WEST BANK

ANK
 Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order #S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
• <u>Closure of Main Roads</u> : The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya.

	 Flying Checkpoint: At 07:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of 'Atara, searched civilians and vehicles, and impeded civilian access. Raids: At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the city of El Bireh, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beituniya, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested Abdul Hakeem Abdul Raheem Bawatneh in the city of El Bireh. The Israeli army arrested Sami Sameer Mousa Sawalhi in the town of Beituniya. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of 'Abud town and in the arrest of Al Midster to Ni'llin and Ni'llin to Dair Onddia.

JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flving Checkpoint: At 21:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Bir al Basha on the Jenin-Nablus main road and searched civilians and vehicles until 21:45. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Flying Checkpoint: At 09:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Ramin and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qaffin and patrolled the area until 22:10. At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Anabta and arrested 1 civilian. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Baqa ash Sharqiya and arrested 2 civilians (brothers).

	 Arrests: (i) The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Wael Mahmoud Milhem in the town of 'Anabta. The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Baqa ash Sharqiya: (ii) Mohammed Fawzi Khadher Khalaf; and (iii) Hikmat Fawzi Khadher Khalaf. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: At 09:50, and again at 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 14:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of 'Azzun and the village of 'Asla and searched civilians and vehicles. At 16:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint underneath the overpass to the town of 'Azzun on the Qalqiliya-Tulkarem main road and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/Curfew: At 14:15, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun and imposed curfew, allegedly for throwing stones at Israeli settler vehicles travelling along the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road. At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya and served summons to a number of civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the city again and searched 2 houses. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfe Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	• Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the southern entrances to the villages of Qaryut and Duma; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqi; the western entrances to the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh.

- (ii) Beginning at 12:10 on 27 August 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close with an iron gate the western entrance to the village of An Naqura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. It should be noted that the Israeli army had removed the dirt barricade set up at the entrance to the village.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.
- (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

• Raids

- (i) At 20:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al Badhan.
- (ii) At 01:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of 'Asira al Oibliva and Madama.
- (iii) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Sabastiya.
- (iv) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided 'Askar refugee camp in the city of Nablus and searched 1 house.
- <u>Settler Violence/Destruction of Property</u>: At 14:30, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Yitzhar gained access into the villages of 'Asira al Qibliya and 'Urif. In the vicinity of the village 'Asira al Qibliya, Israeli settlers set fire to a number of olive trees. In the village of 'Urif, Israeli settlers demolish a wall of a house under construction as well as damaged 2 civilian vehicles. Consequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from these areas.

• Closure of Main Roads:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.

- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.

•	<u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of

(ii) At 01:10, the Israeli army raided 'Aqbat Jaber refugee camp in the city of Jericho and arrested 2 civilians.

• Arrests:

(i) At 13:40, Israeli troops positioned at a checkpoint set up in the area between the districts of Jericho and Nablus arrested Mohammed Husni Abu Hananeh, a Palestinian National Security officer.

The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in 'Aqbat Jaber refugee camp in the city of Jericho:

(ii) 'Atef Ali Ka'abneh; and

between 06:00 and 22:00.

- (iii) Ahmed Saleh Ka'abneh.
- <u>Palestinian Security Measures</u>: At 15:00, Palestinian security forces handed to the Israeli authorities (through the DCO) 3 Israeli soldiers, who were armed and in the military uniform, after they had been apprehended while they were attempting to gain access into the city of Jericho.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
- (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 *dunums* (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.
- Closure of Main Roads: In addition to detour roads east and south of the village of Al Walaja, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; Talita-Nazlat as Sidr in the city of Beit Jala; Al Wadi Rahhal-the settlement of Efrat; and a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar.

BETHLEHEM

• Raids:

At 19:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Nahhalin and patrolled the area until 21:40.

At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Khadr and patrolled the area until 07:35.

• <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

• Closure of Main Roads:

HEBRON

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to open the iron gate on the Farsh Al Hawa junction to Road # 35, which leads to Tarqumiya Crossing, from 05:00 until 07:00 and from 09:00 until 13:00.
- <u>Injury</u>: Israeli troops opened fire towards and injured Mousa Jamal Dawoud, a resident of the town of Yatta, along the settler bypass road near the town of Yatta. At 02:30, Dawoud was admitted to hospital for medical treatment.

• Raids:

- (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of As Samoa'.
- (ii) At 10:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (iii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Yatta and demolished a one-room lodging belonging to Mohammed Khalil Abu Qubeitah.
- (iv) At 13:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Kharas.
- (v) 21:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
- (vi) At 22:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Ummar and the village of Khirbet Safa.
- (vii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Idhna, searched a number of houses, and arrested 2 civilians.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Idhna:
- (i) Ali Mohammed Ahmed al Jayyawi; and
- (ii) Mohammed Mahmoud Ahmed al Jayyawi.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 18:00, a group of Israeli settlers closed the road leading to the Tal Rumeida neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron. Consequently, the Israeli army reopened the road.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

- At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.
- <u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilians and property in the district of Northern Gaza.

NORTHERN GAZA

- <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated cases and foreign nationals.
- Attack/Injury: In the morning of 09 September 2009, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory east of the town of Beit Hanun, injuring Maysarah Mohammed al Kafarneh.

	• Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling: At 14:30, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and 2 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory north of the town of Beit Hanun. The Israeli army opened fire intensively towards agricultural land and civilian houses as well as levelled farmland. An armed confrontation also took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals.
GAZA	Closure of Crossing Points: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is partially open for transportation of wheat and animal feed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is partially open for transportation of fuel.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	Activities not reported.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies and humanitarian aid.
