All DISTRICTS	At 24:00 on September 27 th 2011, Israeli forces imposed a closure on all districts in the West Bank for the duration of the Jewish New Year. During the closure civilians and workers are barred from entering occupied Jerusalem and Israel with the exception of foreign diplomats, internationals, humanitarian cases, medical emergencies and those with special permits until 24:00 on October 1 st 2011

JERUSALEM

- **Closure:**
 - (i) At 24:00 on September 27th 2011 the Israeli army increased restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City and prevented those with entry permits from entering because of the Jewish New Year.
 - (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the 'demarcation area' along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits.
 - (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Iksa villages.
- **Closure of Main Roads:**
 - (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba' village.
 - (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town.
 - (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Iksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandiya checkpoint.
- **Checkpoints:** Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city.
- **Flying Checkpoints:** At 11:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Beit Duqo village and temporarily detained Mohammad Hussien and Rayan Rayan.
- **Attacks:** At 18:00, Israeli forces fired teargas grenades at several children in Qalandia refugee camp allegedly in response to stone-throwing.
- **Detention:**
 - (i) On September 26th 2011, Israeli forces detained Mohammad Al-Qawasmeh after storming his home in Silwan neighbourhood.
 - (ii) At 23:30, Israeli forces positioned at Beit Iksa checkpoint detained Murad Abu Eid for allegedly having a knife in his possession.
- **Confiscation of Property:** On September 27 2011, Israeli forces delivered confiscation and demolition orders for 20 stores in Shufat refugee camp, for alleged security purposes and to expand the construction of the wall. The stores are owned by Al-Dajani family.
- **Wall Gates:**
 - (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town.
 - (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- **Wall Construction:** Wall construction has resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandiya village; south of Al-Za'ayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Ma'ale Adumim.

- **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjel village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages.

The forces also briefly detained Arafat Abu Aliya, a police officer, then released him after serving him a notice to report to Israeli Intellegence. (ii) At 11:25, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Ein Arik (iii) At 11:55, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Deir Ijreer village, searching civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 13:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint between Abwien and Aroura, searching civilians and vehicles. (v) At 15:50, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Ajoul village junction , searching civilians and vehicles. • Raids: At 21:00, Israeli forces raided Aroura village. • Attack: At 18:00, Israeli forces fired stun and teargas grenades at civilians for allegedly stoning them near Deir Nitham village. • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area west of ‘Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement ‘Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.

(ii) At 18:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Sir village, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raids: (i) At 14:45, Israeli forces raided Sier and Al-Jedida village. (ii) At 20:35, Israeli forces raided Al-Zawiya village. (iii) At 02:00, Israeli forces raided Al-Jedida village, searched several homes and detained a university student and withdrew at 03:50. • Detention: Israeli forces detained Mamhoud Jarar during their raid into Al-Jadida village. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
<p style="text-align: center;">TUBAS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00. • Raid: At 11:30, Israeli forces raided Ein Al-Hilwa village and confiscated a tractor and a water tank belonging to the civilian Mahmoud Kabana.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. (iii) Since 20:00 on September 4th 2011, the Israeli army closed the entrance to Izbat Shoufat village with dirt mounds and cement blocks. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to increase restrictions on Palestinian access at ‘Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus main road and impeded the

(ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • <u>Flying checkpoints:</u> At 14:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the junction of Jit village, searching civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raid:</u> At 00:30, Israeli forces raided kufor Qaddum village. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 18:00, a group of settlers near the Qalqilya-Nablus road, posted anti-Arab slogans stating “The Land of Israeli is here Salah”. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras ‘Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Imanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Ma’ale Shomron settlement.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma’in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.</p> <p>(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years.</p> • <u>Checkpoints:</u> At 09:20 Israeli army closed Zatarra checkpoint, obstructing the free flow of traffic and reopened it at a later time. • <u>Raids:</u> At 11:30, Israeli forces raided Yassouf village. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 12:00, a group of Israeli settlers posted Anti-Arab slogans stating “The Land of Israel is here Salah” at a junction near “Rafafa” settlement in Deir Istya. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction has resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.

BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Nu'man village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al-Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Taqou town to Khirbet al Baq'a village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jab'a villages. • <u>Flying Checkpoint:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Taqou, searching civilians and vehicles, (ii) At 09:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Janata village, searching civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 10:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Al-Freidis village junction, searching civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 10:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near “Bitar Ilit” settlement temporarily detained 3 civilians, and summoned to Rashad Sbatien, a resident of Husan, to report to Israeli Intelligence agency. (v) At 12:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Husan village, searching civilians and vehicles. (vi) At 21:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Nashaah junction, searching civilians and vehicles until 21:45. • <u>Raids:</u> At 22:40 Israeli forces raided Al-Khader town until 02:40 . • <u>Settler Violence:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On September 26th 2011, a group of Israeli settlers pumped sewage waste on agricultural land in Wadi Foukin village.. (ii) At 18:30, a group of Israeli settlers stoned civilian vehicles passing along the main road near Taqou village. (iii) On the evening of September 27th 2011, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat Salem Hussien (65 years-), a resident of Jora Al-Shama as he was harvesting his grapes on land near the settlement. • <u>Settlement Activity:</u> On September 27th 2011, the Israel government approved the construction of 1100 illegal housing units in the illegal “Gilo” settlement. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction resumed northwest of Beit Jala town.

Hebron

- **Closure:**
 - (i) The Israeli army continues to close Al-Shuhada' Street, Al-Sahleh and Khuzq Al-Far areas, as well as the old gold market in Hebron's Old City. In addition to closing the entrance to Al-Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an electronic gate; Al-Laban Market also remains closed.
 - (ii) Since 05 January 2009, the Israeli army has closed the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. Having seized land for Wall construction, the Israeli army evicted the Palestinian residents and denied them access to the area.
- **Closure of Main Roads:**
 - (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Al-Dhahiriya and Al-Samoa' towns, Al-'Arrub refugee camp, and Al-Tuwani and Al-Karmil villages.
 - (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along the old Al-Shalala Street leading to Hebron's Old City.
 - (iii) The Israeli army continues to close all roads leading to Road # 60 as well as detour roads along the settler bypass road leading to Yatta town.
 - (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds a detour road leading to the entrance to Al-Simiya village.
 - (v) At 12:40, on September 13th 2011, the Israeli army closed the bypass road leading to agricultural land near road #35& 60 North of Hebron with dirt mounds.
 - (vi) At 11:00, Israeli forces closed an entrance to Karma village with dirt mounds.
- **Flying Checkpoints:**
 - (i) At 08:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the Wadi Al-Jora near Bani Naim village and impeded the free flow of traffic.
 - (ii) At 00:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Bani Naim village, searching civilians and vehicles.
- **Raids:**
 - (i) At 08:30 and again at 01:25, Israeli forces raided Bani Naim village, set up a flying checkpoint near a police station and tied a civilian to an electrical pole while detaining him.
 - (ii) At 09:30, Israeli forces raided Hebron, searched a home and set up a flying checkpoint near a police station..
 - (iii) At 12:00, Israeli forces raided Beit Amra village, stormed Issa Idies's home and removed a Palestinian flag from his rooftop..
 - (iv) At 15:00, Israeli forces raided Dura town.
 - (v) At 20:20, Israeli forces raided Biet Ulavillage.
 - (vi) At 21:20, Israeli forces raided Al-Aroub refugee camp under the pretext that Molotov bomb was thrown at an Israeli military jeep from inside of the camp.
- **Attack:** At 17:00, Israeli forces fired stun and teargas grenades at several children.
- **Settler Violence:** At 23:40, a group of Israeli settlers from H2 area, under Israeli Administration, raided the Old City in H1 area, which is under Palestinian Administration, and stormed a home then withdrew under the protection of Israeli forces.
- **Wall Construction:** Wall construction resumed in the area surrounding the illegal settlement Eshkolot, west of Al-Thahiriya town .

Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. • <u>Palestinian Attack:</u> On the evening of September 27th 2011, Palestinian gunmen launched projectiles towards the Green Line.
