DISTRICT EVENTS

#### WEST BANK

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and to prevent civilians from other districts from entering the city, only allowing access to civilians holding special permits.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding Jerusalem city. Access would be restricted to residents of the area as well as to civilians holding permits through crossings and gates defined in the military order.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.

# • <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

- Attack: In the evening of 25 October 2010, Israeli troops fired rubber-coated steel bullets as well as tear gas and sound grenades on civilians in Silwan neighbourhood in Jerusalem city, ostensibly for throwing stones.
- Raid: On 25 October 2010, the Israeli army raided Beit Duqqu village and arrested a civilian.
- <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested Nour Isma'il Ahmed Dawoud in Beit Duqqu village.

#### • Detentions:

- (i) At 12:45, Israeli troops detained 12-year-old Mohammed Jamal Gheith in Ras al 'Amud neighbourhood in Jerusalem city and released him at a later time.
- (ii) On 25 October 2010, Israeli troops detained Mr. Hatem Abdul Qader, Palestinian Official in charge of the Jerusalem File, in Jerusalem city. Mr. Abdul Qader was then relocated to and interrogated at the Al Muscobiya (the 'Russian Compound') Detention and Interrogation Centre. Israeli troops released Mr. Abdul Qader later on a bail of NIS 20,000 (approximately USD 5,550).

#### • Wall Gates:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.

Israeli troops also detained Jihad Mohammed Abdul Latif Suleiman, a Palestinian National Security officer, and released him at a later time.</li> <li>At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Jinsafut village, searched civilians and vehicles, detained Sa'd Mohammed Abdul Rahman Salman, a Palestinian Police officer, and released him at a later time.</li> <li>At 20:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to Jit village and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>Raid: At 00:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Jayyus town.</li> <li>Settler Violence: At 18:50, a group of Israeli settlers stole olive crops on civilian land in Kafr Qaddum village.</li> <li>Wall Gates: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. #### • Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting Jericho and Nablus districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district of the Jordan Valley area.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al 'Auja village along Al-Mu'arrajat road connecting Jericho and Ramallah districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho district as well as to others holding access permits.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 19:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Road # 90 in the centre of Al 'Auja village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 19:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to Jericho city. At 23:30, the Israeli army set up another checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles until 01:20.

#### • <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
- (ii) According to Military Order # S/02/07, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 *dunums* of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order T/31/07.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; and a rural road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: At 16:55, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access

### • Flying Checkpoint: At 10:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction and searched civilians and vehicles.

- Raid/Attack: At 20:15, the Israeli army raided Husan village, patrolled the area, fired sound grenades on civilians, and withdrew at 00:10.
- <u>Destruction of Property</u>: At 17:10, the Israeli army demolished a barracks in Al Jab'a village, allegedly because it had been built without the required construction licence and located in Area C, which is under full Israeli control
- Attacks on Property: At 13:25, the Israeli army distributed notices for the
  cessation of building seven houses and a livestock barracks in Al Maniya
  village, claiming that they were being built without the required
  construction licences and located in Area C, which is under full Israeli
  control
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of Beit Jala city; in the area surrounding Al Walaja village; and east of Efrat settlement.

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S on the closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani village.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the road between Al Karmil and At Tuwani villages; all roads leading to Road # 60; and the road connecting Surif town to Al Jab'a village.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit 'Einun village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles at the northern entrance to Hebron city along Road #35.
- (iii) At 17:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Ar Ramadin village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 18:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 18:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Idhna town and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Raids/Physical Assaults:

- (i) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided Surif town and searched a number of civilian houses, using Police dogs. Israeli troops also severely beat Mohammed Mahmoud Ghuneimat as well as his sister-in-law and excavated the ground of a house belonging to Advocate Hamed Ghuneimat. Additionally, Israeli troops arrested Mohammed Ghuneimat's sister-in-law and withdrew at 14:00.
- (ii) At 16:45, the Israeli army raided Hebron city, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the city again, arrested a civilian, and served a summons on Ma'moun Sa'di Burqan to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (iii) At 00:40, the Israeli army raided Nuba and Beit Ula towns.

#### **HEBRON**

(iv) At 04:00, the Israeli army raided Beit Ummar town and arrested five civilians, including two brothers and a child.

#### Arrests

- (i) In the morning of 25 October 2010, Israeli troops arrested Yasser Mahmoud al Jamal in the old city of Hebron.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested Sana' Shihdeh Abdul Wahhab Ghuneimat, a female civilian, in Surif town.
- (iii) The Israeli army arrested Ala' Sa'di Burgan in Hebron city.

The Israeli army arrested five civilians in Beit Ummar town:

- (iv) Yousef Ibrahim Sabri 'Awadh, 17 years old;
- (v) Hamzeh Shihdeh Younes Sabarneh;

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009.
