ii) At 20:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested a taxi driver.
- Raids/Detentions: At 11:20, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron and searched 1 house. At 18:20, the Israeli army raided the city again, searched 2 houses, and detained as well as interrogated residents.
- Arrests:
- (i) Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up on Al Fawwar junction arrested Mahmoud Feissal Hadeeb.
- (ii) Having injured him, Israeli troops arrested an unidentified civilian near the settlement of Kiryat Arba' in the old city of Hebron.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 21:30, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Adorah threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling along Road # 35.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. Violations of the Ceasefire: (i) The Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards Palestinian togritage in the district of Pafely An Israeli

- (i) The Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory in the district of Rafah. An Israeli UAV also fired a missile on Palestinian territory in the district of Northern Gaza, injuring 4 armed Palestinian individuals.
- (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired 5 mortars towards the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. Air Attack: At dawn on 27 November 2009, an Israeli UAV fired a missile towards an armed Palestinian group east of the town of Jabalya, injuring 4 armed individuals. Of theses, 2 individuals were in a critical health condition.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed.

CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	• Palestinian Attack: In the evening of 26 November 2009, 5 mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow access to dozens of civilians and patients, who had received medical attention at Egyptian hospitals. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies and humanitarian aid. Attack: At dawn on 27 November 2009, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards agricultural land east of the city of Rafah.
