WEST BANK

Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the occupied city of Jerusalem and Al Agsa Mosque, and prevent civilians from other districts from entering the city, except those possessing Israeli permits.
- On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order (ii) # S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall.
- The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian (iii) access to a hill located in an area between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa.

Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall (ii) section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to occupied Jerusalem city.

Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem.

- Raid: At 00:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Beit Surik and patrolled the area.
- Arrest: On 29 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested in the village of Beit Safafa the civilian Bassam Farouq Al Omari.
- **Settlement Activity:** On 29 November 2010, the Israeli Planning Committee of occupied Jerusalem municipality approved the construction of 130 housing units in an area located between the settlement of Gilo and the village of Beit Safafa south of occupied Jerusalem city, which follows the land occupied in 1967.

Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall (ii) gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira,

JERUSALEM

	Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village, Safa village and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. Flving Checkpoints: At 16:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Atara town and impeded civilian access. At 16:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the town of 'Abud and searched civilians and vehicles. At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Ramallah and the village of Rafat. At 23:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Beit 'Or At-Tahta. Raids: At 10:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Beit 'Or At-Tahta, arrested a civilian and withdrew at 14:00. At 12:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Turmus'ayya, arrested a civilian woman and withdrew at 13:00. Attack: At 09:20, the Israeli army fired steel coated metal bullets, stun grenades and tear gas bombs towards a number of children who allegedly threw stones towards the bypass road near the town of Beituniya. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested in the village of Beit 'Or At-Tahta the civilian Omar Rasheed Yunis Sulaiman. The Israeli army arrested in the town of Turmus'ayya the civilian woman Samar Mousa Issa Hamed. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud, in the periphery of the settlement of Ofarim and north of the villages of Al Lubban Al Gharbi and Rantis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to 'Arraba town, east of the settlement of Dotan. Raids: At 09:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kafr Dan. At 11:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Abu Da'if, searched 4 houses and withdrew at 12:30. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint, allowing civilian access from 06:00 to 22:00.

TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the town of Kafr Al Labad and the village of Shofeh and the road between the villages of Shofeh and Izbat Shofeh. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarm-Nablus main road. Flying Checkpoint: At 08:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Lid and searched civilians and vehicles until 09:20. Raids: At 11:15, the Israeli army raided and combed the area of Al Khalayel in the village of Kafr 'Abbush. At 14:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Saffarin. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flving Checkpoints: At 08:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Izbat At-Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles until 09:15. At 17:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Al Funduq and searched civilians and vehicles. At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of An Nabi Elias and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 10:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Hajja, set up a flying checkpoint at its entrance, patrolled the area and withdrew at 11:00. At 11:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al Funduq. At 17:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr Qaddum, served summon to the university student Shadi Jawad Abdulateef 'Ubaid to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency and withdrew at 18:10. At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun, searched 6 houses, arrested a civilian, detained the civilians Marwan Zaki Radwan and his daughter Shadha and released them at 05:40. Arrests: At 01:25 on 29 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians during a raid on the city of Qalqiliya as reported in the previous report. They are Ubaid Isam Kamel Zammari and Nidal Ahmad Kamel Zammari. On 29 November 2010, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians from the city of Qalqiliya and the town of Kafr Thulth while inside Israel because they do not have entry permits. They are Hashem Hatem

Abdulkareem Abu Khadr and Abdulqader Adnan Abdulqader Shawahneh.

(iii) The Israeli army arrested in the town of Azzun the civilian Dia' Nizar Ibrahim Saleem.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and search civilians, including students, with a detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Ar-Rasha and prevent the access of its inhabitants. The Israeli army only allows the passage of students to their schools outside the village through Habla town gate, while allowing the passage of civilians through gate # 109.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues on land belonging to the village of Kafr Laqif, north of the settlement of Karni Shomron, on land belonging to the village of Immatin, northeast of the settlement of 'Amano'el, and east of the town of Kafr Thulth near the settlement of Ma'aleh Shomron.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only from 07:00 until 02:00.
- (ii) Awarta commercial checkpoint is open for civilians from 05:00 until 20:00 and on Friday from 05:00 until 15:00.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction leading to the village of Deir Sharaf (on Nablus Tulkarm main road) and searched civilians and vehicles until 11:30.
- (ii) At 10:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of Asira Ash Shamaliya. Again at 20:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 21:10.
- Raid: At 23:35, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and patrolled the area until 05:30

NABLUS

SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, and continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrances of 2 side roads between the village of Marda and its agricultural land. As of 12:00 on 14 November 2010, the Israeli army allowed the opening of the northern entrance to the city of Salfit (that has been closed for 7 years) and allowed the access of passenger buses only. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara checkpoint and impede civilian access. Flying Checkpoint: At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the settlement of Ari'el, on the road leading to the northern entrance to the city of Salfit, stopped a number of passenger buses, forced civilians to get off the buses, detained the civilian Sabri Ahmad As Sawwaf and released him following DCO intervention. Raids: At 11:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr Ad-Dik and served notices for demolishing a house belonging to the civilian woman Nawal Ali Ahmad and an agricultural room belonging to the civilian Said Taher Mustafa under the pretext of not being licensed and because they are located in area C that falls under Israeli control. At 01:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Bruqin, searched a house and arrested a civilian. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested in the town of Bruqin the civilian 'Obaidan 'Adnan Abdulrahman Samarah. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area north of the town of Deir Istiya (southeast of the settlement of 'Amanu'el).
JERICHO	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at al-Hamra checkpoint and allow civilian access from 06:00 until 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja and allow access only to civilians holding Jericho and Jordan Valley IDs and those with permits. Flying Checkpoint: At 06:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Marj Na'jeh and searched civilians and vehicles.
ВЕТНГЕНЕМ	Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.

- (ii) As of 15 September 2007, the Israeli army continues to prevent civilian access, pursuant to military order # 07/02, to 22 *dunum* area confiscated according to military order # 07/31 to establish a crossing point in the area of Al Mazmuriya between the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, the sideway east of Beit Fajjar town and the agricultural road that is located between the town of Taqu'a and the village of Khirbet Al Baq'a.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction leading to the village of Dar Salah (the eastern entrance to Beit Sahur city) and searched civilians and vehicles until 10:55.
- (ii) At 09:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An-Nashash junction (the southern entrance to Bethlehem city) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction leading to Kfar Etzion settlement, on Bethlehem Hebron main road, and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Ma'sara and served notices for demolishing a mosque that was built 10 years ago (under the pretext of building an additional room that was attached to the mosque) and 2 houses belonging to the civilians Mahmoud Ahmad Zawahreh and 'Awad Hasan Muhammad Zawahreh.
- (ii) At 01:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Husan and searched a house.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khadr and Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.

• Closure:

HEBRON

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruit and vegetable market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # 09/06 closing the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuating those inside it and preventing civilians from

accessing it. This is the land seized for military purposes for the construction of the Wall.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the towns of Yatta and As-Samoa'.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Tarusa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Halhul town. Again at 18:20 and at 07:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 19:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Zif and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 20:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction leading to the village of Turrama and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 20:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Kahil and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At dawn on 29 November 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of Ar-Ramadin and arrested a civilian.
- (ii) At 09:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron. Again at 18:25, the Israeli army raided the area, occupied the roof of a house and converted it into a military post and withdrew at 19:00.
- (iii) At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the area of Al Baraka in Yatta town and searched a house.
- <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested in the village of Ar-Ramadin 65-year-old civilian Ali Khalil Az-Zagharneh.

• Detentions:

(i) At 12:20, the Israeli army in As-Salaymeh area, east of Al Ibrahim Mosque in the old city of Hebron, detained 3 civilians (building contractors working with Hebron Construction Committee) under the pretext of carrying out construction work in a closed military zone. They are: Abdullateef Muhammad As-Salaymeh; Ja'far Taleb Az-Zarou; and Muhammad Majed Ash-Sheikh.

- (ii) At 15:10, the Israeli army detained near Al Ibrahim Mosque in the old city of Hebron 10-year-old child Mahmoud Raed As-Salaymeh, who allegedly threw stones, and released him following DCO intervention.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 15:10, a group of Israeli settlers protected by the Israeli army gathered in the area of At-Tubeiqa, which follows the town of Halhul, and withdrew after civilians confronted their attacks.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, in the periphery of Eshkolot settlement southwest of Adh Dhahiriya town and between southwest of Arab Ar Ramadin village and the village of Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the Israeli army declared a unilateral ceasefire. In the meantime, armed Palestinian groups declared a one-week-long ceasefire. Meanwhile, the ceasefire was extended until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire is holding despite the end of the specified period.
- The Israeli army violated the ceasefire by raiding Palestinian territory and opening fire in the districts of Northern Gaza and Rafah. Israeli navy boats also opened fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea in Khan Yunis district.

NORTHERN GAZA

- <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for the passage of critically ill civilians, foreign journalists, the staff of international humanitarian organizations, traders, businessmen and civilians travelling through Al Karama Crossing who have prior coordination.
- Raid: At 09:30, the Israeli army, including 4 armored vehicles and 2 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided 10 meters inside Palestinian territory, east of Beit Hanun town, opened fire intensively towards agricultural land and besieged a number of civilians working in the area.
- Attack: In the morning of 29 November 2010, the Israeli army opened fire from its locations on the Green Line, in the periphery of Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing, north of Beit Hanun town, towards a number of participants in a demonstration against the buffer zones near the border fence where the Israeli army denies farmers and land owners access and cultivation.

GAZA

- Closure of Crossing Points:
- (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is partially open for the transport of wheat and fodder.

	(ii) Al-Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing for fuel transport is closed since 04 January 2010 by an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YOUNIS	• <u>Attack</u> : In the evening of 29 November 2010, Israeli navy boats opened fire intensively towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea opposite Khan Yunis city beach.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al Awdah) Crossing is open for the departure of civilian patients, students and visa holders, and for the entry of civilians, patients who received treatment at Egyptian hospitals, a batch of Makkah pilgrims and an assistance of 50 tons of meat. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for the entry of food, humanitarian assistance and a quantity of diesel for the electricity plant. Raid: At dawn on 29 November 2010, the Israeli army, including a number of armored vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircrafts, raided 300 meters inside Palestinian territory in the land of Ash Shoka town, located east of Rafah city, and opened fire intensively towards agricultural land and civilian houses while leveling an area of land.
