JERUSALEM	Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandia checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) Israeli forces continue to close the entrance to Shofat refugee camp with cement blocks, which obstructs the free flow of traffic in Ras Khamis, Ras Shihadeh and Salam neighbourhoods in Anata and Shofat refugee camp. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim.
	Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	 Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. Flying Checkpoint: At 11:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Attara bridge. At 12:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Taybeh junction. At 15:00 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Nabi Saleh. Raids: At 14:35, Israeli forces raided Betunia.
	• Attack: At 15:50, Israeli forces positioned at Betunia checkpoint fired teargas

	Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area west of 'Abud town
	in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-

	• <u>Closure of Main Road</u> : The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.
	• <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> At 08:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Zabuba village.

	for civilians living behind the Wall.

	special permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians
	living behind the wall.
	• Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in
	the area surrounding Jubara village According to an Israeli High Court decision,
	the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
	• <u>Closure of Roads</u> : (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of
	(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.
	(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i> ,
	the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to

	(i) At 18:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzoun.

At 18:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jit village junction. (ii) At 19:50Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Hija village (iii) junction. At 21:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jinssafout village (iv) iunction. **QALQILYA** At 22:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrances of Azzoun (v) and Izbet Al-Tabib. Raid: At 10:20, Israeli forces raided Al-Nabi Elyas village and stormed several car (i) repair shops. (ii) At 15:15, Israeli forces raided Jayyous, detained and interrogated several residents from inside a coffee shop and fired teargas grenades towards several children, alleging that they threw stones; they also withdrew at 16:00. At 16:10, Israeli forces raided Azzoun village, stormed several barracks used (iii) for agricultural purposes belonging to Fahima Al Shiekh, who was injured during the raid; he was later hospitalised. **Wall Gates:** (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the (ii) village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in Kafr Lagef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement: in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement: and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement and between Azzoun Atma and Oriniet settlement.. **Closure of Main Roads:** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Agraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Oabalan and the village of Osrin. The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the (ii) southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. **Checkpoints:** Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on (i) **NABLUS** Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00 At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross (ii) between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. At 13:10, the Israeli army increased restrictions at Shave Shomron checkpoint (iii) and impeded the free flow of traffic. (i) At 00:45, Israeli forces raided Balata refugee camp in Nablus. At 02:50, Israeli forces raided Osirin village, detained 5 residents including 3 (ii)

	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two
	detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
	(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to
	Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years,
	and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of
	traffic.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army increased its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and
	impeded the free flow of traffic.

	(i) At 12:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Al-
SALFIT	Dik.
	(ii) At 20:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Harres village,
	searching civilians and vehicles.

	(i) At 15:40, Israeli forces raided Kafr Al-Dik until 16:40.
	(ii) At 15:55, Israeli forces raided Qarwat Bani Hassan until 17:00.
	(iii) At 16:20, Israeli forces raided Burqin until 16:40.
	(iv) At 01:50, Israeli forces raided Al-Zawya, stormed 3 homes and served Khadir
	Qadus, Ibrahim Qadus and Sami Radad summons to Israeli intelligence.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area north of Deir Istiya
	town southeast of the illegal settlement.
	• Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between
	Jericho city and Al-Oja village with cement blocks.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> :
	(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up
	along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to
JERICHO	residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area.
	(ii) Israeli forces continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on
	the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho
	District and others with access permits.
	• Flying Checkpoints: At 21:20 and again at 00:10, Israeli forces set up a flying
	checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho city until 01:25.

	area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.

	(i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq
	Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition
	to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues
	to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables
	market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
	(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the
	Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall
	construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them
	access to the area.
	Closure of Main Roads:
	Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil
	villages.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling
	along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as
	detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
	(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to
	the entrance to Al-Simiya village
	(v) Since 15. 10. 2011, Israeli forces closed two entrances leading to Beit Ummar
	town.
	• Flying Checkpoints:

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00. Israeli forces broke the cease fire agreement by raiding and opening fire towards Al-Shoakeh neighbourhood in addition to Israeli naval vessels opening fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Rafah.

	• <u>Attack:</u> At Dawn November 27 th 2011, Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Rafah.
