JERUSALEM	Closure:  (i) The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.  Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.  Checkpoints:  (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.  (ii) On the morning of October 13th 2011, Israeli forces closed Shofat checkpoint, impeded the free flow of traffic, and fired teargas grenades towards demonstrators who marched in solidarity with Palestinian detainees, who have been on a hunger strike for the past 17 days. The checkpoint was later reopened.  Raid: At 16:30, Israeli forces raided, Kafr Aqab, during which confrontations ensued between residents and Israeli troops.  Reitlement Activity: Israeli occupation authorities approved the construction of 2610 illegal housing units in the illegal settlement "Givaat Hamatos". 	• Raids: At 01:40, Israeli forces raided Nablus city, searched several homes, detained 3 civilians includind a child and withdrew at 03:00.
	• <u>Detention:</u> The Israeli army detained Ahmad Eweidha (17 years), Anas Dweikat and Abdallah Dweikat during their raid into Nablus.
	• <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 00:30, a group of Israeli settlers stoned Bashir Jenini's home on the outskirts of Beit Fourik village.
	• <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 17:30, family members of detainees and activists rallied in Nablus in solidarity with Palestinian detainees, who have been on an openended hunger strike for the past 17 days to protest mistreatment, including
	solitary confinement.
	• Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
	(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to
	Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years,
	and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of
	traffic.

	Wall Construction: Wall construction was halted northwest of Beit Jala town because of the Jewish Sabbath Holiday.
	• Closure:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition
	to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
	(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the
	Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall
	construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.
	Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil
	villages.

#### Hebron

- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.

- (i) At 08:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al-Arroub refugee camp, searching civilians and vehicles.

- (iii) At 11:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on Halhul bridge, searching civilians and vehicles.

- (v) At 17:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Khursa village junction, fired sound and teargas grenades towards several children.

- <u>Assault on Property:</u> At 20:15, Israeli forces removed a Bus stop near Um Al-Rish village.
- <u>Settler Violance</u>: At 15:45, a group of Israeli settlers beat Ahmad Khalil, a Beit Ummar resident, as he was tending his sheep near "Karmei Tzor" settlement, leaving him hospitalised.
- **<u>Demonstrations</u>**: At 12:00, family members of detainees rallied in Hebron City in solidarity with Palestinian detainees who have been on an open-ended hunger strike for the past 17 days.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town because of the Jewish Sabbath holiday.

Detainees Report

Palestinian detainees continue their open-ended hunger strike, now on its 17<sup>th</sup> day, in protest against Israeli mistreatment, particularly the policy of solitary confinement.
