	(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city. Access would be restricted to residents of the area as well as to civilians holding permits through crossings and gates defined in the military order.			
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.

	 Arrests: (i) The Israeli army arrested Abdul Razeq Sa'id Khassib in 'Arura town. (ii) The Israeli army arrested an unidentified civilian in Beituniya town. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of Dotan settlement. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flving Checkpoints/Detention: At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Karnei Shomron settlement and searched civilians and vehicles. At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Immatin village and searched civilians and vehicles. At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al Funduq village, searched civilians and vehicles, detained Khaled Husni Khamis Haroun, a Palestinian National Security officer, and released him at a later time. Land Levelling: At 10:00, the Israeli army levelled land on a hill opposite Karnei Shomron settlement in Jinsafut village. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.

Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit (i) Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Nagura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed (i) on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross (ii) between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. **NABLUS** At 11:55, the Israeli army closed Huwwara checkpoint and denied (iii) civilian access, while they were arresting a civilian. At 12:05, the Israeli army reopened the checkpoint. **Flying Checkpoints:** At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to (i) Beit Furik town and searched civilians and vehicles. At 12:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to (ii) 'Iraq Burin village and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 17:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Beit Iba town and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:00. At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to (iv) Shavei Shomron settlement on the Nablus-Jenin main and searched civilians and vehicles Raid: At 06:00 on 09 October 2010, the Israeli army raided Qabalan town and patrolled the area until 08:40. Arrest: Israeli troops positioned at Huwwara checkpoint arrested Ahmed Mustafa Sha'awit. Settler Violence: At 09:00, a group of Israeli settlers cut down a number of olive trees belonging to Qasem 'Eid near Burin village. Settlers also attacked and attempted to set fire to a bulldozer, while it was working on

civilian land. Later, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.

- (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 *dunums* (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; and a rural road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to Bethlehem city) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 18:40, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the eastern entrance to Beit Sahur city and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:35.
- (iii) At 20:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Harmala village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 10:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al Jab'a village.
- Arrest: At 13:00, Israeli troops arrested 17-year-old Abdullah 'Awwad Abdullah 'Ubayyat while he was grazing sheep near Kisan village, allegedly for locating a knife in his possession.
- <u>Detentions</u>: At 16:55, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained a bus transporting civilians to Hebron city, after they had celebrated a wedding party in Ramallah city. A civilian quarrelled with an Israeli soldier after the latter harassed his wife. At 17:40, Israeli troops allowed the bus to cross.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S on the closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani village.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.

HEBRON

(iii) The Israeli army continues to close the road between Al Karmil and At Tuwani villages; all roads leading to Road # 60; and the road connecting Surif town to Al Jab'a village.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Idhna town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 18:25, and again at 07:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 18:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Abu al 'Asja village and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 14:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Hebron city.
- (ii) At 21:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled As Sarra and Imreish villages.
- (iii) At 22:10, the Israeli army raided Khirbet al Baqqar village and searched a house.
- (iv) At 00:45, the Israeli army raided Sa'ir town and arrested a civilian.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 13:10, a group of Israeli settlers from Sham'a settlement threw stones at civilian vehicles, causing damage to a vehicle belonging to Younes ar Rujoub.

• Demonstrations/Attacks/Detentions:

- (i) At 14:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Beit Ummar town in protest against settler violence. Protestors demanded that civilians be enabled to access and tend their land near Karmei Tzur settlement. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and participants, during which the Israeli army injured a number of protestors as a result of tear gas inhalation. Israeli troops arrested three civilians and detained four international peace activists.
- (ii) At 16:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the old city of Hebron. Protestors demanded that Ash Shuhada' Street be reopened and civilians allowed freedom of movement. Israeli troops obstructed the demonstration and prevented participants from accessing the Old Municipality square and Ash Shuhada' Street, after having declared these areas a closed military zone. Therefore, protestors gathered in Az Zahid area near the Old Municipality square.

• Arrests:

- (i) The Israeli army arrested Mahdi Saber Mousa Jaradat in Sa'ir town. The Israeli army arrested three civilians in Beit Ummar town:
- (ii) Jihad Khalil Abu Mariya;
- (iii) Zeid Mohammed 'Awadh; and
- (iv) Hussein Shihdeh as Salibi.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire continues to hold. Violations of the Ceasefire: (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire on civilian houses and property in Northern Gaza district. (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired a mortar towards the Green Line. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is closed. Raid/Air Patrol/Attack: At 22:30, the Israeli army, including several

armoured vehicles covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory north of Beit Lahiya town and opened intensive fire on agricultural **NORTHERN** Arrest: In the evening of 09 October 2010, the Israeli army arrested an **GAZA** unidentified child, after he had crossed the Border Fence north of Beit Lahiya town in an attempt to gain access into Israel. Air Patrol: In the evening of 09 October 2010, Israeli combat helicopters and reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over Northern Gaza district. Palestinian Attack: At 22:30, a mortar was fired towards the Green Line. **Closure of Crossing Points:** (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. **GAZA** (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. CENTRAL Events not reported. **GAZA KHAN YUNIS** Events not reported. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (i) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open to allow patients, students, and (ii) civilians holding visas to depart the Gaza Strip. Access was also **RAFAH** allowed to civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals. Sufa Crossing is closed. (iii) (iv) Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed.
