JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem City and prevented civilians from West Bank districts from entering the city of Jerusalem. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikse villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikse village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) The Israeli army set up cement blockades near the new military checkpoint on the entrance of Shufat refugee camp in Jerusalem. The checkpoint will segregate Palestinians in Ras Khamis, Anata town, Shufat refugee camp from Jerusalem and restrict their movement. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction ceased on the Sabbath in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and ‘Ein Samiya villages. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of Um Safa village and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 16:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the Bridge of Attara town and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 01:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of Aroura town and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided Al-Bireh city, detained a military

	<p>officer called Amjad Muhareb and delivered notification to three civilians called Majd Ibrahim Azayzeh, Ahmad Salim Soufan, and Mohammad Fawzi Qaraan to report to the Israeli military intelligence. The Israeli army retreated at 03:00.</p> <p>(ii) At 04:15, the Israeli army raided Al-Jalazon refugee camp, stormed into 1 civilian home, and arrested 1 civilian.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrests: The civilian arrested in Al-Jalazon refugee camp is called Bilal Ramadan Shehadeh. • Temporary detention: At 07:55, Israeli forces detained the police man Bdar Al Khatib at Jaba checkpoint, he was released later. • Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased on the Sabbath in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Flying Checkpoint: At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the village of Faqou'a and searched civilians and vehicles. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00. • Raids: At 16:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled The village of Al-Aqaba.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road.</p> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army increased restrictions on Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Flying Checkpoints: At 19:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of the town of Beit Lid And searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: At 09:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the suburb of Shweiki in the city of Tulkarem. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route ceased on the Sabbath the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: <p>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.</p> <p>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</p> • Flying Checkpoints:

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of the village of Izbet Al-Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 14:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of Habla tunnel (southern entrance of the city of Qalqilya) and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 18:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Jeet and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 21:00, the Israeli army set up two flying checkpoints on the entrances of the town of ‘Azzun and Izbet Al-Tabib, impeded traffic on Qalqilya-Nablus Road and retreated at 23:00. (v) At 21:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint between the town of ‘Azzun and Kafr Thulth and searched civilians and vehicles. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased on the Sabbath in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood. (ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (iii) At 18:00, Israeli forces intensified its restrictions on civilian movement on Huwara checkpoint impeding the free flow of traffic. • Flying checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:30, The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of town of Fourik and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 09:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of the village of Bourin and searched civilians and vehicles.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (iii) At 10:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of the village of Qousin and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 12:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the Al-Maslakh area and searched civilians and vehicles. The checkpoint was set up again at 14:40. (v) At 15:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the town of Beita and searched civilians and vehicles. (vi) At 15:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Yitma and searched civilians and vehicles. (vii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Salem and searched civilians and vehicles. (viii) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of Yitzhar settlement north of the town of Huwara and searched civilians and vehicles. (ix) At 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Dear Sharaf (on Nablus-Tulkarem Road) and searched civilians and vehicles. (x) At 21:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Orta and searched civilians and vehicles. (xi) At 00:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Deir Sharaf and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: At 01:00 on 26 November 2011, the Israeli army raided the village of Burqa and delivered 4 notifications to report to the Israeli intelligence to Muntaser Ahmad Salah, Doya' Abdel Fattah Youssef Salah, Bassam Mohammad Rida, and Ahmad Ihsan Seif.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the northern entrance to Bruqin town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (iii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army increased restrictions on Zatara checkpoint, obstructing the free flow of traffic. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Brouqin and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 14:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between the town of Kaf Hares and the village of Hares and searched civilians and vehicles. • Wall Construction: Wall construction ceased on the Sabbath in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al 'Auja village with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to 23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint while searching the surrounding area. (ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the

	<p>junction to Al-‘Auja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Ein Al-Dyok (northern entrance to the city of Jericho), and searched civilians and vehicles and 20:00. • <u>Arrests:</u> At 11:50, the Israeli army stationed at Al-Hamra checkpoint arrested 1 civilian called Ameer Imaddin Dweikat from Nablus.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al-Nashash junction and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 18:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Jenata and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Nahalin and searched civilians and vehicles.. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (1) At 02:40, the Israeli army raided Al-Azzah refugee camp and stormed into the house of Fatima Ahmad Ali Al-Hmouz (a released prisoner) and handed her a notification to report to the Israeli military intelligence. The Israeli army retreated at 03:40. (2) At 06:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Batir and arrested 1 civilian. • <u>Attacks:</u> At 19:25, the Israeli army near the village of Al-Jabaa fired tear gas bombs toward a group of Palestinian labourers trying to prevent them from entering Israel, and injured 1 labourer. • <u>Arrests:</u> The civilian arrested in the village of Batir is called Ra'fat Mahmoud Said Abu Khreish. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction ceased on the Sabbath northwest of Beit Jala town.
Hebron	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall

	<p>construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village. (v) Since 15 October 2011, the Israeli army has been blocking two entrances 9Al-Maqbara and Qitaat Al-Arba'een) leading to Beit 'Ummar with cement blocks. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of the town of Al-Thahiriyyeh and searched civilians and vehicles (ii) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction of the village of Zeef and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Sammou' and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 17:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of Nabi Nousa area (on Hebron-Bethlehem Road) and searched civilians and vehicles. (v) At 18:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the entrance of the town of Edna and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 03:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit 'Ummar and arrested 3 civilians, including 1 child. (ii) At 03:20, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron stormed into 1 civilian home and handed over to Bara' Ramadan Abu Rmouz a notification to report to the Israeli military intelligence. • <u>Arrests:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 23:00, the Israeli army arrested in the old city of Hebron 1 civilian called Bara' Ramadan Abu Rmouz. (ii) The 3 civilians arrested in the town of Beit 'Ummar are Sayyed Mohammad Mahmoud Awad, 16, Rami Ibrahim Khaled Sabarna and Munib Mujahid Khaled Sabarneh, • <u>Demonstrations:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:40, Palestinian and international civilians held a sit-in in protest of the demolition of a mosque east of the town of Yatta. (ii) At 13:00, Palestinians and international supporters set out on a march on the agricultural land near Karmi Tzur settlement in protest of settler violence. The Israeli army fired tear gas bombs and declared the area a military zone. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction ceased for the Sabbath in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town .

<p>ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011. • The Israeli army breached ceasefire and fired missiles on Central Gaza and Khan Younis and opened fire from navy boats toward fishermen.
<p>NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing was partially opened for humanitarian cases, foreign journalists, employees of international organizations, businessmen, and passengers travelling through Al-Karama Crossing..
<p>GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. • Attacks: On 26 November 2011, Israeli navy boats opened fire intensively at fishing boats in Gaza.
<p>CENTRAL GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Air Attacks: On 27 November 2011, an Israeli drone fired missiles at a training site of Palestinian militants west of the refugee camp of Nseirat.
<p>KHAN YOUNIS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Air Attacks: On 27 November 2011, Israeli combat crafts fired missiles targeting a nursery north-west of the city of Khan Younis.
<p>RAFAH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. • Rafah (<i>Al 'Awdah</i>) Crossing was partially open for humanitarian cases and the crossing of students and visa holders.. • Sufa Crossing is closed. • Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was closed.
