JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On September 21st 2011 the Israeli army increased its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City and prevented civilians from gathering to support the decision to obtain membership at the United Nations. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba’ village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint. <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:35, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Jaba village, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 13:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Hizma village, searching civilians and vehicles. <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 17:25, Israeli forces raided Qatna village, during which confrontations ensued between village residents. <u>Home Demolition:</u> On September 21st 2011 Israeli forces served a demolition notice to demolish a 10 m room of a house belonging to Bassim Hijazi under the pretext that it was built without proper licensing <u>Demonstrations:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i). At 11:00, civil servants and students marched in the old city of Jerusalem in support of the decision to acquire membership at the United Nations, during which Israeli forces intervened and fired rubber coated bullets and Tear gas grenades at protesters, wounding a child and several protesters suffered of suffocation as a result of tear gas inhalation, detained 3 school children for

(ii) At 10:00, Israeli forces raided Al Yamun town. (iii) At 00:25, Israeli forces raided Jenin and Barqin towns. • Settler Violence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At 11:00, a group of Israeli settlers from “Mofodotan” settlement raided the town of Araba village, physically assaulted civilians and withdrew after intervention from Israeli forces. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to severely restrict Palestinian access at ‘Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Flying Checkpoints: At 15:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint on Kafriyat road, searching civilians and vehicles until 16:30 • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At 10:05, Israeli forces raided Zieta village. • Attack: At 18:55, Israeli forces near the vicinity of the wall fired tear gas and stun grenades towards civilians in Al shweikiya neighbourhood in Tulkarem for allegedly throwing stones. • Settler Violence: At 14:40, a group of Israeli settlers from “ Anif” settlement located on Tulkarem Nablus road pointed guns at Civilians.,

(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • Flying checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Azzoun town, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 18:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Hija village, searching civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 20:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Al fundek and Hija villages, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 15:40, Israeli forces raided Al Nabi Elyas village and searched 2 homes. • Physical Assault: At 00:40, Israeli forces severely beat the civilian Mohammad Mohammad a resident of Hilba town as he was inside Israeli leaving him severely bruised and hospitalised. • Land Levelling: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:30, Israeli bulldozers levelled a plot of land located south of Imtin belonging to the civilian Muhyi Al din Ghanam. (ii) At 10:20, Israeli bulldozers levelled a plot of Agricultural land, destroyed 3 fruit trees located North of Qalqilya belonging to the civilian Bashir Haloun • Settler Violence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:35, a group of Israeli settlers from “karni shamron” settlement raided qafir lafiq village, stoned civilian vehicles passing through the main road connecting Nablus and Qalqilya and withdrew after Israeli forces intervened. (ii) At 16:05, A group of Israeli settlers from “Kadoumim” settlement stoned civilian vehicles passing through Qalqilya Nablus main road near the settlement. (iii) At 22:05, an Israeli settler opened fire from his vehicle towards a civilian vehicle belonging to Ali Issa • Demonstrations: At 10:20, Students and civil servants from Azzoun town marched in support of Palestine’s statehood bid at the United Nations, during which confrontations ensued between protesters and Israeli forces. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.

NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (iii) At 14:30, the Israeli army closed intensified its restriction on Huwwara checkpoint impeded the free flow of traffic. • Flying checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Deir Sharaf junction, searching civilians and vehicles.. At 22:45, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Bieta village, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 16:25, Israeli forces raided Osrien village, during which confrontation ensued between civilians and Israeli troops.. (ii) At 19:10, Israeli forces raided Qablan village, detained 3 civilians including 2 children and withdrew at 20:00. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Detention: Israeli forces detained 3 civilians, Said Almal 17 years old, Qusay Amla 17 years old and bilal Azar during their raid into Qablan village. • Settler Violence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:40, an Israeli settler pointed guns towards civilian vehicles along Huawara main road. (ii) At 20:20, a group of Israeli settlers raided Salim village and set fire to civilian agricultural land destroying several Olive groves. (iii) At 23:00, a group of Israeli settlers attempted to raid Asira Qablya village but were prevented by village residents and withdrew after Israeli forces intervened.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland. (ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.

(ii) Israeli forces continue to restrict access at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:20, and again at 18:55 and 24:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho city and detained a civilian. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.

Hebron	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed. (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village. (v) At 12:40, on September 13th 2011, the Israeli army closed the bypass road leading to agricultural land near road #35& 60 North of Hebron with dirt mounds. (vi) At 11:00, Israeli forces closed an entrance to Karma village with dirt mounds. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Ithna and Al dahriya village , village, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 15:00, a group of Israeli settlers raided agricultural land and set fire to and destroyed dozens of Grape vines belonging to Hamid Jabir. • <u>Demonstrations:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:30, Palestinian students in Biet Ummar marched in Solidarity with the Palestinian Statehood bid at the United Nations, during which confrontations ensued between between Israeli troops and civilians, leading to suffocation of several demonstrators as a result of tear gas inhalation. (ii) At 10:40 Several Palestinian students marched in support of Palestines statehood bid at the United Nations, during which confrontations ensued between demonstrators and Israeli troop fired tear gas grenades causing several demonstrators to suffer suffocation. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town .

<p style="text-align: center;">ALL DISTRICTS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by Israel came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire.
