ALL DISTRICTS	• Beginning at 24:00 on 21 September 2010, the Israeli army has continued to impose a complete closure on the West Bank districts on the occasion of the Jewish Holiday of Sukkot. Only allowing access to previously-coordinated diplomatic and international missions as well as humanitarian cases, the Israeli army has prevented civilians and workers from entering Jerusalem city and areas inside the Green Line. The closure will be in place until 24:00 on 30 September 2010.							
JERUSALEM	Closure:  (i) The Israeli army has continued intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to Jerusalem city and set up many flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around AI Aqsa Mosque compound, allegedly to provide protection to celebrations of the Jewish Holiday of Sukkot.  (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.  Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.  (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and force civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.  Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.  Attacks/Injury:  (i) At 19:15, the Israeli army fired rubber-coated steel bullets as well as sound and tear gas grenades on civilians in Silwan and Ath Thuri neighbourhoods and Ras al 'Amud area in Jerusalem city, allegedly for throwing stones. A civilian sustained bullet wounds.  (ii) At 23:00, the Israeli army fired rubber-coated steel bullets as well as sound and tear gas grenades on civilians in Silwan and As Sa'diya neighbourhoods in Jerusalem city, ostensibly for throwing stones.							

<u>Raid/Injury</u>: At 22:10, the Israeli army raided Al 'Isawiya village. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during

which the injured a female civilian as a result of tear gas inhalation.

• <u>Detention</u>: At 20:30, the Israeli army detained Mohammed Amin Halaseh, while it was raiding and searching his brother's house in Al Mukabbir Mount neighbourhood in Jerusalem city. Following interrogation, Israeli troops released Halaseh at a later time.

#### • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in Al 'Eizariya area to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik 'Ein Samiya.
- (ii) The Israeli authorities continue to declare the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in Ni'lin town and Bil'in village a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays. Civilian access to the area is denied to prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near 'Uyun al Haramiya junction on the Ramallah-Nablus main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 08:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to 'Atara town, searched civilians and vehicles, and impeded civilian access. Israeli troops also detained a Palestinian National Security vehicle transporting seven officers and allowed it to cross at a later time.
- (iii) At 08:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to An Nabi Salih village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 05:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Dura al Qare' village and impeded civilian access.
- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 12:00, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of the office of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in El Bireh city in solidarity with their relative prisoners. Also demanding that all prisoners be released from Israeli prisons, participants protested against repression and harassment of political prisoners.

- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 11:30, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of offices of the ICRC office in Qalqiliya city in solidarity with their relative prisoners. Also demanding that all prisoners be released from Israeli prisons, participants protested against repression and harassment of political prisoners.

#### • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

# (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.

(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.

#### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Till village and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 11:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to 'Iraq Burin village and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### **NABLUS**

- (iii) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Furik town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 17:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Shavei Shomron settlement on the Nablus-Jenin main road and impeded civilian access.
- (v) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to Deir Sharaf village on the Nablus-Tulkarem main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (vi) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Huwwara town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 23:40, the Israeli army raided Nablus city and provided protection to Israeli settlers, who visited Prophet Joseph Shrine and brought in a tomb miniature. At 05:30, Israeli troops and settlers withdrew from the area.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 13:30, a group of Israeli settlers transported seven caravans in an attempt to construct a settlement outpost on civilian land in Deir al Hatab village.

#### • <u>Demonstrations</u>:

- (i) At 11:15, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of offices of the ICRC office in Nablus city in solidarity with their relative prisoners. Also demanding that all prisoners be released from Israeli prisons, participants protested against repression and harassment of political prisoners.
- (ii) At 18:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in 'Iraq Burin village in protest against land confiscation for construction of settlement projects. The Israeli army obstructed the demonstration and declared the area a closed military zone. Confrontations took place between with the Israeli army, during which the Israeli army injured a number of participants with tear gas inhalation.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting the village of Marda to respective agricultural land.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.
- Raid: At 18:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Deir Ballut town.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: On 24 September 2010, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Revava transported 20 caravans for expansion of the settlement. Earlier, Israeli settler seized control of land belonging to.
- (i) Mansour 'Uthman Abu Nasser; and
- (ii) Ahmed ash Sheikh Abdul Hag.

Also demanding that all prisoners be released from Israeli prisons, participants protested against repression and harassment of political prisoners.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh, and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates.
- (ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya towns, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani village.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the road between Al Karmil and At Tuwani villages; all roads leading to Road # 60; and the road connecting Surif town to Al Jab'a village.

#### Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Beit Ummar town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 12:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to Halhul town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 18:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to As Samoa' town and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 20:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Idhna town and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Raids/Attack:

- (i) At 10:50, the Israeli army raided Tarqumiya town, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (ii) At 17:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Halhul town.
- (iii) At 17:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Hadab al Fawwar village.
- (iv) At 18:10, the Israeli army raided Hebron city and patrolled the area until 19:15.

- (v) At 20:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Deir Samit village.
- (vi) At 01:50, the Israeli army raided Beit 'Awwa town, opened indiscriminate fire, searched a number of houses, arrested two security, and withdrew at 03:50.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested two civilians in Beit 'Awwa town:
- (i) Ala' Yousef Sharawneh; and
- (ii) Migdad Nawwaf Masalmeh.

#### • Settler Violence:

- (i) At 18:15, a group of Israeli settlers threw stones at civilians in Khuzq al Far area in the old city of Hebron.
- (ii) At 24:00, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat Mohammed Rateb Abu Heikal in Tal Rumeida neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron, leaving him with contusions. Consequently, Abu Heikal was transported to hospital for medical treatment.

#### • <u>Demonstrations/Attacks/Injuries/Physical Assaults</u>:

- (i) At 15:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place on civilian farmland near the Karmei Tzur settlement in Beit Ummar town in protest against settler violence. Protestors demanded that civilians be enabled to access and tend their land. Having declared the area a closed military zone, Israeli troops obstructed the demonstration. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured 12-year-old Sami Ahmed Abu Joudeh. In addition to detaining a French peace activist, Israeli troops severely beat participants, wounding a civilian, Nasser ash Shuyoukhi, a journalist, and two American peace activists. A number of protestors also sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation.
- (ii) At 16:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the old city of Hebron in protest against settlement activity. Protestors demanded that the Ash Shuhada' Street be reopened and civilians allowed freedom of movement. Israeli troops obstructed the demonstration, fired tear gas grenades, and prevented participants from accessing the Old Municipality square.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.
