JERUSALEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continue to increase its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City for Friday prayers. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandia checkpoint. Detention: At 13:50, Israeli forces positioned at Qalandiya checkpoint detained Issa Al-Jabarin a resident of Hebron. Expulsion: On the evening of September 6th 2012, served Al-Sheikh Najah Barikat, the head of Al-Aqsa mosque compound a notice expelling him from entering Al-Aqsa mosque for a period of 6 months. Obstruction of Places of Worship: On the morning of September 6th 2012, Israeli setters under the protection of Israeli forces raided the vicinity of Al-Aqsa mosque compound and provoked worshipers. ALL DISTRITS	 On 14.12.2011, Israeli forces placed floating marks 3 miles from Gaza's seashore and warned fishermen against passing beyond the mark. Israeli forces broke the ceasefire agreement by opening fire from their positions behind the Green Line towards Gaza and injured a resident.
