	• <u>Closure of Main Road</u> : The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan.

TULKAREM	Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route has resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court
	decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.

#### **Closure of Roads:** (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second *Intifada*. (ii) the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. Flying checkpoints: At 10:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Jayyous and (i) Azzoun, searching civilians and vehicles. At 17:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jit village junction, (ii) searching civilians and vehicles. **Raids:** At 00:20, Israeli forces raided Kafr Qaddoum village. Detention: At 08:50, Israeli forces detained Mai Sulaiman, a resident of Asla **QALQILYA** village, as she attempted to access her olive groves behind the wall to collect the harvest, claiming she did not have the required entry permit. Sulaiman was released at 10:15 after the office security coordination intervened. **Wall Gates:** The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to (i) search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the (ii) village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in Kafr Lagef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma'ale Shomron settlement. **Closure of Main Roads:** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin: and the detour road between the town of Oabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. **Checkpoints:** Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on (i) **NABLUS** Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and, 02:00 At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross (ii) between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. At 16:40, the Israeli army closed Shavi Shomron checkpoint and impeded (iii) the free flow of traffic. Flying checkpoints: (i) At 09:50 and again at 20:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Nablus and Asira al Shimaliya, searching civilians and vehicles.

	(ii) At 17:00 and again at 22:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Sarra village junction (on the main road connecting Nablus and Qalqilya) searching civilians and vehicles.

	Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two
	detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.
	(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to
	Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years,
	and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to restrict access at Za'tara checkpoint
SALFIT	and impeded the free flow of traffic.
	• Raid: At 06:00, Israeli forces raided Ein Al-Jadida area, west of Kafr Al-Dik until
	06:40
	• <u>Detention:</u> At 12:45, Israeli troops positioned at the northern entrance of Salfit,
	temporarily detained Ali Harim, Hussien Zuhdi, and Abed Al-Munem Darwish

	• <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 13:20, a group of Israeli settlers raided olive groves in Deir
	Istiya and prevented several civilians from collecting their olive harvests
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya
	town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
	• <u>Closure of Main Road</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between

- (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 *dunums* of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.
   Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages.
  - <u>Checkpoint:</u> At 09:15Israeli army continues to restrict access at the "Container" checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic.

#### • Flying Checkpoint:

- (i) At 08:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al–Nashash junction, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Batir village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 15:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Taqou village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
- (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.
- (v) Since October 15<sup>th</sup> 2011, the Israeli army closed two secondary roads leading to Beit Ummar with cement blocks.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 07:40 on October 18<sup>th</sup> 1011, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Sair, searching civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al-Fawwar camp, searching civilians and vehicles.

# (iii) At 16:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Halhoul, searching civilians and vehicles.

(iv) At 17:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Nabi Younis (along the main road connecting Hebron with Bethlehem), searching civilians and vehicles.

- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town.

### **GAZA STRIP**

ALL DISTRICTS	At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 August 2011 at 21:00.
NORTHERN GAZA	Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open for humanitarian assistance, journalists, merchants and international access.
GAZA	Closure of Crossing Points:     Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.     Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.

# Detainees Report

• On October 18th 2011, Israel released 477 Palestinian detainees in a prisoner swap agreement with Hamas in exchange for the Israeli soldier Gilad Shalit. 27 female detainees were among those released and 41 detainees were exiled abroad.
