<b>JERUSALEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to increase restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city and prevented civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city, except those holding special permits.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikse villages.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikse village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b> At 16:05 and again at 03:30, Israeli forces raided Qalandia refugee camp, searched several homes, detained 3 civilians and withdrew at 05:00.</li> <li>• <b><u>Detentions:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) On September 10<sup>th</sup> 2011, Israeli forces detained Mohammad Al-Sbatien, a resident of Bethlehem while he was in Jerusalem despite having a valid permit to enter the city.</li> <li>(ii) Israeli forces detained Yousef Al Khatib, Samer Mansour &amp; Eyad Nasar during their raid of Qalandia refugee camp.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction has resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za’ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma’ale Adumim.</li> </ul>

<b>QALQILYA</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure of Roads:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoints:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 13:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Qalqilya village, impeded the free flow of traffic while conducting military training. .</li> <li>(ii) At 16:30, Israeli forces setup a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzountown, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 21:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Funduk village, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iv) At 00:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Hija village, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At 09:15, Israeli forces raided an area on the main road connecting Azzoun and Jayous towns and withdrew at 10:15.</li> <li>(ii) At 21:15, Israeli forces raided Jinsafout village.</li> <li>(iii) At 23:15, Israeli forces raided Kufor Qaddum village, searched 2 homes and withdrew at 03:15.</li> <li>(iv) At 01:30, Israeli forces raided Azzoun town, searched 3 homes, detained 3 civilians , including 2 minors, and withdrew at 03:00.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Detentions:</b> Israeli forces detained Abdel Rahman Radwan (15 years), Maher Abu</li> </ul>

	<p>Haniya (14 years), and Mohammad Radwan during their raid into Azzoun town.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Settler Violence:</u></b> At 15:20, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to agricultural land between Jit village and Kufor Qaddum junction, destroying 100 olive trees before Palestinian firefighters could put out the fire.</li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Gates:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Wall Construction:</u></b> Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.</li> </ul>
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b><u>Checkpoints:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. The entrance had been closed for seven years.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Checkpoints:</b> At 10:00 the Israeli army continues to increase restrictions on Zatarah checkpoint, obstructing the free flow of traffic until 24:00.</li> <li>• <b>Flying Checkpoint:</b> At 08:40, Israeli forces set up a flying at the western entrance of Harris village, searching civilians and vehicles until 09:20</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> At 22:00, the Israeli army raided Deir Istiya town, set up a flying checkpoint at the town entrance and withdrew at 23:00.</li> <li>• <b>Wall Construction:</b> Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.</li> </ul>

<b>BETHLEHEM</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Closure:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu’man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</li> <li>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Closure of Main Roads:</b> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu’ town to Khirbet al Baq’a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab’a villages.</li> <li>• <b>Raids:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) At dawn on September 13<sup>th</sup> 2011, Israeli forces raided Breidhaah village and served Khalid Al-Humary a summons to Israeli Intelligence</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Hebron	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Closure:</u></b></li> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.</li> <li>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.</li> <li>• <b><u>Closure of Main Roads:</u></b></li> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.</li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.</li> <li>(iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.</li> <li>(v) At 12:40, Israeli forces closed with dirt mounds a road leading agricultural land on highway 35 &amp; 60 north of Hebron.</li> <li>• <b><u>Flying Checkpoints:</u></b></li> <li>(i) At 08:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Fawar refugee camp, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 21:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Karza village, searching civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>• <b><u>Raids:</u></b></li> <li>(i) At 19:15, the Israeli army raided Beit Ula village, served demolition orders for 7 barracks under the pretext that they were built without proper licensing, giving the owner 45 days to remove them and withdrew at 13:30. The barracks belong to Samir Almiya, Ahmad Almiya, Nimer Almiya, Yousef Almiya, Mohammad Almiya, Fayez Almiya &amp; Mohammad Almiya.</li> <li>(ii) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided Wadi Qabou area in Northern Hebron.</li> <li>(iii) At 09:40, the Israeli army raided Khuras village and searched several homes.</li> <li>(iv) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided Hebron city.</li> <li>(v) At 17:50, the Israeli army raided Dura city.</li> <li>(vi) At 19:20, the Israeli army raided Al-Aroub refugee camp, served 2 demolition orders for homes belonging to Ahmad Jawabra &amp; Mahmoud Abu Maria, that were allegedly built with out proper licensing.</li> </ul>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>ALL DISTRICTS</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 April 2011.</li> <li>• <b><u>Ceasefire Violation:</u></b> Israeli naval vessels violated the ceasefire agreement by opening fire towards Palestinian fisherman off the shores of North Gaza and Gaza.</li> </ul>
