DISTRICT EVENTS

#### **WEST BANK**

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.

#### Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.
- Attack on Property: On 11 May 2010, the Israeli army distributed notices for the evacuation of pieces of land # 160, 161, 162, and 169 in the centre of the city of Jerusalem. Measuring 3 *dunums* (0.741 acre) in total, the pieces of land belong to the *Waqf* trust of Sheikh Shams ad Din al Yamalli. The affected land is administered by the *Waqf* custodians Ziyad Qawwas; and Ra'fat Bakir.

# • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

#### **JERUSALEM**

• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik 'Ein Samiya.
- (ii) On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit.

### • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Um Safa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 16:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Liqya and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 03:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Turmus'ayya and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### Raids:

- (i) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided the villages of Dura al Qar' and Jifna and searched 1 house.
- (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Mughayyir, and served summons to 9 civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (iii) At dawn on 14 May 2010, the Israeli army raided the town of Sinjil and arrested 3 civilians, including 2 university students.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the town of Sinjil:
- (i) Rizq Mohammed Rizq Masalmeh;
- (ii) 'Azem Munther Anwar Masalmeh; and
- (iii) 'Uday Mousa 'Asfour.
- Attack on Property: At 22:15, the Israeli army delivered a notice for the evacuation of a room and caravan annexed to a transmitter belonging to the Al Wataniya Telecommunications Company in the village of Al Mughayyir, claiming that they were located in Area C which is under Israeli control.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 19:00, a group of armed Israeli settlers travelling near the closed junction to the town of Al Mazra'a ash Sharqiya along the Ramallah-Nablus main road opened fire towards 4 civilians, killing a child. Israeli settlers claimed that civilians had thrown stones at their vehicle.
- <u>Killing</u>: Israeli settlers killed Aysar Yasser Fawwaz az Ziben, 16 years old, near the junction to the town of Al Mazra'a ash Sharqiya.

SALFIT	searched 2 houses, served a summons to a civilian to report to the Israeli
	Intelligence agency, and withdrew at 00:10.
	(iii) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Mas'ha and served a summons to a civilian to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
	(iv) At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Biddya, searched a number of houses, and served a summons to a civilian to report to the
	Israeli Intelligence agency.
	(v) At 00:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Iskaka and served a
	summons to a civilian to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
	• Arrest: At 24:00, the Israeli army arrested Fadi Burhan 'Awwad near the
	settlement of Revava.
	• Settler Violence: At 15:00, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to agricultural
	land in the area between the towns of Kafr ad Dik and Deir Ballut.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the
	city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north
	of the settlement of Ariel.
	• Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of
	Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent
	farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land,
	forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to
	deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.
	• Checkpoints:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra
JERICHO	checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of
	Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access
	between 06:00 and 22:00.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint
	set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat
	road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing
	access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of
	the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.

## Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of (i) An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has (ii) continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Bag'a. **BETHLEHEM** Flying Checkpoint: At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Al Khadr and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: (i) At dawn on 13 May 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of Battir and arrested 1 civilian. (ii) At 12:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 13:25, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Khadr and searched 1 (iii) house. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Mustafa Mohammed 'Uweinah in the village of Battir. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja. **Closure:** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the **HEBRON** entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area. Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the (ii) Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron;

- the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades an entrance to the town of Beit Ummar near the town's cemetery.

#### • Flying Checkpoints/Detention:

- (i) At 08:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance to the city of Hebron along Road # 35 and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of An Nabi Yunis near the town of Halhul along the Hebron-Bethlehem main road and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iv) At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (vi) At 23:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Fuqeiqis, detained and handcuffed 4 civilians, and released them after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).

# • Raids:

- (i) At 02:40 on 13 May 2010, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron and served summons to a number of civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the city again, set up 4 checkpoints, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (ii) At 10:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhul.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.

<u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u> : The Israeli navy opened fire towards Palestinian
fishing boats at sea off the beaches of the districts of Central Gaza, Khan
Yunis, and Rafah.
