WEST BANK

Closure: (i) On September 23 rd 2011 the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City and prevented civilians under the age of 50 from other Palestinian districts from entering the city to perform Friday prayers at Al-Aqsa mosque Compound and positioned hundred of Israeli troops and police officers near Palestinian protest sites marching in solidarity with the President's decision to apply for membership at the United Nations. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the present Decision and Decision area and Decision separating the present Decision area and Decision area.

(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • Checkpoints: Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. • Attacks: Israeli forces fired rubber-coated steel bullets and teargas towards demonstrators in Ras Al-Amoud neighbourhood who protested against the closure of a main road in the neighbourhood during the Jewish holiday; Israeli forces also detained a Palestinian. • Detentions: Ismael Abu Madde was detained in Ras Al-Amoud • Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayyem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. Raids: At 09:35 – 10:00, Israeli forces raided Al-Bireh city.

RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	 (i) At 12:30, Palestinian, Israeli and international peace activists marched in Ni'lin and Bil'in villages to protest the construction of the wall; subsequent clashes with Israeli troops resulted in the suffocation of several activists from teargas inhalation. (ii) At 12:30, Palestinian, Israeli and international peace activists marched in Al-Nabi Saleh village to protest settler attacks, land confiscation and settlement construction. Israeli forces set up flying checkpoints at the village entrance, preventing protesters from reaching the demonstration site; confrontations ensued and Israeli troops fired rubber-coated steel bullets and teargas grenades towards the protesters, many of whom were treated for teargas inhalation. • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. Flying Checkpoints: At 15:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint abetween Zebda and Daher Abed villages, searching civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 22:30, Israeli forces raided Qabatiah and Marka village. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village. Checkpoints: At 10:50 the Israeli army restricted Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic. Raids: Israeli forces raided Balah town and Izbat Abu Khumish Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. Flying checkpoints: At 10:00 & 23:00 Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzun village, searching civilians and vehicles. At 15:20, Israeli forces setup a checkpoint at the Jett village junction , searching people and cars. Raids: At 23:45, Israeli forces raided Kufor Qaddum village. Settler Violence: At 22:25, Israeli settlers rallied at the entrance to Azzun town

	and stoned Palestinian cars passing through the main road.
	• Demonstrations: At 12:10, Palestinian and international Peace activists marched
	in Kufor Qaddum village to protest against the construction of the wall, during
	which confrontations took place between civilians and Israeli troops
	• Wall Gates:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to
	search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the
	village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows
	residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at
	the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students
	to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqif village north of
	Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement;
	and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement.
	Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-
	Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the
	settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the
	village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the
	village of Osarin.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the
	southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and
	Qaryut.
	• Checkpoints:
	(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on
	Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it
	is open between 07:00 and 02:00 only to residents of the neighbourhood.
	(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross
	between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All
	vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and
NABLUS	ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.
	• Flying checkpoints:
	(i) At 12:00, Israeli forces setup a checkpoint at the Qusin village junction,
	searching people and cars.
	(ii) At 13:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Furik
	village, searching civilians and vehicles.
	(iii) At 17:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Salem
	village, searching civilians and vehicles.
	• Raids:
	(i) At 12:00, Israeli forces raided Qisra village.
	(ii) At 22:00, Israeli forces raided Beit Furik.
	• Settler Violence:
	(i) At 09:30, a group of armed Israeli settlers, protected by Israeli forces,
	attacked farmers harvesting olives in an area between Beita town and
	Awarta village.
	(ii) At 20:55, a group of Israeli settlers stoned Palestinian villagers present
	between Agraba and Beita towns.
SALFIT	Closure of Main Roads:

	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two
	detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
	(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to
	Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.
	• Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to close Za'tara checkpoint, obstructing
	the free flow of traffic.
	• Flying Checkpoints: At 09:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between
	Kifel Harres and Harres villages, searching civilians and vehicles.
	• Settler Violence:
	(i) At 12:25–13:10, a group of settlers raided Al-Maaser area in Qana valley and
	reportedly excavated the area.
	(ii) At 15:20, a group of settlers assaulted Hussan Muhamed Al-Haj (65 years)
	and his son Jihad, while they were picking their olive harvest. The Jamain
	residents suffered bruises from the assault.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir
	Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.

	• <u>Closure of Main Road</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Ouija village with cement blocks.

	• Checkpoints:
	(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up
	along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to
IEDICHO	residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area. And from 23:20 to
JERICHO	23:50, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint while searching the surrounding
	area.
	(ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the
	junction to Al-Ouija village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho
	District and others with access permits.
	• <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> At 14:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Al-
	Oja junction, searching civilians and vehicles.
	• Closure:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the
	exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of
	the village.
	(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from
	accessing or staying on 22 dunums of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya
	area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
	• <u>Closure of Main Roads</u> : The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi
	Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to
BETHLEHEM	Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al
	Jaba villages.
	• Flying Checkpoint:
	(i) At 14:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance to Adbdyah
	town, searching people and cars.
	(ii) At 14:35 – 15:20, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint near Deir Salah village,
	searching people and cars.
	• Raids: At 14:30, Israeli forces raided Um Al-Rakaba neighbourhood in Al-Kahder
	town.
	• Settler Violence: At 09:00, a group of Israeli settlers sprayed an unidentified
	material in lands owned by Nasser Al-Badan. Subsequently, 10 sheep died while

grazing in the land

• Demonstrations:

- (i) At 12:50, Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Al-Massara village in protest against the construction of the wall; Israeli troops assaulted several protesters while preventing the rally from reaching its destination. Mahmoud Zawahra and Mahmoud Ala Al-Din were injured.
- (ii) At 13:30, Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Al-Walajeh village to protest against the on-going land razing and Wall construction; Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the village and fired teargas canisters at the protestors, causing several to suffer from teargas inhalation; Israeli forces also temporarily detained 7 protestors: Hamza Mohamed Sarasrah, Mohamed Ahmed Al-Jawarish, Amer Mohamed, Hossam Mohamed Odeh, Mohamed Bashir Yousef, Monther Amira and Mazen Al-Azzeh.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.
- (v) The Israeli army continues to close the bypass road leading to agricultural land near road #35& 60 North of Hebron with dirt mounds.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:50, Israeli forces setup a checkpoint at the northern entrance to Hebron City, searching people and cars.
- (ii) At 09:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Anoun village.
- (iii) At 15:00, Israeli forces set up 3 checkpoints at the entrances to Bani Naim village, Al-Fahs area south of Hebron City, and Khalet Al-Mayeh north of Yatta town, searching people and cars.
- (iv) At 20:30, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance to Al-Nabi Younes and detained a civilian.

• Raids:

(i) At 13:25, Israeli forces raided Al-Thahriah town.

Hebron

- (ii) At 17:45, Israeli forces raided the Hneineh area in Doura village and stormed a coffee shop.
- <u>Physical Assault:</u> At 21:30, Ayed Al-Adra, a resident of Yatta town, was admitted to hospital after Israeli forces assaulted him while he was inside Israel.

• **Demonstrations:**

- (i) At 12:00, Palestinian and international peace activists protested marched near Susia and Um Neir villages, east of Yatta town to protest settler attacks and land confiscation; Israeli forces assaulted protestors with rifle butts, injuring Mohamed Al-Najjar and Louay Al-Jubour..
- (ii) At 12:30, Palestinian and international peace activists marched in Beit Umar town in solidarity with Palestinian detainees inside Israeli prisons and against land confiscation and closure of roads. Confrontations erupted between Israeli forces and protestors, leading to the injury of 3 protestors while a Palestinian journalist and Italian solidarity activists suffered bruises after being struck with a teargas grenade. Several protestors also suffered from teargas inhalation and two were detained.

• **Detentions:**

- (i) Hassan Saada was detained at the entrance to Al-Nabi Younes.
- (ii) Abdallah Al-Salibi and Mohamed Awad were detained in Beit Ummar.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Dhahiriya town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups **ALL** announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed **DISTRICTS** on 10 August 2011 at 21:00. Israeli naval vessels opened fire and fired artillery rounds towards Palestinian fishing boats off the coast of northern Gaza Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for humanitarian assistance, journalists and international access. **NORTHERN** Attacks: On 07.10.2011, Israeli naval vessels opened fire and fired artillery **GAZA** rounds towards Palestinian fishing boats off the coast of Al-Sudaniah area, West of Beit Lahia **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the (i) **GAZA** Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, (ii) the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. **Closure of Crossing Points: (All Closed)** Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed Sufa Crossing is closed. **RAFAH** Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed Al Awda crossing – Rafah is closed. •
