WEST BANK

Closure:

- (i) Israeli forces continue to intensify their restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city and prevented worshipers under the age of 50 from conducting prayers at Al-Aqsa mosque compound.
- The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in (ii) the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.

Closure of Main Roads:

- The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the (i) entrance to Jaba' village.
- The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to (ii) Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.

Checkpoints:

- (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city and at 06:00, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint impeded the free flow of traffic.
- (ii) On September 19th 2012, Israeli forces closed Ras Khamis checkpoint near Shu'fat camp and impeded the free flow of traffic in order to construct the wall.
- **Raid:** On the evening of September 30th 2013, Israeli forces raided Al-Isawiya village and detained 4 residents including 3 children.

Detention:

- (i) On September 29th 2013, Israeli forces detained 3 residents including 2 children: Rashid Rashq (14 years old), Abdallah Joulani (14 years old) and Adli Laban in Jerusalem.
- (ii) At dawn on October 1st 2013, Israeli forces detained Imad Al-Abassi after storming his home in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem.
- (iii) Israeli forced detained 4 residents including 3 children: Ibrahim Klieb (15 years old), Yusef Muhiesin (17 years old), Mohammad Dirbas (17 years old) and Mahmoud Hawashiya in Al-Isawiya village.
- Attack: At 16:20, Israeli forces positioned at Al-Ram junction fired rubber coated steel bullets, stun and tear gas grenades towards several residents for alleged stoning.
- **Assault on Places of Worship:** On the morning of September 30th 2013, Israeli

(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Slewahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya

SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. On 15.04.2012, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian which was closed since the year 2000 and prevented access from 08:00 until 09:20. Since 11:00 on July 30th 2012, Israeli forces have closed two roads leading to Abu Nasar and Qatan Al-Jama' located in western area of Deir Istiya with cement blocks. Checkpoints: At 17:05, Israeli forces continue to intensify their restrictions at Za'tara Al-checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic until 21:00. Flying Checkpoint: At 09:40, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Harris village. Physical Assault: At 09:15, Israeli forces positioned at Za'tara checkpoint assaulted Hussein Al-Bazzour (a National Security Officer) leaving him hospitalised with contusions. Wall Construction: Wall construction continued in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement.
JERICHO	 Checkpoints: Israeli forces continue to intensify its restrictions at Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus District. Raid: (i) At 10:00, Israeli forces raided Al-Jiftlik village, took photographs of a flower garden as they stormed it then withdrew at 11:00. (ii) At 05:30, Israeli forces raided Al-Oja village, stormed and searched a home. Temporary Detention: On the evening of September 30th 2013, Israeli forces positioned at Allenby crossing temporarily detained Ahmad Salah, a resident of Bethlehem as he was returning from Jordan then released him after summoning him to report to Israeli Intelligence for questioning.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israel army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 dunumes of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road between Um Tuba and Al-Jass; a road between Um Tuba and Khilat Nu'man: a road between Um Tuba and the wall; a road between Al-Khas village and the wall; the 2 by pass roads located south of Al-Walaja; a road between Talita Qumi and Nazlat Al-Sider in Beit Jala; the eastern road of Al-Khader; the road between Al-Khader and Beit Jala; the road between Al-Khader and road #60 which lead to the eastern neighbourhoods of Bethlehem; a road leading to Wadi Rahal, and a road east of Beit Fajjar town with dirt mounds.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road leading to "Newe Daniyyel" settlement and agricultural land in Al-Khader; a road between Um Tuba and Wadi Al-Hums: Wadi Fukin, Al-Jaba, the Green Line; a road between Za'tara and a detour road, and a road between Taqou and Khirbet Al-Deir with cement blocks.
- (iii) Since August 2nd 2012, Israeli forces closed a road leading to Beit Jalla.
- (iv) Since May 8th 2013, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Carmisan area in Beit Jalla and Al-Walaja with a steel gate and barbed wires.
- (v) Since June 3rd 2013, the Israeli army closed the road connecting Nihalin and road 60 with dirt mounds.
- (vi) Since 11:30 on June 8th 2013, the Israeli army closed a road leading to 50 acres of agricultural land in Wadi Salem area in Al-Khadr with dirt mounds.
- (vii) Since 13:20 on September 29th 2013, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Beit Jalla and Al-Khadr with dirt mounds.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> At 19:35, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Al-Khadr until 19:50.

Attack:

- (i) At 15:30, Israeli forces positioned in Um Al-Rakaba area in Al-Khadr fired rubber coated steel bullets and tear gas grenades towards several residents for alleged stoning.
- (ii) At 17:05, Israeli forces positioned at the entrance of Taqou' fired tear gas grenades towards several residents for alleged stoning.

• Wall Construction:

- (i) Wall construction continued in North West of Beit Jala town.
- (ii)On May 1st 2103, an Israeli court ordered the halt of wall construction near Betar village.
- (iii) On July 21st 2013, Israeli courts ordered the halt of construction of the wall in Al-Carmisan area in the west area of Beit Jalla.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the
- (iii) Since 17:40 on September 22nd 2013, Israeli forces closed checkpoints and steel gates leading into the old city of Hebron, installed several checkpoints around the city, stormed and searched several homes after an Israeli soldier was shot and killed by an unidentified individual and as a result left 3 schools closed.

HEBRON

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Thahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along

- the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to e to Al-Simiya village, the southern entrance of Al-Samou' and the entrance of Beit Annun with cement blocks.
- (v) Since July 25th 2012, Israeli forces closed the road connecting Al-Safa and Al-Dirat and also closed the entrance of south Yatta with cement blocks.
- (vi) Since December 27th 2012, Israeli forces closed the west entrance of Swiesiya village which connects Yatta and Al-Samou' village with cement blocks.
- (vii)At 22:40, Israeli forces closed the entrance leading to Sa'ir village with Cement blocks.
- (viii) Since 09:45 on September 23rd 2013, Israeli forces closed the main road leading to "Haji" settlement and impeded the free flow of traffic.

• Flying Checkpoint:

- (i) At 08:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint Kharsa village junction.
- (ii) At 12:10, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at Al-Fuwar junction.
- (iii)At 16:20 and again at 18:45, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the north entrance of Hebron.
- (iv)At 18:45, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint in Wadi Qabbun area in North Hebron.
- (v) At 18:45, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint in Jabal Al-Rahma area located in the old city of Hebron.

• Raid:

- (i) At 10:40, Israeli forces raided Al-Shuyukh.
- (ii) At 22:00, Israeli forces raided Wadi Al-Joz area located in Bani Na'im.
- (iii)At 01:10, Israeli forces raided Beit Awa, stormed and searched several homes during which they damaged furniture owned by Fawzi Al-Situori, detained 4 residents then withdrew at 06:00.
- <u>Detention:</u> Israeli forces detained 4 residents: Omar Masalmeh, Thaer Masalmeh, Mohammad Al-Sayouti and Samir Masalmeh in Beit Awwa.
- <u>Temporary Detention:</u> At 09:20, Israeli forces positioned in the old city of Hebron temporarily detained 4 children: Sultan Abu Sineneh (14 years old), Sharif Rajabi (12 years old), Alaa Al-Rajabi (14 years old) and Muhammad Burkan then released them at a later time.
- <u>Attack:</u> At 16:30, Israeli forces positioned at Al-Fuwar junction fired rubber coated steel bullets and tear gas grenades towards several residents for alleged stoning then detained and assaulted Mohammad Al-Najjar (15 years old) releasing him at 19:10.
- <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continued in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town for Jewish holiday.

GAZA STRIP

At 21:00 on November 21st 2012, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. On November 14th 2011 Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against passing beyond the mark and on November ALL 24th 2012, Israeli forces imposed floating marks of 6 miles and on March 21st 2013 **DISTRICTS** re imposed fishing restrictions of 3 miles. Israeli forces broke the ceasefire agreement by firing tank artillery shells and live ammunition from their positions behind the Green Line towards North Gaza and as a result killed a resident. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for the passage of critical patients, journalists, NGO staff, businessmen and passengers travelling abroad through Al-Karama crossing with previous coordination. Attack: At 19:15, Israeli forces opened fire and fired tank artillery shells broke the ceasefire agreement by firing tank artillery shells and live ammunition from their **NORTHERN** positions behind the Green Line towards 2 residents near the border fence in east **GAZA** Beit Hanun and as a result killed 1 resident and detained another resident. **Killing:** Israeli forces opened fire and fired tank artillery shells towards the border fence in Beit Hanun and killed Hawashil Al-Najara, a resident of Al-Maghafra in Gaza. **Detention:** Israeli forces detained Subhi Abu Thiayab, a resident of Al-Buriej camp near the border fence in east Beit Hanun. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the (i) Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. **GAZA** Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010. (ii) the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open for the entry of residents and tourists. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for the passage of **RAFAH** critical patients, journalists, NGO staff, businessmen and passengers travelling abroad through Al-Karama crossing with previous coordination, diesel fuel, construction material for Internationally funded projects and

allowed 40 truckloads of humanitarian goods, 20 Truckloads of

construction material and 10 truckloads of construction steel.
