	(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Za'tara

In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
	(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

	• Home Occupation: At 21:45, Israeli forces occupied the rooftop of Fayez Khalaf
	located in Al-Zahed neighbourhood in the Old City of Hebron and converted it
	into a military outpost.
	• <b>Demonstrations:</b> At 12:10, Palestinian and international peace activists marched towards agricultural land in Beit Ummar to protest against settler violence and preventing farmers from farming their land, during which Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the village entrance; confrontations ensued between demonstrators and Israeli troops, who fired teargas grenades towards demonstrators, where Yousef Abu Maria sustained hand fractures while he was being pursued by Israeli forces; several protesters suffocated as a result of teargas inhalation

Detainees Report

➤ On October 15<sup>th</sup> 2011, Palestinian detainees are on hunger strike for the 19<sup>th</sup> consecutive day in protest of Israeli abuse of Palestinian prisoners
