All Districts DISTRICT

• At 24:00 on September 27th 2011, Israeli army imposed a closure on all districts in the occupied West Bank for the duration of the Jewish New Year. During the closure, civilians and workers holding permits are banned from entering occupied East Jerusalem and Israel; exceptions include foreign diplomats, internationals, humanitarian cases, and medical emergencies. The closure is in effect until 24:00 on 01 October.

JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) On September 212011, the Israeli army increased restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City and prevented civilians from gathering to support the decision to apply for UN membership. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. Checkpoints: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

NABLUS	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-				

Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

• Flying checkpoints:

- (i) On the morning of October 1st 2011, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Iraq Burin village, prevented residents of other cities and villages, local and international press and peace activists from entering as they declared the location a closed military zone
- (ii) At 09:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Fourik town and impeded the free flow of traffic.
- (iii) At 20:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Deir Sharaf junction, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 20:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Sarra village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 00:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Deir Sharaf village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.
 - **Raids:** At 07:50, Israeli forces raided Oablan village.

• <u>Settler Violence</u>:

- (i) At 12:30, an Israeli settler set an olive grove on fire, located between Huwarra and Ainbous village, destroying dozens of olive trees before Palestinian fire fighters could reach the site..
- (ii) At 13:05, a group of Israeli settlers raided Deir Sharaf village and set an olive grove on fire, destroying several olive trees.
- (iii) At 15:30, a group of Israeli settlers raided Beit Furik village and stoned Salah Nasayir's home ..
- (iv) At 17:35, a group of Israeli settlers under the protection of Israeli forces raided agricultural land in Burin village, during which Israeli troops fired tear gas grenades towards civilians and village residents who resisted the settler attacks.
- (v) On the evening of October 1st 2011, a group of Israeli settlers entered agricultural land in Madama village and destroyed several olive trees.

• Closure of Main Roads:

SALFIT

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
- (ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
- Checkpoints: At 08:45 and again at 20:25 the Israeli army increased restrictions

	(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
	(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.

to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues
to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables
market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.

(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Ithna and Beit Kahel villages.
- (ii) At 20:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance near Aqla Al-Fouqa village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 20:20 and again at 07:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al-Nabi Younis village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- **Raids:** At 19:10, Israeli forces raided Hebron city
- <u>Attack:</u> At 19:05, Israeli forces positioned at a checkpoint south of Al-Ramadin village near the Green Line opened fire towards a civilian vehicle transporting labourers.

• Settler Violence:

- (i) At 09:10, a group of Israeli settlers raided agricultural land in Khirbet Shweikeh village and destroyed several olive trees owned by Musa Samara.
- (ii) At 14:50, a group of Israeli settlers under the protection of Israeli forces stormed Rajab Abu Aisha's home, during which Israeli troops detained 2 civilians, including a child, for blocking the settler attack.
- <u>Detentions:</u> Israeli forces detained Fawaz Abu Eisheh and 14 year-old Saed Abu Eisheh during a settler raid into Hebron.
- <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 15:00, Palestinians and international peace activists marched towards civilian agricultural land near "Karmi Zur" settlement to protest settler violence, Israeli settlement activity and land confiscation to allow Palestinian farmers to work on their land. Israeli forces closed the entrance to the village and pronounced it to a closed military zone.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town because of the Jewish Sabbath holiday.

Hebron

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 August 2011 at 21:00. Ceasefire Violation: Israel broke the ceasefire agreement by launching an airstrike at 2 civilians and critically injured a Palestinian gunman in northern Gaza.
NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for humanitarian assistance, journalists and international access. Aerial Assault: On the evening of October 1st 2011, Israeli drones launched missiles towards Palestinian civilians in Biet Hanoun, injuring 2 civilians and critically injuring a Palestinian gunman.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for the import of humanitarian assistance, cooking gas, 27 tons of livestock feed and construction material for internationally supported projects Al Awda crossing – Rafah is open for patients, students and civilians with permits.

Update on Detainees

On 01.10.2011, Palestinian prisoners began a phased hunger strike, which initially starts with a strike 3 days per week (Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays). If Israeli prison authorities do not respond to the prisoners' demands in relations to ending the solitary confinement and other punitive measures, the prisoners plan to continue on an open-ended hunger strike.
