<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at checkpoints set up at entrances to the city of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque.</li> <li>(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued military order # S/02/09 closing the seam line area, an extension of the Wall.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the villages of Biddu and Beit Iksa.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba’.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al Bareed in Jerusalem city from the town of Ar Ram.</li> <li>(iii) On 28 May 2010, the Israeli army closed the eastern entrance to the village of Beit Iksa, which leads to the city of Jerusalem, by an iron gate, and told civilians to pass through Qalandiya checkpoint to Jerusalem city.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoint:</u></b> The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and only allows holders of Jerusalem IDs to access the city of Jerusalem.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoint:</u></b> At 22:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the checkpoint leading to Al Khan Al Ahmar (on Jerusalem – Jericho main road). Again at 02:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raid:</u></b> At 19:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Ar-Ram town.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area of al-‘Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of al-Jib village, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, south of Beit Hanina village, and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu’fat refugee camp.</li> </ul>

Civilian access is denied during the mentioned period without a special permit in order to prevent the weekly demonstrations against the Wall.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of Ein Yabrud and Dura Al Qari’.</li> <li>(ii) At 20:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Deir Abu Mash’al.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Mazari’ An Nubani.</li> <li>(ii) At 03:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Silwad and arrested a civilian.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrest:</u></b> The Israeli army arrested in the town of Silwad the civilian Rami Ruhi As-Salhi.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend west of the towns and villages of ‘Abud and Bil’in, and in the areas of al-Midyah to Ni’lin and Ni’lin to Deir Qaddis.</li> </ul>

Consequently, the Israeli army intervened and evacuated the settlers from the area at 13:20.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>

The Israeli army withdrew at 21:40.</li> <li>(iii) At 00:35, the Israeli army raided the village of Yasuf, searched 2 houses, served notices to 2 civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency and withdrew at 01:00.</li> <li>(iv) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Farkha and Khirbet Qeis.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.</li> </ul>

Again at 19:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(ii) At 09:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Beit Sahur and the village of Dar Salah.</li> <li>(iii) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Ash Shawawra.</li> <li>(iv) At 13:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area Osh Grab east of Beit Sahur city.</li> <li>(v) At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area of Um Rukba south of Al Khadr town.</li> <li>(vi) At 19:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Husan village and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Beit Jala. Again at 23:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area.</li> <li>(ii) At 21:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al Khadr town.</li> <li>(iii) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Taqu'a.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Arrest:</u></b> At 20:50, the Israeli army arrested in the area of An Nafaq near the town of Beit Jala 16-year-old child Raghd Raed Shamroukh under the pretext of finding Molotov cocktail bottles in his possession.</li> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 04:50 on 04 September 2010, an Israeli settler driving his vehicle with high speed on Road # 60 near Al Khadr town ran into an agricultural tractor carrying 7 civilians, including 3 children, traveling to work in their farmland which belongs to the town. As a result, 4 civilians sustained injuries and fractures.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of the town of al-Khadr and Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.</li> </ul>
<b>HEBRON</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to al Laban Market by iron boards. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.</li> <li>(ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

- (iii) At 20:20, the Israeli army closed the old city of Hebron after setting up checkpoints at its entrances and prevented civilians from entering or exiting it. The Israeli army also prevented civilians from reaching Al Ibrahimi Mosque to perform the 'Esha' and Taraweeh prayers, and imposed curfew on the neighborhood of Tal Ar-Rumeida under the pretext of securing a settler procession.
- **Closure of Main Roads:**
    - (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp; the village of At Tuwani as well as the entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
    - (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
    - (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.
    - (iv) As of 01 September 2010, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to Wadi Yaqin Road which leads to the town of Bani Na'im.
    - (v) At 16:00, the Israeli army closed with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Abda.
  - **Flying Checkpoints:**
    - (i) At 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction. Again at 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint and searched civilians and vehicles.
    - (ii) At 19:00, the Israeli army set up 6 flying checkpoint on the overpass leading to Halhul town, between the city of Hebron and the town of Dura, at entrances to the towns of Beit Kahil, Idhna and Adh Dhahiriya and on the junction leading to the village of Khursa.
    - (iii) At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of At-Tabaqa and opened fire indiscriminately.
    - (iv) At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of An Nabi Yunis near Halhul town (on Hebron – Bethlehem main road) and searched civilians and vehicles.
    - (v) At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Deir Samit and searched civilians and vehicles.
  - **Raids:**
    - (i) At 10:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Samit and patrolled the area.
    - (ii) At 11:25, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura and patrolled the area. Again at 20:20, the Israeli army raided the area where confrontations took place with civilians while searching a number of houses. As a result, the civilian Fadi 'Asir was injured.



	<p>(iii) At 15:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, fired stun grenades towards civilians after setting up a flying checkpoint and patrolled the area. Again at 19:20, the Israeli army raided the city, set up a flying checkpoint (for the second time) and occupied the roof of a house near the entrance to Ash Shuhada' Street and converted it into a military post.</p> <p>(iv) At 19:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Khursa and occupied the roof of a house and converted it into a military post after detaining its residents in 1 room.</p> <p>(v) At 00:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Tarqumiya and patrolled the area.</p> <p>(vi) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the towns of Yatta and Adh Dhahiriya and patrolled the area.</p> <p>(vii) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Al 'Asal and patrolled the area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 20:20, a group of Israeli settlers attacked a number of civilians near Al Ibrahim Mosque in the old city of Hebron.</li> <li>• <b><u>Demonstration:</u></b> At 13:00, a mass demonstration, with the participation of international peace activists, set about on civilian farmland that belongs to the town of Beit Ummar, located near the settlement of Karmi Tsur. The demonstration was in protest at settler attacks and to enable civilians to farm their land. The Israeli army obstructed the demonstration to prevent it from reaching civilian land near the settlement after designating it a closed military zone.
