The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Since 20:00 on September 4th 2011, the Israeli army closed the entrance to Izbat Shoufat village with dirt mounds and cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to severely restrict Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic. Flving checkpoint: At 09:55, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Led, searching people and cars. At 11:00, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Danhaba. At 21:15, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Jubara village, searching people and cars. At 23:45, Israeli forces set up a checkpoint at the entrance of Qaffin village, searching people and cars. 	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds and cement blocks the
	northern entrance to Bruqin town.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups **ALL** announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 August 2011 at 21:00. **DISTRICTS** Ceasefire Violation: Israel violated the ceasefire by firing artillery shells from their positions at the Green line. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) open for humanitarian assistance, iournalists and international access. **NORTHERN** Israeli Violation: **GAZA** On 11.09.2011 evening, Israeli forces fired 2 artillery shells from their positions at the Green Line towards Beit Lahyiah town. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the (i) Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, (ii) GAZA the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. Israeli Violation: At 07:50. Israeli forces fired artillery shells from their positions at the Green Line towards fields near Kufor Al-Deek Israeli Violation: **Khan Younis** On the morning of 11 September, 2011, Israeli forces fired artillery shells from the Green Line towards fields east of Qarara town and Al-Faraheen **Closure of Crossing Points:** Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially opened for humanitarian assistance, cooking gas and construction material for **RAFAH** international projects.
