All Districts	From 24:00 on 27 September 2011, Israeli forces have imposed a total closure in the occupied West Bank for the duration of the Jewish New Year holiday. Hence, Palestinians, including permit-holding labourers, have been banned from entering occupied East Jerusalem and Israel proper, with the exception of diplomatic mission and international NGO's as well as humanitarian and medical cases who have previous coordination. This closure is in effect until 24:00 of 01 October, 2011.

	market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.

# (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.
- (v) The Israeli army continues to close the bypass road leading to agricultural land near road #35& 60 North of Hebron with dirt mounds.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the Beit Anoun village junction, searching people and cars.
- (ii) At 10:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Umar town, searching people and cars.
- (iii) At 11:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the Shalala Street in Hebron's Old City, searching people and cars.
- (iv) At 13:45, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the Halhul bridge, searching people and cars.
- (v) At 14:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance to Sair town, searching people and cars.
- (vi) At 15:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint between Sikka and Al-Majd villages, searching people and cars.
- (vii) At 15:25, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the road connecting Al-Thahiriya town and Al-Ramadin village, searching people and cars.
- (viii) At 16:25, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance to Ithna town searching people and cars.

#### • Raids:

- (i) At 09:25 and again at 19:30, Israeli forces raided Hebron city.
- (ii) At 15:25, Israeli forces raided Beit Awa town.
- (iii) At 16:25, Israeli forces raided Ithna town.
- **Physical Assault:** At 09:25, Khalil Moussa Dbabsh (17 years) was admitted to a hospital after being assaulted by Israeli forces while he was inside Israel.
- Access to places of worship: Since 29. 09. 2011, Israeli occupation forces have barred Palestinian worshipers from reaching the Ibrahimi Mosque in Hebron's Old City (for the second consecutive day), reportedly to enable Israeli settlers to celebrate and perform rituals on the occasion of "the Jewish New Year".

#### • Settler Violence:

- At 17:55, Israeli settlers in Al-Fahs area in Hebron [H-2 area] fired at Bassem AL-Shawrawi's car, destroying the car's front windows. **Demonstrations:**
- (i) At 10:00, Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Beit Umar town to protest against land confiscation and closure of roads as well as the prevention of farmers from accessing their land. They also condemned a plan

- to pave a new new settlement road at the expense of the town's land (8 km long and 160 m wide; from the junction of "Kfar Etzion" settlement and going through Arroub refugee camp and Beit Ummar town); occupation forces fired teargas canisters at demonstrators upon arrival at the entrance to the town; several suffered from teargas inhalation.
- (ii) At 12:30, Palestinian and internationals protested near "Susia" settlement against land confiscation and attacks by settlers in the area; Israeli forces fired stun and teargas grenades towards the demonstrators; two Palestinian activists and an international suffered from teargas inhalation.
- (iii) At 13:30, Palestinians rallied in Hebron City in solidarity with the detainees in Israeli prisons and to demand their release.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town.
