JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On September 16th 2011 the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City and prevented civilians from other Palestinian districts from entering the city to perform Friday prayers at Al-Aqsa mosque Compound. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. (ii) At 07:35, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at Jabaa checkpoint on the main road connecting Jerusalem, Ramallah & Jericho, impeding the free flow of traffic. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:40, Israeli forces raided Anata town, after an Israeli settler vehicle was stoned and crashed into a store. (ii) At 17:50, Israeli forces raided Al-Ram town; confrontations ensued and Israeli forces detained and severely beat a civilian. (iii) At 20:40, Israeli forces raided Qatanna village and clashed with residents, detained 2 civilians, including head of the village council then withdrew at 21:00. (iv) At 23:00, Israeli forces raided Abu Dis town and clashed with residents. • <u>Attack:</u> At 19:00, Israeli forces positioned at Qalandiya checkpoint, fired stun and tear gas grenades towards civilians who allegedly stoned them. • <u>Detentions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces detained an unidentified individual during their raid into Al-Ram town. (ii) Israeli forces detained Hussien Abu Ziyadeh and Ibrahim Howshiyeh during their raid into Qatana village. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu

	<p>Dis town.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction has resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjel village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. • Flying Checkpoints: At 17:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Atara and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:25, Israeli forces raided Silwad town. (ii) At 19:00, Israeli forces raided Jalazoun refugee camp. (iii) At 02:45, Israeli forces raided Betunia town. • Settler Violence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:40, a group of Israeli settlers raided the main road in Al-Jalazoun refugee camp and withdrew after Israeli forces intervened. (ii) At 18:40, a group of Israeli settlers raided the northern entrance to El-Bireh city and stoned several vehicles and withdrew after Israeli forces intervened. • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 18:00, Israeli forces raided Bir Albasha village. (ii) At 00:30, Israeli forces raided Al-Hafira village. (iii) At 04:00, Israeli forces raided Yabad town. • Confiscation of Property: At 18:00, Israeli forces positioned at "Movo Dotan" checkpoint confiscated Palestinian flags and national statehood campaign flag from vehicles passing through the checkpoint. • Settler Violence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:00, a group of Israeli settlers from "Movo Dotan" settlement raided the town of Yabbad, assaulted civilians and withdrew after intervention from Israeli forces. (ii) At 19:40, a group of Israeli settlers raided the vicinity of the abandoned settlement of "Homesh" and set fire to Palestinian vehicles in the area. • Demonstrations: At 10:30, families of Palestinian detainees rallied in front of the International Red Cross in Jenin to demand the release of their family members detained in Israeli prisons express support to Palestine's statehood bid at the United Nations. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.

TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to severely restrict Palestinian access at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 23:00, Israeli forces raided Tulkarem refugee camp . (ii) At 00:50, Israeli forces raided Qaffin, Atil & Anabta villages.. (iii) At 01:05, Israeli forces raided Tulkarem. • Attack on Property: At 15:00, Israeli police officially notified Palestinians that placing the national flag on their vehicles would subject them to fines and penalties. • Settler Violence: At 14:40, a group of Israeli settlers abducted a university student near the Tulkarem-Nablus road and released him at a later time. • Demonstration: At 10:30, families of Palestinian detainees rallied in front of the International Red Cross headquarters in Tulkarem in solidarity with their family members demanding their release from Israeli jails and expressed support for the Palestinian statehood bid at the United Nations. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision, the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. (ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • Flying checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Jit village, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 10:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Qalqilya, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 10:15, Israeli forces raided Habla village. • Settler Violence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:40, a group of settlers set fire to agricultural land located near the wall in northern Qalqilya, destroying 400 olive trees, which belong to the Antouri and Zimari families. . (ii) At 12:50, a group of Israeli settlers raided agricultural land located south of Kufor Qaddum village and withdrew after intervention of the Israeli army. (iii) At 14:35, a group of Israeli settlers raided Kufor Laqef village and raised placards with anti Arab slogans • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector.

	<p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut.</p> • Checkpoints: <p>(i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 but at 18:20, Israeli forces closed the checkpoint, impeding the free flow of traffic.</p> <p>(ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</p> <p>(iii) At 18:25, Israeli forces closed down Huwwara checkpoint as a group of Israeli settlers raided the checkpoint and raised placards with anti Arab slogans and others against the UN membership bid.</p> • Flying checkpoints: <p>(i) At 09:50 and again at 21:40 , Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Madama village junction, searching civilians and vehicles..</p> <p>(ii) At 11:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Salem village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iii) At 14:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction north of Nablus, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iv) At 15:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Yatma village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(v) At 15:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Rujib junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(vi) At 15:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Furik village and impeded the free flow of traffic.</p> <p>(vii) At 15:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint along the road connecting Beit furik and Salem villages, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(viii) At 18:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on Deir Sharaf junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(ix) At 19:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near “Yetzahar” settlement junction north of Huwara village and prevented vehicles from passing through the bypass road near Jit village.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:00, Israeli forces raided Burin village. (ii) At 14:15, Israeli forces raided Orif village and clashed with the residents, injuring Omran Musbah; he was later hospitalized. (iii) At 19:35, Israeli forces raided Sabastiya village. • <u>Attacks On Property:</u> At 10:40, Israeli forces summoned public transportation drivers to Israeli Intelligence headquarters in Huwara, after they transported civilians to participate in the popular rallies in support of the Palestinian membership bid at the United Nation, confiscated their vehicles and fined them. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:40, a group of Israeli settlers near Huawara checkpoint stoned civilian vehicles passing along the main road. (ii) At 14:00, a group of Israeli settlers raided Asira Alqiblia village, stormed Jamal Yousef's home, and set fire to agricultural land. Later on, Israeli forces raided the village and fired stun and tear gas grenades at residents trying to prevent settlers from storming homes; 4 civilians, including a woman and a journalist suffocated as a result of tear gas inhalation; the forces and settlers withdrew at 16:25. (iii) At 14:25, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to agricultural land in Al-Sawia village, destroying several olive groves. (iv) At 14:25, a group of Israeli settlers positioned near a girl school in Orif village then withdrew with the help of Israeli forces. (v) At 19:50, a group of Israeli settlers took positions on the outskirts of Beit Umrin village near a girls' secondary school and Atef Obeidi's home then withdrew under protection of Israeli forces. (vi) At 21:40, a group of Israeli settlers stoned Palestinian vehicles near Jamien village. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> At 09:00, Palestinian students from Yatta town marched in support of Palestines statehood bid at the United Nations. Israeli forces confronted the march with teargas grenades; several students suffered from suffocation as a result.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> At 11:30 Israeli army closed Zatarra checkpoint, obstructing the free flow of traffic and reopened it at a later time. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Harresvillage, searching civilians and vehicles until 15:05. (ii) At 19:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Kifel Harres and Harres villages. (iii) At 21:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Deir Ballout and Rafat villages. • <u>Raids:</u> At 13:10, Israeli forces raided Deir Istyia village until 15:00. • <u>Detention:</u> At 20:05, Israeli forces positioned at the Zatarra checkpoint detained

JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Ouja village with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 18:00 Israeli forces restricted access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area.. (ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits. • Flying Checkpoints: At 17:15, 23:45, 01:50, 05:35, and again at 06:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho city, searching civilians and vehicles until 06:55. • Raid: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:20, Israeli forces raided Oja village. BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. • Flying Checkpoint: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 18:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on the main road leading to Al-Khader town and detained a civilian. (ii) At 18:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Nashaah junction, searching civilians and vehicles. • Detentions: Israeli forces detained Ali Hamra during their raid into Al-Khader town. • Settler Violence: At 17:35, a group of Israeli settlers positioned near Al-Jaba road stoned Palestinian vehicles • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.

Hebron	<p>(ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village. (v) At 12:40, on September 13th 2011, the Israeli army closed the bypass road leading to agricultural land near road #35& 60 North of Hebron with dirt mounds. (vi) At 11:00, Israeli forces closed an entrance to Karma village with dirt mounds. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 11:30 and again at 17:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Beit Ummar, impeded the free flow of traffic and shut the iron-gate to the city's entrance, village, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 14:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Al-Adsiya village, searching civilians and vehicles (iii) At 15:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Yatta and Al-Samou village, searching civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 17:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Bani Naim town, searching civilians and vehicles. (v) At 19:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Ithna village, searching civilians and vehicles. (vi) At 23:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Khursa village, searching civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:30 Israeli forces raided Al-Samou and set up a flying checkpoint in the town center. (ii) At 13:20, Israeli forces raided Sair village, during which confrontations ensued between civilians and Israeli forces. (iii) At 15:15, Israeli forces raided Bani Naim and conducting training exercises using sound and tear gas grenades. (iv) At 21:15, Israeli forces raided Al-Tabaqa village, during which confrontations ensued between civilians and Israeli troop (v) At 21:30, Israeli forces raided Al-Dowara area located between Sair and Bani Naim village, fired sound and tear gas gernaeds and shut down businesses in the area. (vi) At 21:40, Israeli forces raided Sousiya village and opened fire in the area. (vii) At 22:50, Israeli forces raided Al-Aroub refugee camp and searched a home. (viii) At 00:25, Israeli forces raided Al-Thahriya. (ix) At 01:45, Israeli forces raided Hebron. • <u>Attacks:</u> At 08:30, Israeli troops positioned near Al-Aroub refugee camp fired tear

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 August 2011 at 21:00. • <u>Ceasefire Violation:</u> Israeli forces broke the ceasefire agreement by raiding and opening fire in North Gaza and Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of North Gaza and towards the beach at Rafah, injuring a Palestinian gunmen in Rafah.
