<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces continue to close the entrance to Shofat refugee camp with cement blocks, which obstructs the free flow of traffic in Ras Khamis, Ras Shihadeh and Salam neighbourhoods in Anata and Shu’fat refugee camp.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> On the morning of November 29<sup>th</sup> 2011, Israeli forces raided Al-Ziaayem village and demolished 4 residential barracks owned by a Bedouin family for allegedly not having proper licensing.</li> <li>• <b><u>Detentions:</u></b> On November 29<sup>th</sup> 2011, Israeli forces detained Mohammad Al-Abssi (17 years) after storming his home in Jerusalem's Silwan neighbourhood. Israeli forces also summoned Ammar Al-Abssi to Israeli intelligence.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> At 09:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Beit Lid junction.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:55, Israeli forces raided Thannabah neighbourhood in Tulkarem, Kafr Labad and Faroun villages, served a notice to halt construction on the home of Zuhair Hanoun for allegedly not having proper licensing.</li> <li>(ii) At 12:40, Israeli forces raided Shoufa village and took photographs of several homes.</li> <li>(iii) At 18:00, Israeli forces raided Tulkarem and Tulkarem refugee camp and took photographs of several homes and withdrew at 19:00.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Temporary Detentions:</u></b> At 15:00, Israeli forces positioned at the wall gate near Nazlat Issa village detained Mahmmoud Masoud and Mahmmoud Hussein and summoned them to Israeli intelligence.</li> <li>• <b><u>Demonstrations:</u></b> At 11:00, family members of detainees demonstrated in front of the International Committee of the Red Cross offices in Tulkarem in solidarity with detainees and to demand their release from Israeli prison.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> Passage through the wall gates was restricted to civilians granted special permits, undercutting access to education and health services for civilians living behind the wall.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.</li> </ul>
<b>QALQILYA</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of ‘Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 15:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jit village junction.</li> <li>(ii) At 18:00Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Kafr Qaddoum village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:20, Israeli forces raided Ras Tireh and Al-Dhabaa villages and served a notice to demolish a barracks owned by Mohammad Manassra .</li> <li>(ii) At 16:30, Israeli forces raided Kafr Qaddoum village.</li> <li>(iii) At 16:30, Israeli forces raided Jayyous village .</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction continued in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement and between Azzoun Atma and Oriniet settlement..</li> </ul>

<b>BETHLEHEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.</li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> At 10:45, Israeli army continues to restrict access at the "Container" checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic and at 22:55, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint and denied entry of residents and reopened it at a later time.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 19:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Fajjar</li> <li>(ii) At 20:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Nashash junction (at the northern entrance of Bethlehem).</li> <li>(iii) At 22:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Um Raqaba area in Al-Khader.</li> <li>(iv) At 22:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Dar Salah village at the eastern entrance of Beit Sahour.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:35, Israeli forces raided Beit Fajar, served confiscation orders to residents and barred them from farming their land for allegedly not having permits to enter the land; they withdrew at 12:00.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.</li> <li>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. ## GAZA STRIP

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>ALL DISTRICTS</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 30 October 2011 at 22:00.</li> <li>• Israeli forces broke the cease fire agreement by raiding and opening fire towards Central Gaza, North Gaza and Khan Younes in addition to Israeli naval vessels opening fire towards Palestinian fishermen and detained 10 fishermen off the shores of Gaza.</li> </ul>
